Houston Business Action to End HIV is a local chapter of the national U.S. Business Action to End HIV coalition, established in areas with high HIV incidence and a strong business presence. These chapters work to bridge the gap between businesses and public health communities, addressing local HIV challenges through coordinated efforts.

The Community Partner Directory is a resource for businesses to connect with community organizations working on the front lines of HIV in Houston. It includes health departments, HIV service organizations, faith-based groups, and other community-based organizations. Each listing details how these organizations are willing to partner with businesses to make a meaningful impact and strengthen the local HIV response.

Community partner collaboration opportunities with local businesses include:



Workshops and Training: Conduct workshops for employees or employee resource groups on HIV prevention and care (available on-site or virtually).



Educational Campaigns: Partner on campaigns for employees or customers, creating content for print, radio, and social media to raise awareness about HIV testing, prevention, and treatment resources.



HIV Testing: Provide on-site HIV testing, counseling, and linkage to care, or invite employees to access testing services with incentives.



Thought Leadership: Offer guidance and community insights to businesses developing strategies to address gaps in HIV service delivery.



Volunteer Opportunities: Host local employees as volunteers at specific events throughout the year.



Financial Support: Benefit from donations, charity events, walkathons, or other fundraising efforts.



Advocacy: Collaborate to advance state and local HIV policy initiatives.
