Colleagues and acquaintances had spoken to Tom about the enigmatic, Jane. Regularly, she cropped up in conversation. Some spoke about her in glowing terms, others more disparagingly. She possessed a sharp brain and was quick-witted. She was referred to Miss Marmite. People loved her or loathed her. She never evoked a tepid response. Eventually, Tom managed to secure a date. Colleagues gave a were impressed - "lucky you", they cried. After a few such dates they both realised that they were not going to spend the rest of their lives together. Things had changed. Jnae was no longer a mystery to Tom and he no longer to her.. Thanks, but no thanks. There's a world of difference between knowing of someone - and knowing on a personal level. The same is true of our relationship with Jesus Christ. We can know about Christ, or we can know Him at the deepest of levels.

The weekend's Gospel carries a warning: *Many will try to enter and will not succeed.* It's easy to assume that we are doing enough, that we're getting by and that we will manage to squeeze in. But the reality is that we can always do more, try harder, be more kind, show more compassion. The athlete gets to the top not because of the first training session but because when he was nearing exhaustion at the last. There is always more we can achieve if we put our minds to it. The longest journey we ever make is the one from the head to the heart. Cerebral knowledge is one thing, but heartfelt love is something completely different. Its heartfelt love and compassion that will enable us to enter by the narrow door.

We have all been to the funeral of the popular individual. We take our seat and look around - we're only human after all! "Oh look, there's Mr and Mrs Higgins - oh and there's old George. I don't recognise that one - who is he - I've no idea who that is and I wonder why Philip Jenkins isn't here. I was sure he would turn up". We may well be equally surprised when we squeeze in through the narrow door. Many we assumed would be there, will not, and some we never expected to see will be there before us - and this is why we do more, try harder, be more kind, show more compassion.
