

The purpose of the Hertford British Charitable Fund ("HBCF") is to care for the wellbeing of British citizens and of other people with links to the UK who find themselves in dire need. This is achieved through welfare grants to individuals and financial support to associations in France which perform similar work.

The HBCF was previously the Hertford British Hospital Corporation, and it now incorporates the British Charitable Fund, Paris (with whom it merged on 1st January 2025).

The HBCF manages the original - and recently renovated - hospital built by Sir Richard Wallace in Levallois-Perret in 1879 (see below) and the modern hospital building behind it, which is made available to the Hôpital Franco-Britannique - Fondation Cognacq-Jay ("HFB-FCJ").

HBCF no longer provides medical care (which is provided by HFB-FCJ who can be reached through their website: www.hopitalfrancobritannique.org ).

#### THE BRITISH COMMUNITY COMMITTEE OF FRANCE

The British Community Committee of France, founded in 1937 (see page 43), is the umbrella organisation of British associations in France at a national level. It operates under the registered logo britishinfrance and publicises the existence of its member organisations so that British citizens in France, or those with British interests, know whom to contact to join.

The British Community Committee of France ("British Community" or "BCC") was first registered as a Loi 1901 association on 1 July 1939. It has two categories of members being associations with a major British link and up to 21 individual elected members of the British Community who wish to play an active part in the co-ordination and promotion of British Community activities.

Membership is open to associations and individuals throughout France and Monaco. The membership subscription is €20 if paid by 31 March, €30 if paid after 1 April.

We promote member organisations and their activities:

- The annual Directory of Member Organisations describes all members' activities and provides their contact details. You can obtain copies of the latest edition from places listed on page 46 and find a QR code to order copies to distribute.
- Our website britishinfrance.com reaches out to the broader on-line community, providing details
  of all members and their activities. Members use a webform to publicise upcoming events of
  members under britishinfrance.com/diary-of-events. Events can be searched for by region,
  keyword or date.
- We are building our social media presence so please follow us, tag us in your posts and in turn we
  will like and share posts of our member organisations. Should member organisations have events
  you would like to see featured on our accounts please send your photos and one-line stories to the
  committee and we will post immediately for the entire community to see.
- We hold Quarterly Meetings (usually in January, March or April, June, and September or October), attended by a delegate from each member organisation, the individual elected members, and the Regional Representatives elected by member organisation in the regions. We organise events for the entire British Community to help the British in France meet, see page 44.

Any association in France or Monaco with a British link is welcome to apply to join the British Community. Admission is granted to successful applicants following a presentation of the association to a Quarterly Meeting.

Supporting British nationals overseas is a key focus of the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), via our Embassy and Consular teams. Consular Assistance is directed towards the most vulnerable, and we really value collaboration with our partners across France who help us to support those most in need: thank you all.

2025 has been another busy year for the Embassy and our France network. We have just seen a fantastic State Visit to the UK by President and Mme Macron, alongside a UK/France Summit, which has delivered tangible results across key priority areas - migration, growth, and defence and security. The President announced the loan of the Bayeux Tapestry to the British Museum for a year (starting September 2026), with Sutton Hoo treasures due to come to France in return. This cultural partnership speaks to our shared history, and to our vibrant people-to-people links, and the connections between our communities.

This spring we hosted again the Annual General Meeting of the British Community Committee of France at the Residence. And our second 'Ambassador for a Day' programme, giving young French girls (aged 14-18) the chance to shadow me or one of my fellow Ambassadors for a day, showing that the world of diplomacy is open to all! We had some fantastic applications and enjoyed hosting the winners. In May we celebrated the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the liberation of Europe when I attended the commemorations at the Arc de Triomphe with the flyover of both the Red Arrows and the Patrouille de France, and as ever it was a privilege to be on the beaches of Normandy for D-Day 81, standing alongside veterans and serving members of our Armed Forces.

