## Sentient Singularity Theory:

## Abstract:

Sentient Singularity Theory is a proposal for a fundamental metaphysics framework. Sentient Singularity Theory describes the totality of fundamental existence as an initial and all-encompassing singularity of sentience that is creating additional sentient singularities within Itself.

Sentience is a nature or state characterized by experience of feeling sensations, emotions, and a sense of self.
