#### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Steve Parrish (CCRFCD). A quorum was present.

### 2. Comments By the General Public

# 4. Action to approve the minutes of the November 12, 2024 meeting (For possible action)

The meeting minutes from the November 12, 2024 SQMC meeting were approved.

# 5. Receive an update on the implementation of the new MS4 permit and the draft revised Stormwater Management Plan (For possible action)

John Tennert (CCRFCD) provided an update on the implementation of the new MS4 Permit. The new permit was issued 1 year ago and the new SWMP draft submitted in October 2024 is currently under review by NDEP.

# 6. Receive a presentation on the Clark County Area-Wide Water Quality Management Plan Project Update (For possible action)

John Solvie (CC) presented the Clark County Area-Wide Water Quality Management Plan Project Update. The project is required by Federal (Section 208 of the Clean Water Act) and State Statutes (NRS 244A.571). Clark County Water Quality is responsible for developing and managing the 208 Plan. The primary focus is wastewater treatment and urban stormwater runoff. The current 208 Plan was adopted in 2009. This plan merged five regional water quality plans from across Clark County into one consolidated plan and identified 8 watersheds areas across Clark County. John Solvie shared that at this time the regulatory permitting requirements have evolved and the watershed planning process is moving towards a one water approach. The treatment plant information and population projections are no longer current, and an NDEP grand-funded evaluation is underway to align the multi-agency functions and consolidate findings into a new streamlined plan. The project scope includes: perform a comprehensive evaluation, develop a new streamlined 208 Plan, perform outreach and receive public comment, and secure approvals from the Clark County commission, NDEP, and EPA. The implementation of the project will strengthen Clark County connections with wastewater and stormwater/watershed agencies.

Steve Parrish shared that the Permittees are on track to meet the MS4 permit goals.

- Wet weather monitoring

For dry weather monitoring, Dr. Xiaoping Zhou (SNWA) shared that SNWA completed the first quarterly sampling event for 2025, and the information is available in the database. Angela MacKinnon (B&C) shared that there were no Wet Weather sampling events for this permit year. However, the sampling team will be tracking a possible rain event happening on February 13<sup>th</sup>.

# 9. Discuss Nevada Division of Environmental Protection issues and take action as deemed appropriate (For possible action)

Kathryn Foxworthy (NDEP) reported that the 2023-2024 Las Vegas Valley MS4 Annual Report is under review.

NDOT, Nellis Air Force Base, and other stakeholders had no issues to report.
