

As part of a three-year AHRC-funded India-UK research project, we have grown our **Emerging Curators Lab** in partnership with Queen Mary University of London, JNU's School of Arts & Aesthetics, and Habitat International Film Festival. This international initiative nurtures new curatorial voices across borders, with participants selecting the **Emerging Curators' Choice** - a film awarded and screened at this year's festival.

This year also marks an important milestone: **Tongues on Fire has become a registered charity**. This new chapter strengthens our commitment to platforming unheard voices and nurturing artists across the diaspora.

We invite you to join us—whether you're attending a glittering gala, a thought-provoking panel, or a community celebration like the **Mystic Mela**. These are your stories, your screens, your stage.

So come share in the laughter, the tears, the poetry—and above all, the power of seeing yourself reflected on screen.





GOLDEN FLAME AWARD: CONTRIBUTION TO HINDI FILM AND TELEVISION



YAVAR ABBAS

RIVERSIDE STUDIOS Sunday 11 May 2:45pm

Yavar Abbas is a distinguished writer, broadcaster, journalist, and filmmaker whose work bridges cultures, languages, and generations. Born in Lucknow, the heartland of Urdu culture, and raised in a devout Shia family, Abbas was immersed from an early age in the poetic tradition of Meer Anees, whose epic Marsiyas inspired a lifelong passion for Urdu literature. His distinctive style of taht-ul-lafz recitation has been enriched by a career in broadcasting and filmmaking that spans continents and decades.

Educated at Allahabad University in English and Persian literature, Abbas seamlessly navigated roles as a producer, translator, and director at the BBC Urdu Service. He translated and adapted the works of Shakespeare, Wilde, Shaw, Chekhov, and many others into Urdu, producing seminal series such as Othello, Macbeth, Masterpieces of English Prose, and Historic English Speeches. His BBC series European Poets of Urdu remains a landmark contribution to cross-cultural appreciation.

As a filmmaker, his documentaries—including India! My India!, Faces of India, and Mother Ganges—offer deeply personal yet globally resonant insights into post-Partition India. His films, shown widely and celebrated at retrospectives including at the Cinémathèque Française, capture both the grandeur and grassroots of Indian life. A consultant to the UN and a cultural bridgebuilder, Abbas's work is grounded in pluralism, empathy, and unwavering commitment to truth. Urdu, and particularly Anees, remains his first and deepest love.

GOLDEN FLAME AWARD: LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT



BIDDU

RIVERSIDE STUDIOS Sunday 11 May 2:45pm

Biddu was born in Bangalore, where he began his career in a pop group inspired by The Beatles and The Rolling Stones. Following early success in India, he travelled west with a guitar, a plastic bag of clothes, and no money. In the UK, he worked in a hamburger joint by day and wrote songs by night.

His big break came producing the unknown Carl Douglas and the 9-million-selling global No.1 hit "Kung Fu Fighting". He followed this with hits as the Biddu Orchestra, including "Summer of '42" and the Ivor Novello-winning "Rain Forest". He also wrote or produced classics for Tina Charles and Jimmy James: "I Love to Love", "Dance Little Lady Dance", "I'll Go Where the Music Takes Me" and "Now Is the Time"

He composed for the platinum-selling Joan Collins films The Stud and The Bitch. In Bollywood, "Aap Jaisa Koi" sung by Nazia Hassan was a game-changer, followed by Disco Deewane, India's best-selling pop album.

In 1995, he wrote and produced Made in India for Alisha, selling 13 million copies. His career total surpasses 45 million records. He also produced hit tracks for Indian Idol winner Abhileet Sawant.

Biddu's autobiography Made in India was published in 2009. He recently received a Lifetime Achievement Award from Rolling Stone and was named among the top 30 producers of all time.

