Le Cap Ferret Through the ages A cabin in nature The mexican silver coast



LE CAP FERRET



Cap Ferret is the most recent formation on the Gascon coast with a geological history which dates back nearly 3,000 years. As is often the case in the region, its soil contains a significant layer of sandstone, formed by quartz cementation with iron hydroxides and organic matter. This process results in iron-rich groundwater - a phenomenon that explains the name given to the tip of the peninsula: Lo Cap Herret in Gascon or "the iron head". Over time, geographers spelt it Cap Horet and Cap Herret, before settling on Cap Ferret.

Dune forests dominate Cap Ferret, covering three-quarters of the peninsula. These forests date back to the early 19th century, when the French engineer Nicolas Brémontier planted pine trees to stabilise the dunes and drain the marshes. They cover almost 7,000 hectares and are home to numerous plant and animal species.

Lège, Claouey, Le Canon, L'Herbe, La Vigne: the Lège-Cap-Ferret peninsula is made up of 10 villages. With 25 km of coastline, it lies between Arcachon Bay and the Atlantic Ocean. With beaches on both sides of its coastline, it really does have something for everyone and every occasion.

THROUGH THE AGES


In the 19th century, a few fishermen dropped anchor at various points along the peninsula; at the time, the southernmost point was the only area to be (temporarily) occupied. Fishermen docked here in their pinnaces, the flat- bottomed boats typical of Arcachon Bay, to catch fish, and they built a few makeshift huts on the beaches.

By 1857, there were a dozen huts on the beaches close to the recently built lighthouse. In the second half of the 19th century, a few government officials, customs officers, lighthouse keepers and forest wardens responsible for seeding the dunes, joined these fishermen, most of whom came from ports across the bay. It was also during this period, under Napoleon III, that oyster farming became increasingly widespread and the first oyster hut concessions were granted.

Over time, some of these temporary residents settled permanently, gradually creating the string of villages dotted along the peninsula that we're familiar with today. At the beginning of the 20th century, the architect Le Corbusier, the playwright Jean Anouilh and the painter and poet Jean Cocteau began to holiday in Cap Ferret, captivated by its idyllic landscapes and unspoilt charm. These trailblazers certainly knew what they were doing. Over the years, this seaside resort developed gradually, driven by well-known figures, including the businessman Benoît Bartherotte, who were committed to protecting the peninsula from the risks of urban sprawl. Cap Ferret went on to become one of the most popular luxury destinations for holidaymakers in search of a unique natural setting, delicious food and drink and a laid-back lifestyle. This place is a marvel and it is everyone's responsibility to do their utmost to safeguard it, especially now that erosion has become a reality. It's a haven that must be protected.







Peninsula, Cap Ferret

Le Cœur du Ferret, like all the properties in the Iconic House Collection, is available to rent in its entirety. It features seven monochrome bedrooms, including a family suite with a children's room, and at the far end of the garden, intended to preserve and nurture thriving native flora, is the "cabanon", a charming and secluded suite with its own private terrace. Inside, a spacious living room and open kitchen are the heart of the home. Outdoors, a heated swimming pool and large terraces, an outdoor cinema and a wellness area complete the experience (outdoor sauna, fitness equipment...).

"When we envisioned the project, we quickly drew parallels between the property and Mexico. First, because it's a house that can be lived in just as much indoors as outdoors - with its numerous terraces, lush garden, furnished corners, and outdoor showers... Also, because the location and Frédéric Thet's initial ideas quite naturally led us to imagine a world of haciendas, with their architecture centred around the pool, but also cabanas nestled in the jungle and the beach villas of Baja California. 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


THE MEXICAN SILVER COAST

The decor explores a Franco-Mexican connection, cultivating a unique and compelling identity. A conversation between two cultures, blending contemporary aesthetics with traditional elements, locality with exoticism, vibrancy with lightness. A cocoon of eclecticism and diverse influences, from Frida Khalo to Mexican architect Luis Barragán.

For the interior design, the brothers who co-founded Iconic House enlisted the Jaune Architecture tandem. Marine Delaloy and Paula Alvarez de Toledo - one honed her craft at Studio KO and the other under Joseph Dirand - were selected as one of the top 100 designers of 2023 by the renowned AD magazine (AD 100). The duo have already established their reputation across the Atlantic with a superb project in La Paz, Mexico, for the Baja Club hotel - forging strong ties with the country.

Tdesign architecture was founded in Paris in 2008 by architect Frédéric Thet. Born in Bordeaux, and a graduate of the École d'Architecture Paris-la-Seine, it was during his work on large architectural projects that he developed a strong theoretical approach to architecture, evolving through numerous competitions and personal projects, which he passionately injects his own sensibility into.

Tdesign is more of a method than an aesthetic. Drawing inspiration from fields beyond architecture - such as contemporary art, design, graphics, advertising, photography, landscape, sociology and agriculture - the agency's work focuses on cultivating a sensitive, poetic and always innovative response, after analysing and respecting the context.

Motivated by a sense of political and territorial responsibility, the environmental impact of its projects is at the heart of the agency's concerns. Steadily seeking solutions that promote sustainable development, Tdesign has surrounded itself with the best local consultants who share this commitment.

While their approach remains innovative and contemporary, their architectural projects are almost always inspired by their travels, geared towards offering warmth, conviviality and a sense of escape. This results in minimalist yet welcoming designs, where raw materials such as natural or charred wood, concrete, terracotta, metal and vegetation take pride of place, maximising light circulation through interlocking volumes that reveal the richness of each space.

Feeling the need to reposition her creativity and vision of "art de vivre" of tomorrow at the very heart of her work, she founded her creative office in 2021 with a team of artistic directors, interior architects and art curators.

