Reflection

Father Alexander Sherbrooke

"Neither will they be convinced if someone should rise up from the dead".

This very telling story about Lazarus and the rich man has many salient points. Very deliberately Our Lord does not give the rich man a name, suggesting that there is a certain rejection that is going to come his way. Second, the Lord has no difficulty in judging those who ignore the needs of the hungry and poor. Third, the rich man being condemned to Hades is a judgement to those who ignore the poor. As we listen to the Gospel this Sunday there is a challenge to each of us as to how we reach out to those who are less fortunate and ask for our love and concern. We know that there are so many situations both close to us and throughout the world whether it is the victims of war in the Middle East and Ukraine, the hungry, the unborn or vulnerable, who need our compassion and loving care. However, the world continues to ignore those in need and suffering seems to increase. Why can we not listen to this Gospel and do something about it?

The answer comes in the reference to the Resurrection for Our Lord is saying to the rich man now in Hades that if you do not believe in the Resurrection and eternal life, how is anyone going to change their behaviour towards the poor and outcast. We can worry much about injustice and speak about the suffering of our world but first and foremost we have to know of and believe in the reality of God's justice and heaven. Paul in the Second Reading tells us to "take hold of the eternal life to which you were called". In other words, you need to believe deeply in God, the promise of Resurrection and life in heaven. It is only when we begin to convince and embrace God's everlasting love and mercy in the heavenly banquet will we seek to make this world a place of true justice and care for the week and oppressed. Our Lord is telling the rich man that nothing will convince his five brothers to change their behaviour unless they believe in Him, in heaven and life everlasting. So where does this leave us? We must continue to contemplate, embrace and adore the heavenly banquet so that it may inform us as to how we should live our lives, use our resources and seek to make the world a place that Jesus is truly recognised.

At this time of the year, we normally mark the fruits of the harvest and also to raise funds for those who are less fortunate than ourselves. Here in St Patrick's, that work continues on a daily basis with the work of Open House and please think of either becoming a volunteer or contributing to it. The details are available on our website: www.stpatricksoho.org. We also have an annual appeal from Mary's Meals which will be on the 8th and 9th November. Presently this wonderful charity is feeding 4 million people on a daily basis, a considerable work of justice and God's blessing. Please keep all these activities in your prayers but above all, ask for the grace to know the reality of heaven.