SANDHYA SURI

Sandhya Suri is a British-Indian filmmaker, often blending intimate narratives with broader societal themes. Her documentary I for India (2005), praised at the Sundance Film Festival, is an unparalleled depiction of the migrant experience constructed from Super 8 film letters sent between India and England over 40 years. In 2018, her acclaimed short film The Field, nominated for a BAFTA, showcased her talent for capturing deeply personal yet universal stories in a deeply sensuous way. Her debut fiction feature, Santosh (2024), which screened in Official Selection at Cannes Film Festival is a gritty neo-noir which tackles patriarchy and inequality in rural India. The film was Bafta nominated and shortlisted for the Oscars Best international feature.





IMTIAZ ALI

Imtiaz Ali is a celebrated Indian film director, writer, and producer known for his lyrical and introspective storytelling. Born in Jamshedpur, he studied English Literature at Hindu College, University of Delhi, where he founded the dramatics society Ibtida. He began his career in television before making his film debut with Socha Na Tha (2005).

He gained acclaim with Jab We Met (2007), Love Aaj Kal (2009), Rockstar (2011), and Tamasha (2015), each exploring themes of love and self-discovery. On streaming platforms, he created SHE (Netflix) and Dr Arora (SonyLiv).

Imtiaz has also written screenplays for Ahista Ahista (2006) and Cocktail (2012), and supported new voices through projects like Laila Majnu (2018). His latest film, Amar Singh Chamkila (2024), continues his tradition of charting emotional journeys with poetic realism.

ONIR

Onir, born Anirban Dhar in Samchi, Bhutan, is a celebrated Indian filmmaker, screenwriter, editor, and producer. He studied comparative literature at Jadavpur University and trained in film editing in Berlin before returning to India to work across various media.

He gained acclaim with My Brother...Nikhil (2005), a pioneering Hindi film on AIDS and same-sex relationships, and I AM (2011), an anthology exploring LGBTQI rights and social taboos, which won the National Film Award. His films have earned numerous accolades, including the Film Victoria Diversity Award (2019) and the Likho Award for his memoir I Am Onir and I Am Gay.

Recent works include Pine Cone (2023), honoured at BFI Flare, and We Are Faheem and Karun (2025), the first Kashmiri-language queer feature, premiering at DIFF and BFI Flare. Onir is also part of the Indo-Australian anthology My Melbourne.



In the remote border village of Gurez, a young security officer from South India, Karun, meets Faheem, a local Kashmiri man with a disarming smile. What begins as a chance encounter at a checkpoint unfolds into a tender and unexpected romance—one shadowed by secrecy and societal pressure. This is the first Kashmiri-language feature to centre an LGBTQI+ relationship and offers a rare and deeply human perspective on lives often overlooked in stories from conflict zones.

Directed by Onir Cast: Mir Tawseef, Akash Menon, Mir Salman India 2024, 79 mins, Kashmiri, Hindi, English, Malayalam with English subtitles Inspired by a true story, this landmark film was denied filming permission by India's Ministry of Defence, who deemed the story "derogatory to the army," the film triumphed through resilience and premiered three years later at the BFI Flare Film Festival.







EMERGING CURATORS LAB

As part of the three-year AHRC-funded India-UK research project Connecting Creative Industries and Cultural Heritage: India-UK Film Festival Federation, Youth Curation and Community Co-Creation, the Emerging Curators Lab (ECL 2025) online weekend workshop took place on 8th and 9th March 2025.

ECL 2025 was led by the UK Asian Film Festival (UKAFF), Queen Mary University of London, India film festival partner Habitat International Film Festival (HIFF, New Delhi) and academic partner School of Arts & Aesthetics, JNU (New Delhi). ECL 2025 was designed to nurture a new generation of India-UK film curators and showcase a diverse spectrum of South Asian cinema. **Emerging curators had the opportunity** to gain information about film curation, develop their curatorial skills and watch a selection of new feature films submitted to the UK Asian Film Festival from which they selected a film that will be screened as the **Emerging Curators' Choice and will receive a** special film award at UKAFF 2025.