In this, Joséphine Fossey returns to the precept of "Gesamtkunstwerk" (total work of Art) dear to the Art & Craft or Art Deco movements that guide her approach; a creative process where different art forms are combined to create a single cohesive whole. An aesthetic journey, a complete artistic creation which, through researches and human adventures, embraces visuals, experience and meaning.






Redfield & Dattner is a Parisian studio founded by Austin Redfield Tondini and Violette Bonis Charancle Dattner. Theirs is a rare artistic fusion, a world where the history of classical and decorative painting meets pictorial and decorative methods, from gilding to marble decoration, reinterpreted in incredible frescoes.

For this project, the Redfield & Dattner duo collaborated with Alexia Reveleau, a painter originally from Cap Ferret, to create a hand-painted fresco. The work depicts the meeting of André Lhote and Mexican painter Diego Rivera, evoking life on the Arcachon Bay in 1918 in a gentle, dreamlike way. A monochrome fresco revealing different stages of the day - morning, afternoon, evening and night at Cap-Ferret. It shows fishermen on pinnaces, guitarists on the beach, flourishing vegetation and the ever-changing light that transforms nature throughout he day.









OHLA STUDIO is a Mexican design studio founded in 2017 by Giulia Zink and Mat Trumbull. The studio works in conjunction with artisans rooted in centuries of craftsmanship. They deliver unique, authentic pieces that feel both familiar and new.

For this home, they designed a magnificent custom-made fireplace, one of the living room's defining features. With its impressive height, it is unquestionably one of the most remarkable elements of the space. A pictorial narrative takes shape, inviting us to imagine the following scene: a Mexican family who once lived in the Iconic House cabin, leaving behind their own memories. The stone sourced specially from Mexico, is engraved with patterns that evoke Mexican culture and life in Cap-Ferret, much like a patchwork of shared histories and connections. The chosen Pink Cantera stone, known for its role in Mexican architecture, serves as the canvas for these engravings, reminiscent of ex-votos, carving out a rich dialogue through the following imagery: oyster parks/agave chaparral, pine forests/opuntia leaves, traditional pinnaces/ fishing, eagle/snake, ancient ruins/lighthouse...


Born in 1986 and based in Mexico, Joel Escalona's work explores the power of objects to transcend their function. Focusing on the abstraction of form and sensation, his creations are designed to evoke the nuances of sensation - the subtle shifts in feeling that often go unnoticed in the rush of everyday life. His creations invite both subtle and profound experiences of tranquility, serenity, and sometimes, tension. Joel finds beauty in imperfection. For him, perfection is not about flawless symmetry or rigid structure, but the natural uniqueness found in incomplete, organic forms. "True beauty lies in the spaces between perfection and imperfection." His designs reflect the natural world and the unpredictability of life, giving each piece its own unique presence.

In a world filled with noise and chaos, Escalona's sculptures offer a moment of calm and tranquility, encouraging viewers to bask in their serenity, to slow down and appreciate the beauty of nature, wood, and art.



Marguerite began painting on pieces of wood at the age of 3. While she didn't go to museums as a child, it was in books that Marguerite found her inspiration. The Jungle Book, with its endearing hero Mowgli, and the works of Serge Poliakoff (1900-1969), the Russian-born French abstract painter she admires for his use of materials and evocative power, both shaped her artistic vision.

Ever since she was a little girl, Marguerite has been collecting bits of wood from the garden and the white sandy beach at the end of the terrace of her family home in Cap-Ferret (Gironde). This is where she grew up, in a vast wooden "cabin" built on the Arcachon Bay, in the heart of the "44 hectares" district.

Her sister Marion Bartherotte, also an artist deeply inspired by the region, has created a painting that evokes the Ocean and three colorful vases displayed in the house.





Romain Laprade is a French photographer whose work has, in just a few years, become a trademark of subtle and intriguing visual storytelling. His distinctive style transforms mundane details into iconic images, immortalising lines and surfaces through a unique photographic language often drawn from modernist architecture. Seemingly ordinary details, minimalist compositions, and striking plays of light define his work; a collection of photographs from the past five years that alone have the power to offer a poetic and refined lens on the world. ATELIER LAISSEZ PASSER



Laissez Passer, a non-profit association (under France's 1901 law), is a collective of young artisans, architects and designers who pool their expertise in pursuit of a shared ideal: reclaiming material waste from Marseille's industrial port (GPMM). These salvaged materials are repurposed to create furniture and scenographic installations.

The workshop is located at the heart of the Grand Port Maritime, on the Digue du Large near the Arenc bridge. We carry out projects that combine craftsmanship and upcycling for private clients, local authorities, and artistic initiatives.

Laissez Passer also places strong emphasis on the social and educational aspects of its mission. From professional integration through training internships to the organization of outdoor construction workshops, our association remains human-sized and people-centered.

Based in Marseille, its activities extend across the city and the wider Provence region.

For Le Cœur du Ferret, they created the large wooden dining table, which incorporates integrated game boards.

1 lime

1/2 bunch chopped dill

12 Cap-Ferret oysters

5 cl olive oil

PREPARATION:

Apple and Lemon Julienne

- 1. Cut apple into quarters, remove seeds
- 2. Finely julienne apple (like matchsticks)
- 3. Lightly toss apple with lemon juice

Cap-Ferret oyster tartar

- 1. Open oysters
- 2. Coarsely chop 8 well-drained oysters (reserve
- 4 whole oysters for oyster butter)
- 3. Season with olive oil, lime zest, soy sauce and finely chopped chives

Oyster butter

- 1. Blend softened butter and remaining 4 oysters, add chopped dill
- 2. Cut the sliced bread into large sticks, then spread with the oyster butter and toast

- 1. Arrange the toasted bread with the oyster butter on a plate, followed by the oyster tartar.
