





Pulaski County offers outstanding golfing opportunities with three diverse and scenic courses. Golfers can enjoy the historic charm of Thorn Spring Golf Course, featuring rolling fairways and a welcoming event center, or test their skills at Draper Valley Golf Club, a championship-length course known for its open layout and challenging water features. For a premier experience, the Pete Dye River Course of Virginia Tech delivers world-class design along the breathtaking New River. Whether you're a seasoned player or a casual enthusiast, Pulaski County is a hidden gem for golf!



RANDOLPH PARK

Randolph Park is your recreation destination when it's time to play outside! This state-of-the-art 87-acre outdoor recreational complex has something for every sports enthusiast. The park has four baseball/softball fields with expansive covered dugouts designed for major tournament play, and a sizeable fenced-in playground is conveniently accessible from the ballpark. Additional amenities include a soccer and football field, two rubberized basketball courts, two pickleball courts, the Evelyn Alexander Water Park, and a world-class eighteen-hole disc golf course that hosts tournament play.

Randolph Park features a state-of-the-art outdoor Fitness Court® designed to provide a full-body workout in just seven minutes. Often described as a "playground for adults," this free, open-air gym includes multiple stations targeting different muscle groups, allowing for bodyweight exercises like squats, push-ups, lunges, and pull-ups. The facility is part of Pulaski County's commitment to promoting year-round outdoor recreation and healthy living.

If you're looking for slower-paced activities, the walking trails network through the park offers a safe, beautiful, and natural setting that are accessible for all abilities. Randolph Park also houses three large shelters and a gazebo near the Hawks Nesting Pond, which are available for rent.







HISTORIC DRAPER EXPLORE Rent a bicycle in the Market at the Draper Mercantile and ride the scenic New River Trail next to the Historic Draper Village. Experience history as you follow the old train tack rail bed through gorgeous pastoral land and over the New River. The trail is primarily flat (only a 3% grade) and perfect for beginners and seasoned riders alike.

DINING

The Draper Mercantile has been known as a place of gathering for many years, but what would a gathering be without food? Stop by the Village Coffee Shoppe and Merc Café for incredible Southern American cuisine and locally roasted coffee. The Draper Blooms Tea Garden is the perfect setting for an elegant tea party or to quietly sip a gourmet tea.


SHOPPING

Music

You can find all types of music in Pulaski County, from beach music ushering in the sounds of summer to Pulaski Theatre's rock cover bands and folk music concerts. With venues tied to the Crooked Road, visitors can also find a variety of old-time and bluegrass music. Restaurants like The Mason Jar at Claytor Lake and The Draper Mercantile hold live music weekly throughout the year. Music fills the area parks during the summer, from Pulaski County Musicfest Concert series to the shores of Claytor Lake at Rock House Marina.

Art

The local arts scene in Pulaski County is thriving and full of many types of art, including Appalachian arts and crafts. The Fine Arts Center of the New River Valley in Pulaski believes art is essential to the community's lifestyle and culture and has spent decades cultivating a true sense of enjoyment, appreciation, and understanding of all art forms. Visit the center to participate in one of their art education programs or attend one of their sponsored concerts and see how they support local artists.









Pulaski County is steeped in American history, with strong ties to both the Revolutionary War and the Civil War. Named after Revolutionary War hero Count Casimir Pulaski, the county honors his legacy of courage and sacrifice. During the Civil War, the region played a strategic role due to its location along the Virginia & Tennessee Railroad, a vital supply line for the Confederacy. Historic sites and landmarks throughout the county offer a glimpse into these pivotal chapters of the nation's past, making Pulaski a meaningful destination for history enthusiasts.

HISTORY





New River Trail State Park is a stunning 57-mile linear park that follows the path of an abandoned railroad bed. The trail also winds along the scenic New River for 39 miles of its length and passes through four counties and the city of Galax, Virginia. The trail's gentle slope makes it a great outdoor escape for visitors of all ages to hike, bike, and ride horseback. The most recent addition to the New River Trail State Park is the Hoover Mountain Bike Complex trails, which used to serve as a mining area for Hoover Color Corporation.

Pulaski County offers three entry points; The Dora Junction, Draper and Hiwassee Bike Trail Parking.



CLAYTOR LAKE STATE PARK

Claytor Lake State Park is a one-of-a-kind outdoor experience offering boating, fishing, swimming, camping, hiking, and picnicking. You can relax, draw inspiration from the scenic lakeside setting, or start an exhilarating outdoor adventure. Claytor Lake State Park also has a full-service marina with docking slips, supplies, fuel, boat rentals, and refreshments. The park's events facility, Water's Edge, is perfect for receptions, reunions, and weddings.









Mountain 2 Island's Rockhouse Marina is the place to be on Claytor Lake! This full-service marina offers paddleboard, kayak, and boat rentals as well as food and rockin' music on the weekends during summer and fall. Whether you're venturing out on Claytor Lake or want to enjoy the lakeside views with great food and entertainment, Mountain 2 Island at the Rockhouse Marina is a Pulaski County must-do!
