Methodology

From December 30 to January 6, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 2051 likely voters in Minnesota using SMS and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ± 2 percentage points.

Using a multilevel regression and poststratification approach (MRP), we were able to estimate levels of support for small geographies like Congressional District, and state House and Senate Districts.

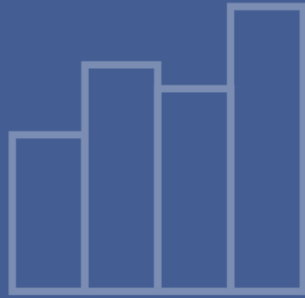
This modeling survey was conducted in collaboration with the Minnesota Budget Project.

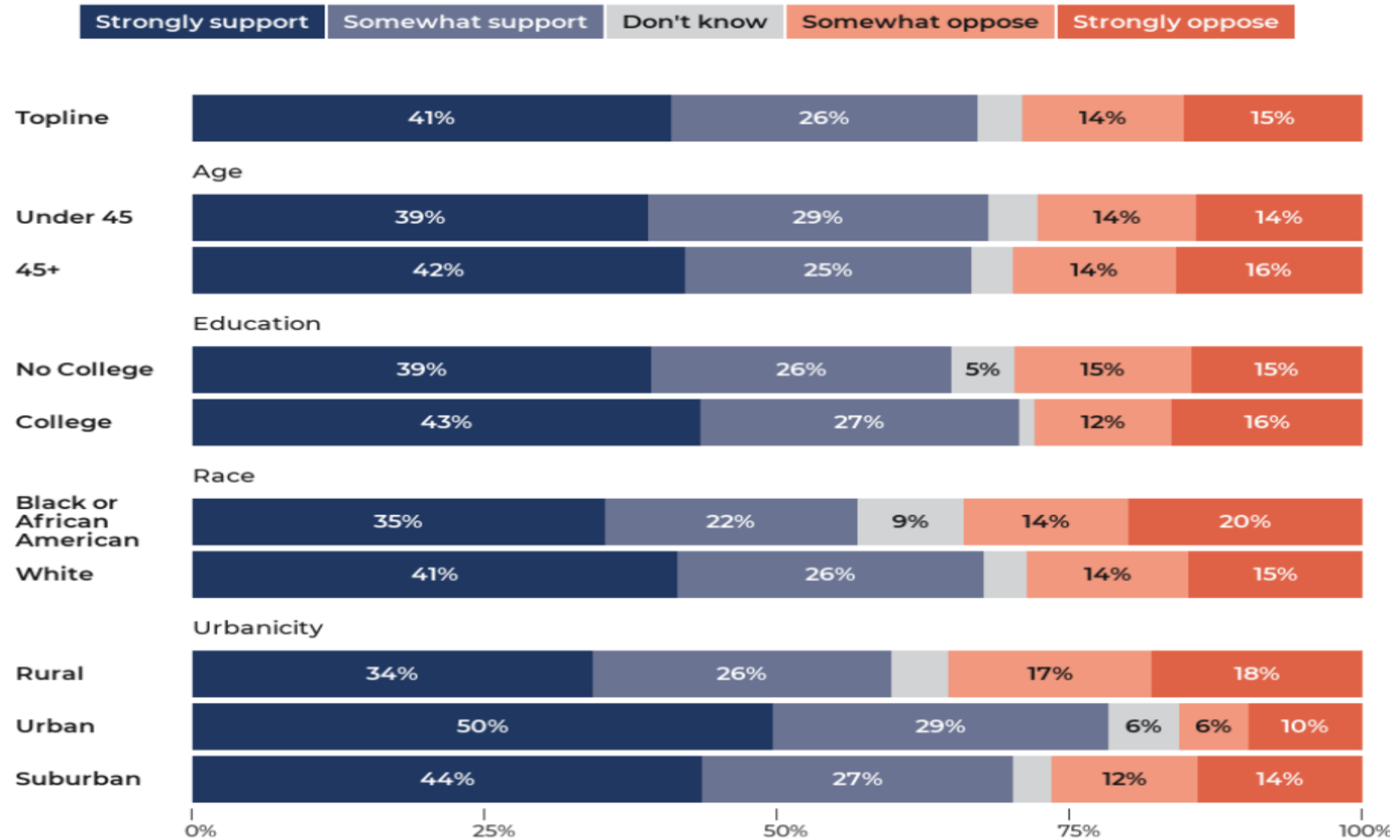
Survey Questions

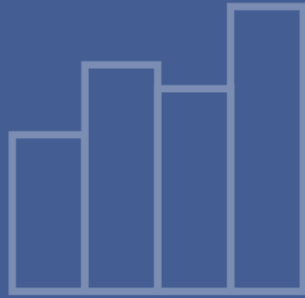
- 1) Would you support or oppose raising taxes on profitable corporations?

