


10TH ANNUAL POKER RUN AND CAR SHOW

In May, staff and I took a group of 18 individuals in service and staff on our annual agency 4-day camping trip. This year the camping trip was in the Salida area. The group took a ½ day rafting trip down Brown's Canyon on the upper Arkansas River between Buena Vista and Salida. Fortunately, none of the individuals nor staff ended up in the river. Somehow though, our guide fell into the water within the first 10 minutes of the start of our trip! Still not sure how that happened?? Lol. Nonetheless, the group of 18 HAPPY CAMPERS had a blast and finished the rest of our camping

trip with various activities and a lot of s'mores! Anytime that I go on an overnight trip with individuals, I provide the same supports that we expect of our Direct Support Professionals (DSP). It gives me the chance to walk in their shoes and to interact 1-on- 1 with the individuals in service and our very talented DSP's. We truly have some incredible staff working at IF!

Speaking of our staff, we finished 2024 with a good employee turnover ratio of 29.2%. In 2022 (no recent numbers available), the Colorado statewide turnover ratio was 49%. And the National turnover ratio for DSP's was 40.9% in 2022. (Source: State of the Workforce-IDD.HCPF At a Glance). Our employee turnover ratio continues to trend downward as we implemented a new employee minimum wage of \$17.00/hr. for all starting full-time & part-time positions. We are completely committed to increasing our employee retention and keeping employees longer in a very challenging field. As always, we are looking for caring people to become a Host Home Provider (HHP). As a HHP, you provide adult foster care in your home and are paid approximately \$23,765 - \$57,987. Fiscal Year '25 Close and FY '26 Kickoff

Our team is wrapping up Fiscal Year '25 with precision, finalizing all allocations and ensuring that our ledgers accurately reflect year-end performance. Simultaneously, we've stood up the foundational processes for Fiscal Year 26, from chart-of-accounts updates to system configurations. We hope that early engagement with stakeholders will set us on track for a seamless transition into the new fiscal year.

Audit Preparations Underway

Our annual audit is on the horizon, and we've already begun assembling documentation, mapping key controls, and scheduling walkthroughs with our external auditors. By frontloading this work now, we aim to minimize surprises and streamline audit fieldwork later this fall.

Budget Data Collection in Progress

With focus on strategic priorities in FY 26, we've launched our budget-data drive: consolidating departmental forecasts, capital requests, and upcoming plans. Each department director has completed budget templates by established deadlines, and our financial analysis will begin to answer questions and validate assumptions. Our goal is to have a preliminary draft ready for executive review by early-August.

Exploring Next-Generation Financial Software

Microsoft Great Plains has served us well, but with its 2029 sunset looming, we're evaluating modern ERP solutions that offer enhanced analytics, cloud-native deployment, and tighter workflow integration. The team is gathering business requirements, benchmarking vendor offerings, and preparing a total-cost-of-ownership analysis. In the coming months, demos will continue, with an eye toward identifying a partner by the end of Q2 FY 26.

As we juggle close-out tasks, audit prep, budget planning, and software evaluation, our focus remains for accuracy, compliance, and continuous improvement. Thank you to each team member making contributions and valuable insights. Stay tuned for more updates as we navigate a busy—but exciting—season ahead!
