November is the month of Holy Souls. We will have the normal practice of the collection of names to be brought to the altar and Masses to be said for the holy souls. These will be placed in a dignified way underneath the Altar and will remain there throughout the month of November.

Immaculate Conception of Our Lady. This year the Feast falls on Monday 8th December and we will have prepared for the Feast by processing with Our Lady through the streets after the evening Mass of Sunday 7th December. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6pm on the Monday with the full choir, after which we will bless as is the tradition of the Church, the cribs that will mark our Advent and Christmas journey. What is very important on this evening, is that it will be exactly two years since the late Cardinal George Pell celebrated his last public Mass here at St Patrick's. It was a very happy occasion with many young people attending giving witness to how he had a very particular charism for supporting and enabling Catholics in their journey of faith. We will also be launching a "Cardinal Pell Foundation" inspired by his life to continue to support his work in the Church today. Please mark both these events in your diary.
