### Reflection

"You know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand".

This Sunday starts the Season of Advent and the Church's new year. It is a time of beginning, expectation, hope and watchfulness. That has to be contrasted with the wet and windy weather, short days and the annual bout of flu, colds and coughs. All our physical surroundings are not naturally auspicious for a new beginning and year. However, we have to remember that as a Church we are counter-cultural and we look for meaning and substance in things which are hidden, humble and small. All our physical surroundings at this time are inviting us to a spiritual emptiness and poverty for it is there that we can best prepare for the coming of the Mesiah. When we feel that true sense of being on our knees, abandoned and empty can we truly receive the Pilgrim King. This is exactly what Advent is about for it is not looking for that which is glamourous, worldly and powerful but to find Christ in the hiddenness and obscurity of our hearts.

A beautiful reminder of this is when we go on our knees as happens in some Churches to receive Holy Communion for that expresses a sense of poverty and emptiness which needs to meet the wonder and the joy that is Bethlehem.

In a strict sense this is not a season for penance as is Lent but one of joy but joy that can only be found when we strip ourselves back and ask to know only Jesus in Nazareth.

New years are always possibilities of thanksgiving to the past and resolution and intentions for the future. I have only been back for a year and it is extraordinary how God has blessed us as a Parish with so many wonderful things happening – for instance, the numbers of people coming to Mass or those asking to be received and baptised at the Easter Vigil. There is of course a financial and material cost to this about which we have to be responsible parishioners. Zygmunt Rakowicz who joined our Finance Committee in the spring has been doing sterling work putting together the fundraising appeals for the next year. We have to increase the funds for Music, Evangelisation and Open House/outreach to the poor and homeless. In addition to that the priestly and the physical surrounds of the parish need to be paid for. Zyg has prepared an overview of parish finances explaining where we are at and also our planned giving campaign for the next twelve months.

Immaculate Conception of Our Lady. This year the Feast falls on Monday 8th December and we will have prepared for the Feast by processing with Our Lady through the streets after the evening Mass of Sunday 7th December. There will be a Solemn Mass at 6pm on the Monday with the full choir, after which we will bless as is the tradition of the Church, the cribs that will mark our Advent and Christmas journey. What is very important on this evening, is that it will be exactly two years since the late Cardinal George Pell celebrated his last public Mass here at St Patrick's. It was a very happy occasion with many young people attending giving witness to how he had a very particular charism for supporting and enabling Catholics in their journey of faith. We will also be launching a "Cardinal Pell Foundation" inspired by his life to continue to support his work in the Church today. Please mark both these events in your diary.
