




BISBEE HISTORY

At the turn of the 19th century, thanks to a booming copper mine, Bisbee was the largest city between St. Louis and San Francisco, as well as one of the most cosmopolitan, boasting many modern and cultural amenities; the state's first community library, stock exchange, and a baseball stadium argued to pre-date Chicago's Wrigley Field. But like any mining town, Bisbee also had its rough edges. It was home to the notorious Brewery Gulch, packed with dozens of saloons and brothels.



BISBEE RENAISSANCE

As copper mining declined elsewhere in the 1930s and 1940s, the Copper Queen remained in operation throughout the mid century using the open-pit mining process and was one of the most prolific copper mines of its time. But with decreasing returns, it too eventually closed. The official closure of the mines in the 1970s ushered in a cultural renaissance for the town of Bisbee. As mining families left, artists and creatives were drawn to the inexpensive and historic downtown spaces that time seemed to have forgotten. Today, Bisbee is an eclectic artists' haven teeming with shops, galleries, restaurants, and nightlife. A Southwestern hub for arts and culture, our sky island retains a rich history that is just as much cosmopolitan as it is wild west.



OUR HISTORY

Originally called the Brooks Apartments, our historic building was constructed in 1914, by local businessman, James L Brooks, for a cost of \$20k.

Built in the Territorial style, the Brooks Apartment house was quite modern for its time. An early example of a multi-family dwelling, newspapers touted it as "one of the finest buildings of its kind in the country".

It was home to "respectable society" who reveled in the spacious verandas, private entrances, concrete floors, and large partitions that distinguished it from the boarding houses of the day. Many newlyweds and families, even the famous Los Angeles psychic to the stars, Madame Martel, called the Brooks Apartments home in the early part of the 20th century.



Like many of the buildings in Bisbee, the Brooks Apartments fell into disrepair over the years. In 2006, it was remodeled and reimaged as the Eldorado Suites Hotel, and in 2015 the mother daughter duo of Lisa & Searra Head took stewardship of the historic property.

- 1 COPPER QUEEN MINE TOUR** (520) 432-2071 Outfitted in a hard hat, headlamp, and rain slicker, ride into the mountainside like a true miner! This original underground mine tour is led by retired local miners and provides a truly authentic experience. QueenMineTour.com
- 2 COPPER QUEEN PUBLIC LIBRARY** (520) 432-4232 Founded in 1882, the oldest library in the state was recently honored with the National Medal Award! With an amazing children's section and cozy reading areas, this historic library is a must see! Don't miss the seed library of desert plants, and loaner pickleball and bocce ball sets to use in the nearby parks.
- 3 BISBEE MINING & HISTORICAL MUSEUM** (520) 432-7071 A Smithsonian affiliate, this museum's self-guided tour is informative and interactive, telling a comprehensive story of our copper-mining town's role in the industrialization of America. BisbeeMuseum.org
- 4 OLD BISBEE GHOST TOUR** (520) 432-3308 Take a guided walking tour through our streets, stairways, and alleys after dark. Learn about the ghosts and legends that are said to haunt our 125 year old town. OldBisbeeGhostTour.com
- 5 ART ALLEY** Consisting of donations, funky thrift store finds, and dumpster dives, this community-based, pop-up art gallery, transformed a forgotten corridor since it's debut in 2018. Quintesentially Bisbee!
- 6 THE MAGIC SHOW & SEANCE ROOM** (520) 203-3350 Revel in a turn of the century parlor magic show, hosted by a true entertainer, Magic Kenny Bang Bang! Enjoy haunted history and slight of hand in this unique interactive performance that can be tailored for any audience. TheBisbeeSeanceRoom.com
- 7 MUHEIM HERITAGE HOUSE** (520) 234-3876 A national historic site with Queen Anne architectural influences, this lovely heritage home museum provides guided tours, through its restored interiors with period furnishings. BisbeeMuseum.org
- 8 B ACTIVE TOURS & BIKE RENTALS** (520) 352-9696 What better way to traverse the narrow, winding streets of Bisbee than by golf cart! Learn what makes our town so unique with a local expert guide. Also e-bike rentals and guided bike & hiking tours. This is the hub for local outdoor activity! BactiveBisbee.com
- 9 PEACE WALL** Mural by nationally recognized artist, Rose Johnson, who made Bisbee her home before her untimely death in 2009. Spot her distinct style in other murals around town, most notably the side of the Jonquil Motel, a little further up Tombstone Canyon.
- 10 HIGGINS HILL PARK & BISBEE SWIMMING POOL** Hidden up the road behind the courthouse, this unique recreation hub boasts basketball and pickleball courts, as well as fitness stations. The Bisbee outdoor swimming pool is open Memorial Day through Labor Day.
- 11 ARTEMEZIA FOUNDATION** The largest private collection of contemporary, graffiti and street art in the Southwest. Founded by artist, entrepreneur, and native New Yorker, this collection boasts works by over 100 artists, including Swoon, Banksy, and Warhol. Explore the gallery and sculpture garden Thursday through Sunday. ArtemiziaFoundation.org
- 12 LAVENDER PIT** An immense stair-stepped crater in the ground is all that remains where Sacramento Hill once stood. One of the most prolific open pit copper mines in the world, until it closed in 1975. Gold, silver and turquoise were also mined here. Bisbee turquoise, known as Bisbee Blue, is among the finest turquoise found anywhere in the world.
- 13 ERIE STREET** Though much of Lowell was lost as the Lavender Pit expanded, one street was preserved and has become a vintage 1950s outdoor museum. Local enthusiasts have helped make this unique location one of the most photographed streets in the West.