This is sadly my final year as Ambassador to France: I am leaving at the end of July. My successor is Sir Tom Drew who arrives at the end of August with his wife Joanna Roper (also a British diplomat, who has just finished her tour as Ambassador to the Netherlands). I feel proud to have taken our alliance with France to a new level – an Entente Amicale – turning the page on some difficult years, and looking to the future. Tom will bring fresh energy and enthusiasm to the job and I know he will be brilliant, and look to connect with the British community.

Of course, all these events have been happening alongside our daily rhythm of work to support British Nationals in France. This includes our teams continuing to work with French colleagues to understand how British Nationals will be affected by the upcoming implementation of the EU's Entry/Exit Scheme (EES) in October. We will continue to liaise with many of your associations to highlight the introduction of the EES and will keep our Living in France guide up to date. You'll find the links below to our gov.uk platform and social media.

We continue to raise with the French authorities cases where the Withdrawal Agreement is wrongly applied to minors, late applicants and joining family members, and to seek to improve their online information. If your WA resident permit is coming up for renewal, please remember that this needs to be done through the local prefecture. Further details and updates on resident permits can be found in our Living in Guide and on the French government site What does a British or family member have to do to live in France? (servicepublic.fr/particuliers/vosdroits/F35032?lang=en).

Finally, let me thank all British Community Committee of France members for your partnership and support over the last four years. It's been a pleasure and a privilege. I would also like to thank our consular staff across France, led so brilliantly by Pamela Deegan and our Consuls in Paris, Bordeaux and Marseille, who deal with difficult issues day in and day out, but stay positive, calm and kind. I will miss them all.

#### HOW THE BRITISH COMMUNITY COMMITTEE BEGAN

The British Community Committee of France has represented the British in France for almost 90 years.



The end of the Napoleonic wars in 1815 had made it possible for the British to come back to France to live and to pursue their business interests such as building railways, running banks, property and insurance companies, and bringing British sports such as football, tennis, horseracing, rowing and even cricket to the people of France.

Following the abdication of King Edward VIII in 1936, a group of British residents in Paris decided that to cheer themselves up, they should launch a joyous celebration of the Coronation of King George VI in 1937.

The celebration was a great success, restoring the traditional *joie de vivre* of the British community in France.

The British Community Committee of France was registered as an association loi 1901 on 1 July 1939. In January 1948, Mrs Lynch reported to the Préfecture de Police a list of 26 members, including the Chaplain of St. George's Church, Paris, Fr Neate; the Minister of the Scots Kirk, Paris, the Revd Donald Caskie, the manager of Thomas Cook's travel agency on the place de la Madeleine, Mr Hargreaves, and several prominent lawyers, accountants and engineers working in Paris.

In February 1982, the then Vice-Chairman, Beryl Jones, proposed that the name be changed to "British Community Committee". (The words "of France" were added in 2012.). Beryl had arrived in Paris in 1955, with virtually no knowledge of French, and very lonely. Everything changed when Beryl spotted a poster for the British Community Christmas Party. Beryl recalls a frustrating December Saturday in 1978 when she vainly tried to visit three English church bazaars, all inconveniently held on the same day because there was no-one to co-ordinate the various social events being organised in Paris by and for the British Community. When she was elected the British Community Committee's first lady Chairman in 1985, her first act was to institute the Social Diary.

Under the Chairmanship of Christopher Mitchell-Heggs, the British Community began to publish The Digest, a booklet describing the activities of the various British institutions, such as the schools, churches, sports clubs and the Consulate. That publication became the Directory of Member Organisations, a copy of which you are now reading. The website was added later and today all member organisations are encouraged to add events to the on-line diary on the British In France website.

In 2012 and 2022 the British Community gathered to celebrate the Diamond and Platinum Jubilees of Queen Elizabeth II. During her long reign she met 10 French presidents from Vincent Auriol to Emanuel Macron. In 2023 we held a cocktail party to unite the British Community in celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla. Our British In France website also published details of the celebrations held by our member organisations all over France. In 2024 we held a British in France Christmas party.

According to the IPPR's estimates of numbers of passports held by permanent British residents abroad, the British community in France is Britain's fifth-largest expat community, and the second-largest in a non-English-speaking country (after Spain). The British Community currently numbers over 110 member organisations and can elect up to 21 individual members.

