

COMMUNITY

Living out Christ's love and teachings, our students continue to display a deep sense of compassion and service to our community. All WCS students, preschool through high school, are taught the importance of serving others and modeling God's love. Students participate in a wide variety of charitable projects throughout the year that benefit both our local community as well as poverty-stricken areas around the world.

Whether volunteering at local non-profits, working on chores at home to raise money to purchase Christmas gifts for local children in need, or making cookies for the local fire departments, these acts of service help students cultivate empathy and develop leadership skills while positively impacting the lives of others.

Some of the charitable projects WCS students and families have been involved in so far this school year include:

- WCS Lady Stars Volleyball team volunteered at the Wichita Falls Area Food Bank in August.
- Each October, WCS Preschoolers empty their piggy banks to support local charities like Sonshine House and Hospice.
- WCS Cheerleaders decorated and filled cookie boxes that were delivered to all eight Wichita Falls fire stations in November.
- WCS students, PCE, and families raised money to buy Christmas gifts for local children through Wichita Falls Fire Department's Operation Santa toy drive.

This year WCS launched an initiative called **Service Fridays**. Rooted in Matthew 5:41, "If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two," this initiative encourages students to serve others wholeheartedly. Service Fridays are monthly volunteer outings where a group of high school students, who are overseen by the senior B.U.D.S. and accompanied by a faculty member, serve at local non-profit organizations.





So far this year, our high school students have supported the following non-profits through the Service Fridays program:


