Daimler Truck Responsive Portal Proof of Concept

Daimler Truck North America has a telematics portal, Detroit Connect. It is an old design and has not evolved with web technology. I was tasked with creating a proof of concept of a responsive portal in order to pitch the idea to leadership. The turn around time was very tight — a week for initial design and 3 additional days for revisions. I designed this with no requirements so I had a "pie in the sky" approach, adding in ideas like full user customization for the main screen. The prototype is fully functional. I presented to members of local leadership and trained them in using Figma's presentation tools for presentation to global leadership. Leadership is currently aligning related departments for planning and implementation.


Freightliner SmartSource App Redesign


Gale Healthcare Document Upload Campaign





OCCF 50th Anniversary Campaign

Throughout 2019, the Oklahoma City Community Foundation publications all featured a unified theme and a special 50th anniversary tagline of "Your Connection for Good." Each publication cover used a secondary brand color for its cover; the charitable organization publication used orange while the scholarship publication used green. The final publication of the year was the annual report using the brand's primary blue color. The connection points were all printed in silver foil to stand out against the colored field and provide a unifying visual element. The Annual Report had a 5-page foldout featuring events and an organizational timeline. Sections begin with a spread on a donor with infographic elements. This campaign earned our team the 2019 Nonprofit Communications Team of the Year by Uppercase.

"The success stories of mental health court graduates are just remarkable," Judge Coats-Ashley said. "With proper treatment, they are able to return to work and go on to live healthy, productive lives, while also reducing the burden on our criminal justice system."

The Community Foundation helped Judge Coats-Ashley further her community legacy through the creation of an advised fund that will permanently support causes important to her, like Legal Aid Services of Oklahoma. In addition, she used the remainder of her campaign funds to create a scholarship for graduate students studying mental health services.






Scholarship Yearbook

The Oklahoma City Community Foundation publishes a yearly magazine announcing its scholarship award recipients. In 2019, the theme was superheroes. The usual formal typographical treatment was traded out for bombastic, loud, comic book style fonts for all headlines. The body copy used the brand standard typeface. The brand's usual flat background colors were replaced with a half-tone treatment, reminiscent of the dot patterns of early comic book printing which was popularized during the pop art movement. All of the colors used are part of the brand, but they were all used at full saturation to give the book a more vibrant, youthful feel. The publication features a list of recipients as well as information on donors.


