Reflection Anon.

Unless you have the memory of an elephant, chances are you have completely forgotten the name Ayman al-Zawahiri. He was the head of Al-Qaeda, killed in 2022 by an American Hellfire missile. Essentially he was the victim of his self-imposed routine. Every morning, after morning prayer he would go out to stand on his balcony of his apartment at exactly the same time, watching the street life unfolding below. From hundreds of miles away a drone missile launch would leave him dead. An instant death – but amazingly his wife and daughter remained unscathed in the flat behind him. There's nothing romantic in war. Not for him the chance to be surrounded by family and loved ones as he took his last breath. The precision of the American air strike lays waste to the Israeli that killing thousands of innocent civilians is unavoidable as they target the leaders of Hamas. Ooops! We killed 89 people in a hospital by mistake!

Today, Jesus warns us to be on our guard, to be ready, to be prepared. This passage follows on from last week when we were told of the rich man who built bigger barns to accommodate his wealth. That wealth added noting to his life span - and nor can we. Being in a state of readiness should come naturally but can leave us full of dread. Mortality is not an issue that can be avoided. Be ready, be prepared - don't assume you will see 90 years just because you come from a line of long-livers!

The challenge is straightforward. What is it that we need if we are to be ready? It has been heart-breaking to watch TV news coverage of late. Images from Ukraine, Syria, Gaza, Sudan – they all numb the soul. What do you take with you when the order comes to 'flee'? We need nothing more than a life well-lived, a heart that is generous and open, accepting and forgiving. Is there a nicer compliment than 'He was always large-hearted!'. A large heart looks outward rather than inward; it looks for opportunity to bring hope and encouragement rather than dwelling on self-pity and self-idolatry. See that you are dressed for action and have your lamps lit.....get yourselves treasure that will not fail you, in heaven, where no thief can reach it and no moth destroy it. For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.