Raising Taxes on Profitable Corporations

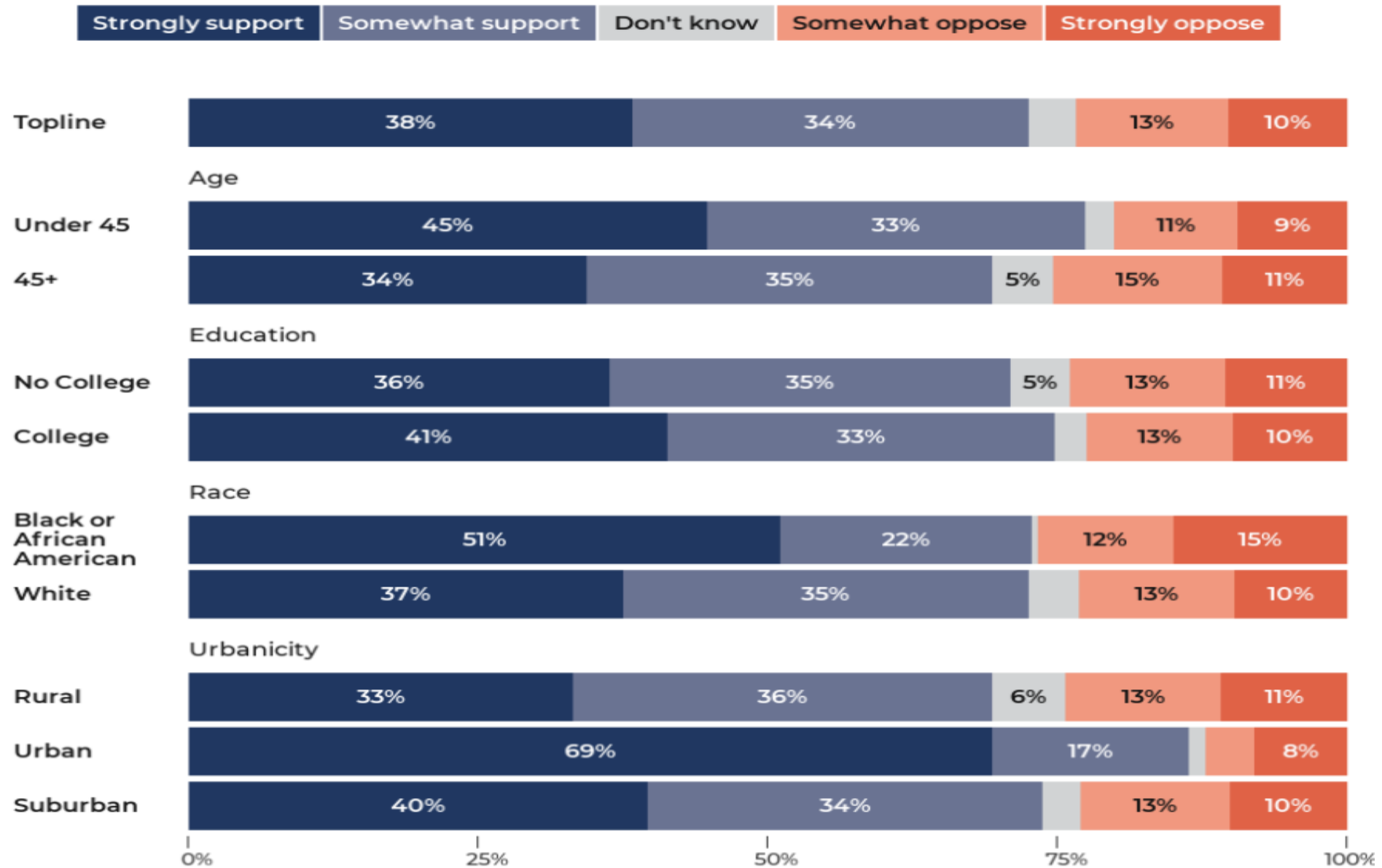
Would you support or oppose raising taxes on profitable corporations?

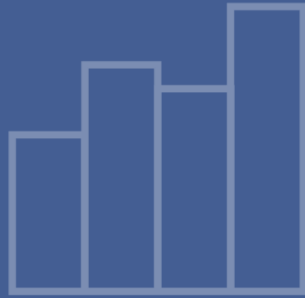




Additional State Investments in Child Care

Would you support or oppose state investments to make child care more affordable, such as increasing funding for child care assistance subsidies?

