Next week we will be celebrating our 25 years at this location. We are excited for the morning we have planned. We want this to be a place for people to not only share, but to also spend time walking and reading and reminiscing.

We hope you will plan to join us next week as we celebrate together.

A Call to Duty

Isaiah 6:1-13

Every soldier who serves **in the military have answered "A Call to Duty"**. Each one of us, if we have decided to make Jesus the Lord and Savior of our life, are a part of the church that Jesus died for and have also **answered "A Call to Duty"**. **But just what is this "call of duty" that every person must answer** if we are going to be saved and eventually make it to our heavenly home? We will be looking at what Isaiah wrote concerning his call from God as described in chapter 6.

- I. The God who calls us to serve Him is on His throne! – Isaiah 6:1
 - A. God is in charge! He is indeed in charge of all things in His creation.
 - B. God is **"lofty and exalted"**! This indicates dignity, status and majesty and refers to His being elevated above every created thing. – Isaiah 6:1b
 - C. God is showing Isaiah that He is the all-knowing, all-powerful, Almighty God with whom no one can compare! – Isaiah 6:2-4; 1 Timothy 6:16
- II. **Isaiah's** response is one of complete awe and humility! – Isaiah 6:5-8
 - A. Isaiah now knew that any human effort to become like our holy God is useless! When anyone comes to realize what Isaiah now knew, three things then happen.
 1. We are convicted of our sins! – Isaiah 6:5a
 2. We confess our sins! – Isaiah 6:5b
 3. God will cleanse us of our sins! – Isaiah 6:6-7
 - B. **Isaiah's final response is: "Here am I. Send me!"** – Isaiah 6:8

Are you willing to be like Isaiah? **May we all, even if we don't know exactly how God will use us or where God will send us, cry out, "Here I am. Send me!"**

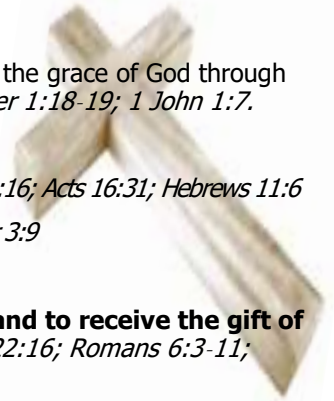

- 1) **Having faith in Christ, trusting Him as both Lord and Savior.** *John 3:16; Acts 16:31; Hebrews 11:6*
- 2) **Repenting from sin.** *Luke 13:3, 5; Acts 2:38, 17:30; 2 Corinthians 7:10; 2 Peter 3:9*
- 3) **Confessing Christ.** *Matthew 10:32-33; Acts 8:37; Romans 10:9-10*
- 4) **Being immersed (baptized) into Christ for the forgiveness of sins and to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.** *Mark 16:16; Matthew 28:18-20; John 3:3, 5; Acts 2:38, 22:16; Romans 6:3-11; Galatians 3:26-27; Colossians 2:12; 1 Peter 3:21*
