## GOOD NEWS

After Trump withdrew the U.S. from membership in the World Health Organization (WHO), Gov Newsom made California the first state to become a member, calling Trump's action a "reckless decision." The U.S. has been part of WHO for more than 80 years.

Despite subzero temps on Friday, thousands of protesters rallied against the ongoing ICE invasion of Minnesota, as hundreds of businesses also closed their doors. Across the U.S., protesters gathered at more than 300 other locations in solidarity.

Americans commemorated the anniversary of Trump's inauguration with about 450 Free America Walkouts nationwide to highlight the escalating fascist threat his regime represents.

## ABOLISH ICE

*From the driver seat of her car Renee Good says brightly, "That's fine, Dude, I'm not mad at you," to ICE agent Jonathan Ross as he circles her car filming with his cell phone.*

*After the chaos of the next minute, after Ross has shot Good three times point blank, his own video captures his muttered, "Fuckin' bitch," and her vehicle careening uncontrolled down the street, crashing finally into a row of parked cars.*

On January 7, an immigration enforcement action on Portland Ave, Minneapolis, escalated abruptly when ICE agents encountered Renee Good in her parked car, partially blocking the roadway. The ensuing confrontation ended with Agent Ross shooting Good to death in front of her wife. There is ample media coverage of the event online, including multiple video recordings. Those recordings and witness testimony indicate that at the time she was shot Good was trying to move her car away from the agents accosting her. Her killing was bookended by her casual comment and his expletive-amplified slur.

The agents who showed up on Portland Ave January 7 were aggressive, callous, and disorganized. After the shooting, agents refused to let a physician aid Good. They failed to move their cars to allow emergency personnel clear passage to Good. Paramedics were forced to walk stretcherless to Good's demolished car, and then to carry her body by her limbs back to the ambulance, evoking desperate battlefield recovery scenes. (Recall Trump's September speech describing Democratic-led American cities like Minneapolis as potential "training grounds for our military" to fight a "war from within.")

The Trump administration rushed out a response intended not to console the family of the deceased, or to reassure Americans of an investigation and accountability, but to disparage a victim of ICE brutality. Administration officials, including Department of Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem and Vice President JD Vance, blamed Good for her own death, accused her baselessly of weaponizing her car, and labeled her a domestic terrorist, a "deranged leftist." They continue to deny what is evident in the videos and fabricate their preferred account. Trump lied nonsensically on social media and to New York Times reporters that the agent was run over.

The administration has pledged unqualified support for Good's killer. Currently, the Civil Rights Division of the Department of Justice (DOJ) refuses to investigate her death, contrary to the department's typical reaction to allegations of excessive force by law enforcement. Instead the DOJ is targeting Becca Good, Renee's widow, and Minnesota Democratic officials for retaliatory criminal investigation. Noem has surged even more ICE agents to bully a defiant Minneapolis. Trump is threatening the Insurrection Act. Civil rights violations, physical assaults, and chaotic arrests of targeted individuals, observers, even those stumbling unaware into enforcement actions, are rampant. Trump and Republicans are fully invested in their 'come for the signing bonus, stay for the mayhem' enforcers paid for by funds they cut from Medicaid and SNAP.

ICE is an out-of-control artifact of America's historical trauma. Trump and Republicans have further debased it, proving its 'Protect America' mission was always a pretext to execute their white nationalist deportation agenda now underway. ICE is now a brutish, undertrained paramilitary. Masked agents kidnap, injure and kill without accountability as Vance extols their "absolute immunity." ICE is irredeemable. Noem should resign or be impeached. ICE should be abolished.




## PYAC COMMUNITY READ

## Alternatives to Violence Project (AVP) for Justice and Peace Workshop Series 2026

*on Transforming Power, Trauma Resiliency, Liberation from Oppression, and Consensus of Conscience*

This interactive, experiential workshop is for adults and teens actively engaged in justice and peace work and experimenting with inward guidance, whatever name you use: Transforming Power, Living Spirit, God, the Divine, love and conscience, or other. Together, we test discernment for personal and social transformation as we create just, peaceful lives, homes, communities, and societies.

The training begins with the Alternatives to Violence Project (AVP) Basic workshop on power, so newcomers to AVP are welcome. It continues with tools for trauma resiliency, liberation from transgenerational patterns of oppression, and discerning a consensus of conscience. Evenings are used for studio time to share experiences, explore applications, and collaborate on actions.
