Intensive Family Support Service

Keeping families together with practical education and support for parents

What is the Intensive Family Support Service?

Wanslea's IntensiveFamily Support Service (IFSS) provides in home support to families who are at risk of child protection intervention or who require support to reunify children back to their care.

Our service is designed to help you maintain your children's safety while ensuring they stay connected to their family, community and culture.

Where we operate

The Intensive Family Support Service will be available for families in Midland and surrounds starting 1 December 2025.



How we help

We have Karlup's Aboriginal Cultural Lead and Family Support Worker, who will be available to be a part of your team. They will work with you to build upon your strengths to keep your family together.

We will seek to fully understand your circumstances and identify your strengths before recommending strategies and resources to address child protection concerns.

By collaborating with your support team, you can increase the safety of your home and take action to keep your family together.



How to apply

- **1.Understand your eligibility:** The service is for families who are currently working with the Department of Communities who need help to improve their family's wellbeing and safety.
- 2. Request a referral: If you feel like you, or someone you are working with could benefit from this service, please contact the family's case manager at the Department of Communities or Wanslea's Midland office to discuss the possibility of a referral.
- **3. Get support:** If you are referred to us via the Department of Communities, you'll be fully supported by our Case Worker to work towards your goals and family reunification, keeping your children safe in your home.
