TYLER'S COLUMN

Good morning,

Thank you for joining us today. Sam and Debbie are enjoying their annual fall trip to Tennessee, so things will look slightly different today. We will be diving into a relatively unknown moment in the life of David. David has already been anointed the next king, but he isn't there yet. He is popular among the Israelite people, but despised by the leaders. He is a feared warrior, but he is scared. In this game of hide-n-seek, David plays both roles, hiding from others and seeking God.

Tonight, we are back at it at 6:30. We have been walking through the book of Acts in youth group for the past few weeks, but this evening we will taking a break and switching gears. The Hebrew writer has this moment of frustration with the people he wrote to. In chapter 5 he tells them they should be further in their faith, but they are more like infants. This is hindering him from teaching what he really wants to. But what does this mean for us? What does this mean for our teens? Quite simply, we should be maturing spiritually, just as we mature emotionally, and physically. But what does that look like? This is what we will be diving into tonight. We will start at 6:30. Come early and hang out at 6.

Titus 3:14 says, "Our people must also learn to engage in good deeds to meet pressing needs, so that they will not be unfruitful." This is the sixth time in Titus that Paul urges believers to participate in doing "good deeds". Why was the final instruction he gave in this letter an encouragement for us to "learn to engage in good deeds"? My guess is because by nature, they didn't automatically do good deeds. The same is true for many today, even those who profess to be Christians. We are often lazy, consumed by our own issues, or just too busy. So Paul writes to Titus, making it perfectly clear that Christians are called to godliness; to stand out in sharp contrast to the pagan culture in which we live.

Here are 2 reasons we should "engage in good deeds":

We impact the community by our good deeds. Does this community need to be drawn to God? How can we best do this? I really like what Paul said in Titus 2:13-14. He explains that "...our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ,... gave Himself for us to redeem us from every lawless deed, and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds." It has been said by many others and I agree, "People don't care how much you know until they know how much you care." Another way of putting it is, "To TELL the truth, we must SHOW the truth." This is precisely what our Lord did. He served, met needs and people listened. Showing through serving can help Christians to effectively impact our communities for Christ and enable us to tell others about the good news of the gospel! Second, we are to engage in good deeds because...

We meet pressing needs by our good deeds. That was the reason Paul gave in Titus 3:14, "Our people must also learn to engage in good deeds to meet pressing needs, so that they will not be unfruitful." Paul qualifies that word "deeds" with the word "good" which can be translated "beautiful" or "valuable." Doing good deeds to meet pressing needs is indeed "beautiful!" I'm touched at the number of you right here at Meadow View who have met pressing needs in a number of ways. Often, when I go to make a hospital call or visit someone preparing for a surgery, there are already members there. I've watched some of you wrap your arms around those struggling with sinful temptations—never condoning but always loving. I've watched some of you help out with funeral dinners, send cards and letters of encouragement. and give of your resources to struggling families. It's beautiful. I could go on but time won't allow and some stories are too private and personal to share. The Lord is nudging us to keep learning, to keep stretching, to keep growing in good deeds to meet pressing needs so that we will be fruitful. The implication from Titus 3:14 is this: If you are a Christian, and you do not have a meaningful, personal, Christian ministry in your life, you are living outside the will of God in your life right now. Not only does God need you, the body of believers here at Meadow View needs you! You will never truly understand how deep personal fulfillment can be until you start giving of yourself for the cause of Christ. I challenge you to look for ways that you can do good in the lives of others; not looking for reward or recognition but simply looking to help meet needs! PRAISE THE LORD!
