## Reflection – Anon.

~~~~~

I live in a rented very old property that continually creaks and groans. Its noises are strangely comforting. The location is beautiful, set in the foothills of the Pennines. Trees are randomly scattered, there are dry stone-walls in various states of disrepair and sheep. Lots of sheep. Its 4.45 am, the sky is bright orange and I'm typing this with the dawn chorus in full swing – a cacophony of birdsong. In such a setting senses are heightened and exaggerated and my awareness of self cannot help but be intensified. I am aware of my heartbeat, and my breathing. I cannot hear my blood sloshing around in my body, but I know that, courtesy of the air that I breathe and the beat of that heart, my organs and tissue are being fed and nourished with little conscious effort on my part. The readings for this weekend have a heavy emphasis on sound and breath. The disciples *suddenly heard what sounded like a powerful wind* and: *After saying this, he breathed on them and said: Receive the Holy Spirit.* Throughout the whole of the Bible, we read of the breath of God. In Genesis, God's spirit hovered over the deep, God breathed on the rib he had taken from Adam's side and in so doing breathed life into it and created Eve. In the first Book of Kings Elijah encounters God in the sound of a gentle breeze. In truth I know that being Christian in responding to the challenges around me is impossible if I were left to my own devices. My attempts at a Christian response are only possible precisely because God, in the person of Jesus Christ, has breathed over me. I do not need to hear that breath – I just need to feel it. I don't hear it in the same way that my ear hears the birdsong or the animals that surround me, but I can feel it in much the same way I can feel the energy of every living thing and person that comes into my orbit. We are surrounded by life, life that has God as its source. God has touched our lives. On that first Pentecost, the disciples were inspired to preach following the sound of the wind that filled their senses. They were able to preach, long after the sound had dissipated. Our glimpses of God's Spirit may be fleeting and momentary, but their effects are far reaching. And for that, we are profoundly grateful.
