introduction

in Him, you were made to bear—as fruit—the life of God in every space you occupy. this resource will help you awaken to what is already alive inside of you.

the truth of **your union**

galatians 5 assures us—the fruit belongs to the Spirit. this reframes everything: fruitfulness is not the result of personal effort, but evidence of shared life. it's not something you work towards, but something that flows from His divine life within you.

union with God did not begin with you—it began with Jesus. before anything was created, He existed, and through His finished work, you've been brought into His oneness with the Father and the Spirit. what was once distant has been fully reconciled—there's nothing separating you now. your life is not outside, trying to get in; you are already one with Him. (john 1:1-3; colossians 1:16-17,21; 1 corinthians 6:17)



reframing your **inner life**

many have learned to approach love as an invisible measuring stick that evaluates how well we're doing. even when our intentions are genuine, this creates subtle pressure to perform.

but love was never intended to be produced by you—you are not the source, you're the dwelling place. as you live aware of your union through Christ, love is no longer something you strive to express, but something you recognize as vibrantly alive within you, ready to be revealed.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing love**

love begins to show up in ordinary moments: a kind word, a gentle response, patience towards someone who frustrates you. it's not effort, restraint, or performance, but the life of God expressing itself through you, gently transforming your surroundings and relationships.

activation

1 - **awareness:** pause and sense the Spirit's presence within you.

2 - **engagement:** ask the Lord to show you one specific way His love can be expressed today. choose a small, intentional act where you allow love to move through you naturally.

3 - **agreement:** declare to yourself, "i am a dwelling place of divine love; it flows through me in every interaction."

the truth of **your union**

the life you long to live does not originate from your effort, but from your union with the Father, Son, and Spirit—they have drawn you into their shared life, not as a future promise, but as a present reality.

you have been made complete in Christ—filled with His fullness. there is no lack, so there's no need for striving. your life is not about becoming something for Him, but awakening to the life that you already share with Him.
(colossians 2:9-10; john 14:20; galatians 2:20)



reframing your **inner life**

many of us have learned to relate to joy as something that rises and falls with our circumstances, leaving us trying to stir it up or hold on tightly when it feels like it's fading. even when we know better, this creates a quiet dependency on what's happening around us.

but true joy isn't sustained by circumstance—it's simply a fruit of God's abiding presence. as you live from the revelation of union, your heart becomes a seedbed for deep gladness that the world cannot give or take away.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing joy**

joy begins to rise within you as a steady undercurrent—not dependent on what's happening around you, but anchored in the life of God within you. it shows up even in the midst of challenge, pressure, or grief—not by pretending everything is fine, but in knowing you are held together by God's love.

because it isn't superficial, it cannot be quenched—it allows you to feel what you're walking through while knowing you are never outside the reach of His love.

activation

1 - **awareness:** sit quietly and become aware of the Spirit's presence within you.

2 - **engagement:** ask Him to show you one area where you've been relying on circumstances for joy. then turn your focus to psalm 16:11, and respond to that situation—allowing His gladness to shape your perspective and actions.

3 - **agreement:** declare to yourself, "i carry the joy of the Lord within me; it remains, regardless of what surrounds me."

the truth of **your union**

the illusion of separation from God is one of the most subtle—and influential—battles in the christian life. too often, we live as though distance is real, but through Christ, separation has been removed entirely. you've been reconnected to the Father, restored, and brought into His abiding presence. your life is now hidden with Christ in God. union is not something you move toward—it's the reality you're now empowered to live from. His life within you assures that you never have to navigate life alone. (colossians 1:21-22, 3:3; ephesians 2:13)



reframing your **inner life**

when things feel uncertain, thoughts can race and tensions often rise as we try to hold everything together. but peace is not found in our ability to control or manage outcomes—it flows from trust in the One who holds you. as you live from this place of union, you no longer have to strive for stability; His steadiness within you becomes your place of rest.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing peace**

His life brings forth a calm steadiness that cannot be shaken by circumstances. His peace—which freely resides within—empowers your heart and interactions: patience in stressful moments, quiet confidence when situations are uncertain, and a sense of inner rest even when your day-to-day is chaotic. it's not something you have to generate; it's the life of God expressing itself through you, transforming your inner world and touching those around you.

activation

1 - **awareness:** *pause and sense the Spirit's calming presence within you.*

2 - **engagement:** *ask the Lord to show you a specific way His peace can be experienced today. choose to embrace it, and release it in your day.*

