A LAST-MINUTE STABILIZATION

A young uninsured patient arrived at Phoenixville Hospital's ER with severe abdominal pain and a blood sugar over 500. After stabilization, he was referred to Phoenixville Free Clinic.

His HbA1C was 15.4 — dangerously high. Our team started him on affordable medications, provided a glucose monitor, offered nutrition guidance, and connected him with partners for diabetes coaching and a vision exam.

Within two months, his HbA1C dropped to 7.4; four months later, to 5.8. Through consistent labs — monitoring his sodium, kidneys, and liver — we've been able to guide him toward stability and a healthier future.



NORMAL FATIGUE... OR FAR WORSE?

A woman in her 40s came to Phoenixville Free Clinic with fatigue, weakness, and pain in her legs after long hours working in retail. Her physical exam appeared normal, but lab tests showed dangerously low calcium and vitamin D levels and an elevated parathyroid hormone — leading to a diagnosis of osteomalacia.

She began high-dose vitamin D and calcium supplements with regular lab monitoring to restore healthy levels. With continued care, her strength, energy, and overall quality of life have greatly improved.



SAVED FROM HEART FAILURE

Another patient initially came in for routine bloodwork, feeling fine and expecting an ordinary visit. Even though she only requested bloodwork, one of our providers took the time to offer a full checkup, and while listening to her heart, she detected a murmur. Understanding the potential severity, she conducted additional tests and referred her to our hospital partner, Paoli Hospital, for further evaluation. The results were life-changing: she needed two stents to prevent a serious heart event.

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