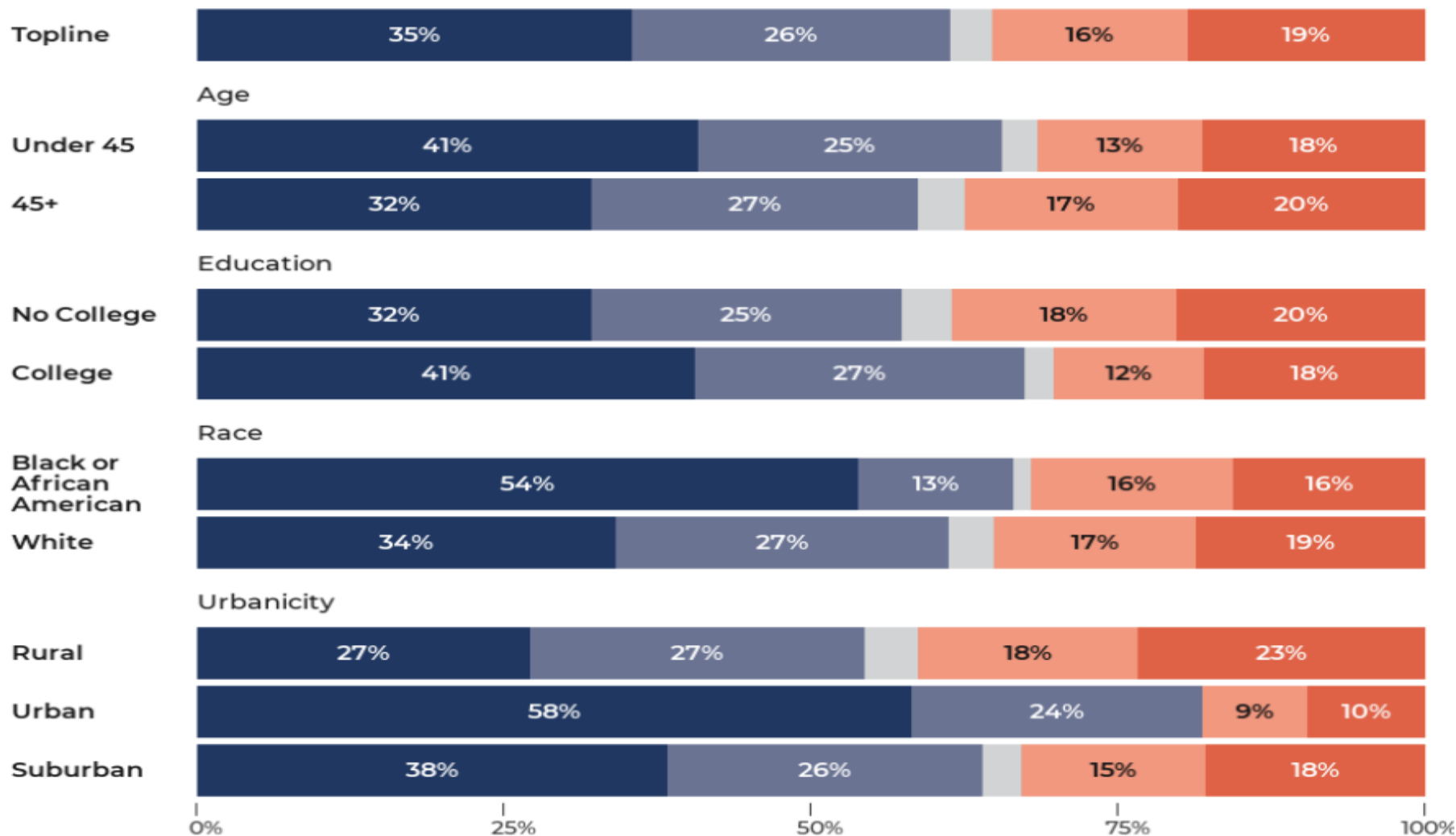


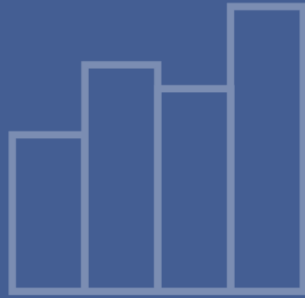


Addressing Racial Inequities

Would you support or oppose the state spending more money on policies that aim to eliminate racial inequities and provide equal opportunity for all Minnesotans?