3 - **agreement:** *declare to yourself, "i carry the peace of Jesus; His steadiness flows through me in every circumstance and situation."*

the truth of **your union**

union with God is not a metaphor, a poetic image, or a distant hope reserved for heaven—it's your present reality, fully secured through Jesus.

everything He accomplished has brought you into a shared, unbreakable life with Himself, the Father, and the Spirit. you are not working for union; you are awakening to it. and from that awakening, the freedom to live from His life begins to unfold. (romans 6:4; colossians 1:21-22; john 14:20)



reframing your **inner life**

when things don't happen as quickly as expected, there can be a tendency to push, hurry, or "help move" outcomes. but that pressure reveals a subtle belief that it's up to us to make things happen or keep things on track.

but in God's economy, patience isn't something you produce by your own effort—it flows from the life of Christ in you, where nothing is rushed or forced. as you learn to live from the place of union, you're no longer driven by urgency. instead, the rhythm of His timing begins to shape your own.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing patience**

patience begins to appear—not as restraint you manufacture, but as a steady calm that impacts your interactions and decisions. in moments that would normally trigger frustration or control, you find yourself responding intentionally rather than reacting impulsively. this is the life of God flowing through you, turning ordinary moments into living proof of His fruit within you.

activation

1 - **awareness:** sit quietly and allow yourself to become aware of the Spirit's presence within you.

2 - **engagement:** ask Him to highlight a moment today where you feel rushed or tempted to push for results. choose to take the small step to pause and respond calmly instead of urgently.

3 - **agreement:** declare to yourself, "i have a constant supply of patience; it isn't rooted in my effort, but in the life of God within me."

the truth of **your union**

the gospel isn't the news that we can receive Christ into our lives—it's the revelation that we've been received into His. this was God's intention from the beginning, established before the foundation of the world.

all things were created through Him and are only sustained in Him. therefore, Jesus came not to establish relationship, but to restore our awareness of the union that's always existed—even when we were unaware of it. though we turned from Him in thought and perception, God never turned from us. He has brought you into the light of what's always been true. (2 timothy 1:9; colossians 1:15-17, 21; john 1:10-12)



reframing your **inner life**

it's easy to become selective with kindness—especially in moments where it feels costly, inconvenient, or undeserved. over time, this can create a tendency to pull back internally, becoming more guarded and restrained in how you respond to others.

but kindness isn't something you measure based on how you feel—it unfolds from the life of God within, steady and unchanging, even when your environment is not.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing kindness**

kindness begins to appear—not as politeness you work to produce, but as a grace that naturally shapes your words, actions, and presence. in moments where irritation or self-protection would have previously risen, you'll notice an openness that invites others in. this is the Spirit of God turning everyday interactions into tangible evidence of your oneness with Him.

activation

1 - **awareness:** pause and sense the Spirit's presence within you.

2 - **engagement:** ask the Lord to highlight a moment today where you can extend kindness, even if it feels inconvenient or undeserved. choose to respond from the life of God within you,

3 - **agreement:** declare to yourself, "i carry kindness—it flows effortlessly through me."

the truth of **your union**

the indivisible life of the Father, the Son, and the Spirit is already at work within you—present, active, and inseparable from who you are. this is not a distant connection you are trying to maintain, but a shared life you've been brought into through Christ.

you are not hosting God as a visitor or relating to Him from the outside in. His life has become the very source from which you now live. what flows from you is not something you initiate, but the natural expression of the One who abides within you. (acts 17:28; john 14:20; colossians 3:3-4; 1 john 4:13)



reframing your **inner life**

it's easy to think of goodness as something we're called to prove—measured by right responses, consistent behavior, or how we present ourselves to others. but this often leads to subtle striving, where we feel responsible to maintain a certain standard that was never meant to come from us.

but goodness isn't sustained by effort—there is none good but God. therefore, it flows as evidence of His life within you. as you remain aware of who you are one with, the need to manage your responses begins to give way to a quieter trust in what is already present.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing goodness**

faithful to His promises, as the life of God flows within you, goodness begins to appear—not as effort to “do right,” but as a genuine expression of who you are in Him. in everyday moments, your responses carry a sincerity that isn't manufactured or forced, but flows freely from the life within.

“all that the Son has with His Father in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit—the shared life, the fullness and joy, the righteousness and blessedness, the holiness and goodness, everything He is, Jesus has brought to us, in order that we may share in His own communion with His Father in the Spirit.” — Baxter Kruger

activation

1 - **awareness:** sit quietly and allow yourself to become aware of the Spirit's presence within you.

2 - **engagement:** ask Him to show you a place in your life where you're feeling the need to prove, perform, or "get it right." notice the impulse, and ask Him to help you embrace His goodness in that space.