14 OLD BISBEE BREWING & DISTILLERY (520) 432-2739 Just below us, serving craft beer and an international award winning gin! Day drinking headquarters with a sizable patio. Grab an extra growler to fill from our lending locker and enjoy your favorite brew back in your suite! @BisbeeBeer

15 CHUCKLEHEADS COMEDY CLUB (520) 485-8703 Comedians from around the country make appearances here as well as hosting karaoke and live music. @ChuckleheadsAZ

16 ROOM 4 BAR (520) 432-3723 The littlest bar in Arizona boasts the coolest local vibe. Just off the 2nd floor lobby of the Silver King Hotel, seating is limited, but the selection of spirits is plentiful. Enjoy homemade jello shots on occasion and great live music on the patio. @Room4Bar

17 MIMOSA MARKET & BREAD STAND (520) 432-3256 Lovingly known as the inconvenient store, this mom and pop grocer is open by appt only. Stop by Saturday mornings from 9a-noon for fresh baked bread from their driveway stand. MimosaBisbee.com

18 THE QUARRY (520) 366-6868 Restaurant and bar serving high quality comfort food with an artisanal flair in a dive bar atmosphere. Meals here are delicious, but not always fast. Open late on weekends. @The.Quarry.Bisbee

19 ST. ELMO'S BAR (520) 432-5578 Open since 1902, this bar is on the national list of historic dive bars, and is the longest continually operated bar in Arizona - surviving Prohibition by transforming into a soda shop. A favorite of bikers & barflies, the Bloody Marys here have a spicy kick! @BisbeeStElmo

20 THE BISBEE COURTYARD (917) 664-8353 A stylish courtyard behind historic iron gates with an adjoining lounge. This multipurpose space hosts private events, and sometimes opens to the public for concerts or cocktails. TheBisbeeCourtyard.com

21 COPPER QUEEN SALOON (520) 432-2216 Located inside the historic Copper Queen Hotel, built to host distinguished visitors and dignitaries. Stop by for a drink and marvel at the ornate turn of the century ambiance.

22 ALLEN & CO. ESPRESSO HOUSE (520) 333-7970 Committed to quality and community, this legit coffeehouse is a hub for locals. Serving cold brew, espresso, chai, tasty bagels & pastries. @allenespessohouse
