Council of Nicea – Outcome



The First Council of Nicea that declared the divinity of Christ and condemned the erroneous beliefs of Arius was a result of political struggles raging throughout the Roman Empire. The Emperor Constantine I dealt with this by unifying the Empire and bringing about more political stability. After exploring the historical circumstances, we shall look at the Council's outcome in the form of the Creed that we pray during the liturgy on Sundays. The last session will then try to capture the development that followed its reception (9th November).

Fr Anthony Rosso is the parish priest of Our Lady & St Joseph in Keighley since the summer of 2020. Born and raised in the U.S., he moved to Canada to attend University and then made the decision to become a priest. He was sent to the Venerable English College in Rome for the Diocese of Leeds, in beautiful Yorkshire, and studied at both the Gregorian and Angelicum Universities.

Father Tony served as assistant priest at parishes in Huddersfield and Bradford (as well as serving as Catholic chaplain to the Bradford hospital trust) before being sent by his bishop to be the parish priest of Our Lady & St Joseph in Haworth and Keighley.