Much of the valuable work of member organisations still lies in welcoming new British residents to France and helping them to assimilate. Today, the Directory and Website, including the What's On diary page, enable British enthusiasts of any activity in one part of France to know what is going on in their field of interest in other parts of France, so they can get in touch, make new contacts, or even be inspired to create a "new" activity. It all helps us to remember that we're all part of one big British family in France.

#### Renewing your British passport if you live in France

British citizens living in France apply for their new UK passport online at gov.uk/overseas-passports. You will be given the option of entering the code of a digital photograph. Given it is difficult to obtain a digital photo outside the UK with codes which will be accepted, if you are not visiting the UK in the three months before your passport renewal, you can take a digital photograph using the camera on your PC. The website will tell you whether the photo is acceptable. Then complete the rest of the online form and use your bank card details to pay the required amount including the courier fee for delivery of your new passport. Next send your old passport to HM Passport Office at the address indicated, preferably by registered post. If you are a dual national, you will also need to send a colour photocopy of your other passport. Your application cannot be processed until HM Passport Office receives your current (now "old") passport, but you will be advised by e-mail when it does receive it. When your new passport has been printed, you should receive an e-mail confirming that your new passport is on its way and has been sent by secure delivery. In practice there can be a delay between this message being sent and actual despatch of the new passport.

Emergency Travel Documents are for British nationals finding themselves outside the UK and whose passport has been lost, stolen, damaged, is full, has recently expired, or is with HM Passport Office or a foreign embassy, and who do not have time to renew or replace their passport before travelling. You will need to provide proof of your travel plans, for example booking confirmations (or detailed written travel plans, if you cannot book ahead). Following your online application, you may need to attend an appointment at a British Embassy, High Commission or Consulate. See gov.uk/emergency-travel-document/how-to-apply.

#### Registering to vote in the UK

UK nationals resident overseas may register to vote in the UK constituency where they last resided, or were last registered. UK nationals in France who have been registered to vote as residents in the UK at any time in the past 15 years can register at gov.uk/register-to-vote. National Insurance number and passport details are required. See electoralcommission.org.uk/voting-and-elections.

Those who were too young to register when they left the UK must have a parent or guardian who has been registered. Registered overseas voters are eligible to vote for the UK General Elections, but not local government elections or elections for the devolved assemblies.

Once you are registered, you can choose to vote in person at your local polling station if you are in the UK on Election Day. Otherwise, you can apply in advance to vote by post or by proxy. You can register for this online for constituencies in England, Scotland or Wales by going to

electoralcommission.org.uk/voting-and-elections/ways-vote/apply-vote-post or electoralcommission.org.uk/voting-and-elections/ways-vote/apply-vote-proxy. Your proxy can apply for a postal proxy vote if they live in a different area.

#### Applying for French nationality

You may hold both French and British nationalities. Usually at least five years' legal, law-abiding residence in France is required for *naturalisation par décret*. An application for *naturalisation par décret* for most foreigners (not those with a French spouse and/or French children, where the procedure is different) requires form CERFA n°12753\*03 (which can be completed on-line) and documents including family members' birth, marriage, divorce and death certificates and official translations. The form asks for details of relatives and children, as well as those of the applicant, all work positions ever held, and all places of residence in France and abroad. Applicants' ability to speak French may be tested. Applications should be made to the préfecture.

The website **service-public.fr/particuliers/vosdroits/F2213** gives detailed information in French, receives on-line applications, and includes a simulator where would-be applicants answer questions about their situation, and obtain a tailored list of the required documents.

#### Travelling between the UK and France with your pet

If you enter the UK, or an EU member state from the UK, with an animal and do not have the correct documents, your pet may be put into quarantine or sent back to the country it travelled from, at your expense. See information is available at **gov.uk/taking-your-pet-abroad** and the Pet Travel Scheme pages for France, **pettravel.com/immigration/France.cfm**. For travel to the UK with a pet, see **gov.uk/bring-your-pet-to-great-britain**.