3 - **agreement:** declare to yourself, "the goodness of God is alive in me; it's expressed naturally, not by my effort, but by His life in me."

the truth of **your union**

through the incarnation, Jesus stepped into humanity with all His union, wholeness, and relational enjoyment with the Father and Spirit. He entered the fallen and distorted thinking of mankind, so that adam's alienation could be caught up into—and transformed by—the eternal, intimate relationship within the Trinity.

the truth of your union with God is a testimony to His faithfulness. His life lives in you now, not as an example to follow, but as a reality to share.
(john 1:1,14; romans 5:12,14; john 17:21-23)



reframing your **inner life**

faithfulness flows from the nature of God and is made tangible in your life because of union, not willpower or best intentions. the Spirit within you forms a willingness to yield yourself to the Father and the Son.

see it, therefore, not simply as personal promise-keeping, but the evidence of His essence flowing through you.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing faithfulness**

faithfulness begins to show up as a rhythm of consistency in your life—a steady presence in your relationships and responsibilities that isn't forced or fragile. it looks like becoming someone others can rest in, not because you're trying harder, but because God's own reliability is expressing itself through you.

activation

1 - **awareness:** pause and sense the Spirit's presence within you.

2 - **engagement:** ask the Lord to reveal any pressure to "be more consistent," prove yourself, or follow through out of fear of failing. notice where faithfulness has shifted into performance, and allow the truth of His nature within you to settle deeper than that pressure.

3 - **agreement:** declare to yourself, "i live from the faithfulness of God in me, not from pressure or performance."

the truth of **your union**

from the beginning, God's desire has been shared life—walking with those made in His image, dwelling as one, and expressing Himself through His people. that original intention has been restored through Christ. you are now His dwelling place, the space where His life is planted and revealed.

union assures that God is not distant from your life— He is the very source and substance of it, continually bringing forth what reflects Him. (2 corinthians 6:16b; songs 5:1; philippians 2:13)



reframing your **inner life**

gentleness is often mistaken as something that must be reinforced with firmness, creating an inward pressure to become harder in order to be effective. but gentleness isn't a weakness that needs correcting—it's the strength of Christ expressed through you, flowing from your union with God without striving or force. as you rest in Him, gentleness becomes your natural posture—marked by humility, patience, and compassion toward yourself and others.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing gentleness**

this is the life of Christ expressed through you in real time—soft in tone, but strong in essence. it brings tenderness into your interactions and a tangible sense of peace to the atmosphere around you.

as you awaken to the reality that His life within you, your demeanor naturally reflects the gentle character of the One who inhabits your heart.

activation

3 - **agreement:** declare to yourself, "i carry the gentleness of Christ; His strength in me is soft, steady, and life-giving in every situation."

the truth of **your union**

fruit doesn't strive to exist, it simply grows because it's connected to a living source. in the same way, you are connected to the Living Vine—joined to Christ, and His Spirit is actively producing the fruit of His own nature within you. this is not future-based or conditional; it's present and dynamic.

every beautiful expression of love is a byproduct of your union. as you awaken to this reality, you're no longer working to manufacture fruit—you recognize that you're simply hosting the Spirit, and His life within you blossoms in every space you occupy. (john 15:5a,16a; 1 corinthians 6:17; galatians 2:20)



reframing your **inner life**

self-control is not a moral performance or a quiet battle to behave better—it is the lived expression of grace already at work in you, empowering you to walk in freedom from within. many have been taught to measure self-control by effort and restraint, quietly evaluating how well they are managing themselves before God. but the gospel reveals another way: not striving to produce control, but resting in the reality that the life of Christ within you is already forming what you could never manufacture on your own. the Spirit of life leads you into freedom and alignment with Him.

the harvest that emerges: **experiencing self-control**

self-control begins to emerge within you, not as tension or self-monitoring, but as a steady inner clarity shaped by the life of God in you. it becomes visible in real moments of decision, desire, and impulse—not through forcing yourself to behave differently, but through a quiet strength that reorders your inner life. because you're rooted in Christ, you find yourself able to respond rather than react, to pause rather than rush, and to live from freedom rather than pressure.

activation

1 - **awareness:** pause and sense the Spirit's presence within you.

2 - **engagement:** ask the Lord to highlight a moment today where you feel a strong urge to react or take control. pause, and allow His presence to guide your response instead.

3 - **agreement:** declare to yourself, "my life is hidden with Christ in God; His life is at work in me—guiding my desires, choices, and actions."
