## Reflection – Anon.

“Events, dear boy, events” has long been attributed to Harold Macmillan, a former Prime Minister, though there is scant documentary evidence that he actually uttered those words over 60 years ago. The phrase speaks of the unpredictability of life. I was reminded of these very words yesterday on reading that the birth rate in the West is at its lowest for 50 years. Apparently, ‘modern’ thinking is that it’s not a good idea to bring new life into a world riddled by rampant inequality, everlasting war and soaring heat. Today we celebrate, whilst still not fully understanding, the mystery of The Trinity. One God, three persons – not three Gods, but One God and three Persons, each distinct and co-existing in a perfect union of perfect Love. Difficult though it is to comprehend, we believe in One God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit, three distinct persons one eternal God. The thought we need to carry with us this weekend is that of a **union of perfect love**.

What does it mean to be in a **union of perfect love**? Paul tells us in our second reading. No frills, no flowery language here. *“Be united, live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with the holy kiss. . . . The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all”*. This is what it means to be in a **union of perfect love**. When we live in peace, the God of love and peace will follow. The Sign of peace at Mass is not an empty gesture. It is an expression of our desire to live in a state where we experience a union of perfect love with everyone and everything around us – and this is why we do all in our power to respect this plan which is not ours to keep – just ours to care for, and to hand on. In his discourse with Nicodemus, Jesus advises: *God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life*. The obligation on us is to imitate that depth of love, to become exhausted not from labour– but from the act of total unconditional love. When the world can love through our differences, then we really do become like Him.