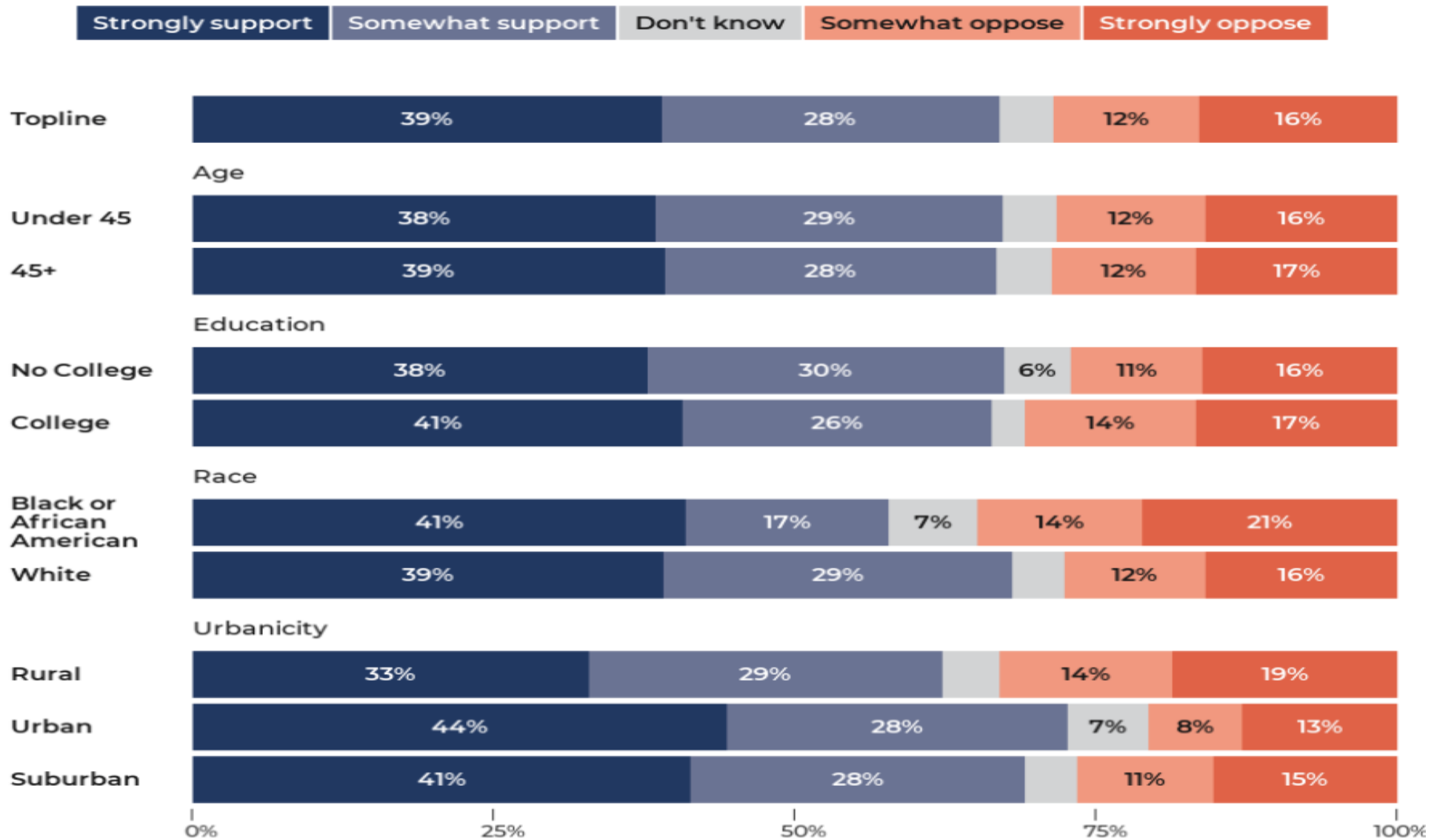

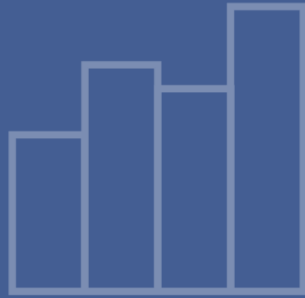




Raising Income Taxes on Top Earning Households

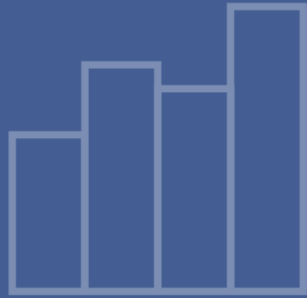
