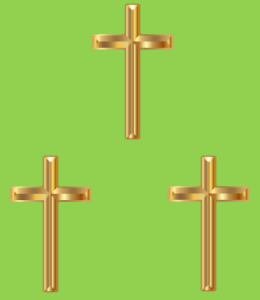

Divine Mercy Chaplet Daily at 3pm

Every day we say the Chaplet during Adoration. The revelation of Our Lord to Saint Faustina is an invitation "to drink deeply of the mercy and forgiveness of God" so that we may better understand His love for us from the womb to eternity.

Every first Sunday we sing the Chaplet.

Reflection

“When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them....”

I share this reflection on the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus looking towards this Sunday's Gospel and there is a great resonance between the two. The Sacred Heart speaks to us of the tenderness, mercy and love that is at the very centre of all that Jesus speaks of and makes present. The Feast of the Sacred Heart was given to us by the Lord at a time when the Church was full of guilt, judgement and lack of love and it came as a clarion call to make the Gospel more real and present in people's lives. Some 100 years later in 1789, France which had received the Revelation of the Sacred Heart, burst into flames, full of anger, bitterness, division and murder. The French people and many others had lost complete sight of what it means to be alive in Jesus. Today's Gospel speaks of the pain in the heart of Jesus as He sees the people in front of Him, looking "harassed and helpless". He reaches out to them by way of saying "pray for more shepherds" and then calls His Disciples to go amongst the people. It is a mission of cleansing, healing and deliverance. Many at this time of the year are getting ready to go to Lourdes which is the embodiment of this journey. Why not, this weekend, reach out in your hearts and prayer to someone who is feeling lost and abandoned and bring them into the Heart of Jesus. As you come into the Church at the front on the right-hand side, you will see our magnificent statue of the Sacred Heart where Jesus proclaims "I am gentle and humble of heart".

We may be living in a different world from 18th Century France but the temptations to aggression, division, violence and judgmentalism are as present as ever. In this month of June dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, let us ask for the grace to respond once again to this beautiful invitation to meet and proclaim the tenderness and mercy of His Sacred Heart.
