Every day we say the Chaplet during Adoration. The revelation of Our Lord to Saint Faustina is an invitation "to drink deeply of the mercy and forgiveness of God" so that we may better understand His love for us from the womb to eternity.

Every first Sunday we sing the Chaplet.

## *Reflection*

**“If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.”**

I believe I can say with reasonable confidence that when I first came to the Parish many years back there were no processions in the streets for the great feast of Corpus Christi. Now there are many which is something to thank God for. There is no way of knowing that when our Lord walks the streets not only are they reclaimed for Him, but also He speaks directly to hearts in a way that we will never fully understand until heaven. As we process this Sunday, there will be many that we will pass who will be carrying burdens, pain and anxiety. All we know and believe is it somehow the Lord wants to enter every heart and change them into a heart of tenderness and compassion. Prayers of intention and intercession will be uttered and somehow the Lord will bring about His kingdom.

In today's Gospel, there were many who surrounded Jesus who did not accept his teaching on his Eucharist and they left Him. That is the same for us today before it requires not just the act of faith but also the gift of faith. We must pray all of us for those who may be uncertain or somewhat sceptical and ask that their hearts will be changed. As we walk with Our Lord, let us pray in the way that we have never prayed asking for the conversion of heart and mind. This is also a time of Thanksgiving for us as a Parish. Last Saturday we welcomed Bishop Erik Varden and Father Jacques Philippe for our annual summit. We must have received almost 300 people in the Parish during the day who came away strengthened and full of joy and love. What a wonderful day it was and so much was done by many people. Can I take this opportunity in thanking all our volunteers, stewards and other helpers who gave their time so generously. It made the Parish a real place of welcome for the many who came. So much happened behind the scenes and I know that the Lord was working. May the day and its fruits continue to help support and sustain us in our journey of faith..

In this month of June, we celebrate the Sacred heart of Jesus, it is always a very special time when we drink deeply of his love and tenderness. May many come to the Church in these days and experience that love. United in Jesus and Mary. **Father Alexander.**
