Reflection - Father Alexander Sherbrooke

"Whoever does not bear this own Cross and come after me cannot be my disciple".

This Sunday is very significant for it is the first time that Pope Leo XIV will canonise new saints. It will be a day of a great rejoicing for all the Church. Can I suggest that it would also be a day of great rejoicing for us here in St Patrick's for two particular reasons. Pier Giorgio Frassati is someone that I got to know in a literary sense some 44 years ago when, as a Seminarian in Rome, I was asked to translate some of his writings into English. I knew little about him then but over the years have come to know him as an extraordinary source of inspiration. First, to say that he was the most contemporary of all people who loved to climb mountains, party, drink wine and smoke cigars. What was remarkable at his funeral at the age of 23 having died of polio, there were thousands of people who came onto the streets of Turin to pay their respects. His immediate family knew nothing of the secret live that he had lived which he made up of work and care with the poor, visiting the sick and spending long hours in Eucharistic Adoration. He had also been a great standard bearer for the fight against fascism in the Italian Catholic Student Movement. When his body was exhumed some 40 years later, he was discovered to be incorrupt which is often taken as a sign of God's blessing. His walking with young people, helping them articulate a political view in accordance with the Gospel and his life of deep prayer was such an inspiration that Pope John Paul II made him co-patron of young people. So much of the life here at St Patrick's would have been a natural reality for him.

Much more contemporaneously we remember Carlo Acutis who died at the age of 14 with leukaemia. He showed an early and deep love of the Eucharist in particular promoting Eucharistic Adoration and could be described as the first "techy" saint through his work with web design. He also, for his contemporaries, was an extraordinary inspiration through his love of the poor, his care for children of divorced parents and his deep understanding of Catholic spirituality. He stands as a beautiful and holy witness that we should not be, as he describes, "a photocopy" but an individual marked and unique in the sight of God.

Very happily I and various of the parish will be at the Mass in St Peter's on Sunday and will carry you and all in our prayers. May these two new saints and the others who are being canonised inspire and touch us in our journey of faith.

I'm also delighted to welcome to the parish Father Thomas Croteau SJ who will be celebrating Mass for us on these days. Father – you are most welcome. God Bless.
