



Story

Jacob had a son named Joseph, who had a very special gift. He was able to interpret messages that God sent through people's dreams. Joseph's brothers were jealous of him because he told them that he had a dream that meant he would rule over them one day. They wanted him gone, so they sold him to Ishmaelites. That began a long series of difficult times for Joseph. After being sold, Joseph was accused of crimes he did not commit, and thrown in jail. God was always with Joseph and blessed him through the many challenges that followed. Joseph was always faithful to God and was eventually brought out of these troubles and placed in a powerful position beside the Pharaoh of Egypt.



Exodus 15:13 You have led in your steadfast love the people whom you have redeemed; you have guided them by your strength to your holy abode.



Moses was a man that God sent to get his people, the Israelites, out of slavery. He was leading them to freedom out of Egypt when Pharaoh's army came charging after them to recapture them as slaves. The Israelites saw the soldiers and were very afraid. They saw that they were stuck between the army and the Red Sea. Moses told them not to fear, because God would fight for them. When the army drew closer, God told Moses to stretch his staff over the sea to part it. The water parted, and God's people made it safely to freedom on the other side.



It is important to remember that God sees more than we do. It may look like we are stuck somewhere, but if we can remember that God will always make a way, we will never have to be afraid. Today, as you fast, think of the great things God has done in your life and how he has never failed you.

Day 5 ~ God has a Plan

Joshua 6:2 And the Lord said to Joshua, "See, I have given Jericho into your hand, with its king and mighty men of valor."



God sent a man named Joshua to lead his people to the promised land. They traveled for forty years through the desert and finally arrived, but found themselves in front of a big obstacle—a city called Jericho. Jericho was a city surrounded by strong walls that kept people from going in or out. Joshua's army did not have a way to get in, but God had a plan. God instructed them to march around the city for six days. On the seventh day, he told them to march around the city seven times and to blow their trumpets and shout. When they did this, the mighty walls of Jericho came falling to the ground, and they were able to enter the promised land as God had planned.



When God wants to lead us somewhere, he always has a plan. We can't always understand why we are given the path that we are, but we can always trust in God. Day 6 ~ I Am Who God Says I Am

1 Samuel 16:7 But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart."



God sent Samuel to Jesse's house to anoint the next king of Israel. Jesse brought out all of his sons for Samuel to meet, except for one named David. Jesse left David in the field because he was the youngest and didn't look as strong as he thought a king would. Samuel told Jesse that none of the brothers he brought in were who God had chosen and to go get his other son. As soon as he saw David, God told Samuel that he was the future king.



Have you ever not felt good enough? Good news! God is not interested in how we look or what others may think of us. He is concerned with what is in our hearts. Sometimes, people can make us feel like we need to be different, but God needs you to be exactly who he made you to be. Today, as you fast, pick one of the great qualities that God gave you and think about how you can use it to bless others.

Day 7 ~ God Will Always Provide

1 Kings 17:16 The jar of flour was not spent, neither did the jug of oil become empty, according to the word of the Lord that he spoke by Elijah.





Elijah was a man known for always following God. Many people had a problem with this because they chose to worship fake gods and didn't like that Elijah didn't follow their lead. God told Elijah there was going to be a drought. During the drought, the others thought that one of their fake gods would save them from it and bring rain. Elijah stayed faithful to the one true God and, after years of no rain, he heard from God that the rain was coming soon to end the drought. Elijah told the king this and sent a servant up to the mountain seven times. Sure enough, the seventh time he saw a rain cloud. God had ended the drought!



Did you know that everything good comes from God? When you put God first, he will always provide for you. Sometimes, it's easy to get distracted by things that we think we need on this earth, but our God knows exactly what we need to become the people that he created us to be. Day 8 ~ God is Always With You

Job 1:21 And he said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return. The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."



Job was a man who had a nice life on earth. He was rich, had a family, and most importantly, he loved God very much. Satan thought that he could turn Job away from God with evil, but God knew Job's heart and said that couldn't be done. So, God allowed Satan to test Job. Job lost his riches, all his possessions, and all of his children. Even when he was hurting from his losses, he still worshipped and loved God. People told him to curse God, but Job refused and never blamed God or stopped loving him. God then gave Job even more possessions, riches, and children than he had before and blessed him with a long, happy life.



Even when Job was hurting the most, he still loved God and trusted him. Did you know that God has a plan for your life? You can always trust that he loves you and will never let you down. There once was a king named Nebuchadnezzar who wanted all of his people to worship a big gold statue that he had made, instead of worshiping God. He said that anyone who didn't worship the statue would be thrown into a fire! Three men, named Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, refused to worship the statue because they were faithful to God. The king got very angry and had them thrown into a fire seven times bigger than usual. The three men went into the fire and then walked out without a single burn. The king was amazed by this and changed his law to have the people worship only the one true God!



These three men stayed faithful to God in a very scary situation. They knew that God's love was stronger than any hate that a person could have toward them, and that God was able to protect them from the fire. Today, as you fast, think of something that frightens you and know that you can trust God to deliver you from it.

Day 10 ~ You Can't Run From God's love

Jonah 1:9 And he said to them, "I am a Hebrew, and I fear the Lord, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land."



God told a man named Jonah to go to a city that was full of evil, called Nineveh, and deliver a message of His love. Jonah did not want to go to this evil city, so he decided to run away from God on a boat. God sent a storm after the boat to stop Jonah. Recognizing this, Jonah jumped off the ship so that the storm would stop. After he landed in the water, a big fish swallowed him and held him for three days. A young girl named Mary was visited by an angel one day. The angel told her that she was going to have a son, who would be called Jesus, and that he would be the Son of God. Mary was confused because she wasn't married to Joseph, yet. The angel told her that the Holy Spirit would put the child inside her. Mary became pregnant, and when she and Joseph were traveling to Joseph's town of Bethlehem, the baby was ready to be born. 

Matthew 27:50 And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up his spirit.




