Every day we say the Chaplet during Adoration. The revelation of Our Lord to Saint Faustina is an invitation "to drink deeply of the mercy and forgiveness of God" so that we may better understand His love for us from the womb to eternity.

Reflection. Anon.

As a general rule, I dislike mirrors. I've never liked my own appearance, probably because I'm not comfortable with my imperfections. Mirrors have a disarming ability to highlight any and all such imperfections. They're useful when it comes to shaving, and they can help to lighten a dark corner or make a room look bigger but that's about it as far as I'm concerned. I've spent a large part of my life battling alcoholic addiction. Like a lot of addicts, my addiction was rooted in a self-loathing and shame. Shame can often come from early childhood. Shame is a belief about self; guilt is a belief about one's actions based around one's sense of right and wrong. Guilt says I have done something bad; shame tells me I am bad. Recovering addicts rarely enjoy looking at the person who stares back from the mirror.

Our lifelong challenge is to grow - grow in knowledge of self and grow in knowledge of God. Last weekend, Jesus embarked on his public ministry. His years of peaceful quietude are over, and, today, he continues that ministry: *This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen..* The ball has been set in motion: there is no turning back. Twenty or so years later Paul would pen today's second reading: *Now we are seeing a dim reflection in a mirror; but then we shall be seeing him face to face...* We are being drawn inexorably to our meeting with the God of Love who will look us in the eye. His gaze will effectively be the truest of mirrors; it will reflect with crystal clear accuracy. He will remind us of the things we have done wrong (though in that moment of clarity I will not need any reminder, for we shall see as never before). He may condemn our actions, but He will not say that we are bad. He is the God of love and as Paul reminds us: *Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous....it is always ready to excuse, to trust and to hope and to endure whatever comes.*

You may loathe mirrors; you may like mirrors. There is one mirror we cannot avoid. It is that moment when we meet God, *face to face* but there is no need to fear because *Love is always patient and kind.*
