Role Purpose

The Peer Aid Trainer is responsible for delivering high-quality, trauma-informed and lived-experience-led training across Betknowmore UK's Peer Aid programmes.

Working closely with the Peer Aid Training Programmes Manager, the Trainer will play a key role in the consistent delivery, quality assurance, and continuous improvement of training for Peer Supporters and volunteers.

You will ensure learners are equipped with the skills, knowledge, boundaries, and confidence to deliver safe, effective, and empathetic peer support to individuals affected by gambling harm.

The post holder will contribute to maintaining training standards, safeguarding practices, and programme integrity, while supporting the development of innovative and co-produced training approaches aligned with organisational priorities.

- Deliver all Betknowmore UK Peer Support Training Programmes in line with Betknowmore UK's core curriculum and quality standards.
- Facilitate engaging, inclusive, and trauma-informed training sessions for Peer Supporters and volunteers.
- Deliver both face-to-face and online training sessions as required.
- Adapt delivery style and materials to meet the needs of diverse learner groups while maintaining programme integrity.
- Support learners to understand boundaries, safeguarding responsibilities, and peer support principles.
- Following delivery, complete marking requirements of the learners work.
- Support in the training and engagement of the associate trainers

Lived Experience & Co-production

- Support the meaningful involvement of Experts by Experience (EbEs) in training delivery.
- Promote and embed lived experience perspectives throughout all training sessions.
- Provide appropriate support and check-ins for EbEs involved in training delivery.
- Contribute to co-produced development of training materials and learning resources.

Quality, Safeguarding & Compliance

- Ensure safeguarding principles are embedded throughout all training delivery.
- Follow organisational policies, procedures, and safeguarding reporting pathways at all times.
- Maintain accurate training records, attendance, and learner engagement data in line with GDPR requirements.

- Commitment to equality, diversity, inclusion, and trauma-informed practice.
- Willingness to travel across the UK, including occasional overnight stays.
