around the traps 🚱

It's always a nice feeling when you see the first wattles of the season flowering which gives us hope that spring isn't too far away. We are almost in August and speaking to numerous locals, they can't remember the last winter we had being this wet. We had chalked up totals of 80mm for the month of July with the moisture not slowing down at all this week. The week ahead looks bleak to say the least, more rain, especially on the weekend, potential snow falls and not much sun. The country is extremely wet, and it didn't take much rain to make our creeks and rivers run, spring is shaping up nicely.

Australia has gone and bowed down to the USA because they are now stating that they have made a scientific decision to lift the ban on imported beef from the USA into Australia. Anyone in the livestock game knows that the cost beef in the USA is extremely dear and not much would be heading to our shores, but it raises a whole new biosecurity threat for our industry. The problem with US beef is that they can't guarantee its origin as plenty of beef that is killed in the USA, isn't grown in the USA. Mexican beef producers sell plenty of cattle into the US beef feedlot system and their biosecurity is terrible. Australia has just opened the door to another biosecurity threat to our beef industry which I think is ludicrous considering this will be used by our government as a bargaining tool with Trump, or so they think. To put our beef industry in jeopardy is completely wrong and I hope the government has scientific insurance if one of these nasty diseases or parasites come into our country and brings the beef industry to its knees, just like the flesh-eating parasite that Mexican cattle producers are dealing with now.

I believe that Australia has got this whole new potential super tax completely wrong considering what we are seeing in the USA right now. Trump has announced he will eliminate estate tax for family farms and small business. The reason he has done this is to stop the foreclosures that forced generations of farmers to sell their land because of these taxes and yes, if this unrealised capital gain tax eventuates in Australia, we will find ourselves with the same problem. Who will be able to afford these extra taxes when the average age of our farmers is in their sixties. We need to be encouraging family farms to continue, to grow and to have younger people wanting to continue farming.

I've been looking at the current US beef market and this value will blow you away with 460kg feeder steers making \$5350 Australian, that's each! Our Angus feeder steers have just nudged north of \$5/ kg so that's around \$2300. They keep telling us that our prices have a way to go yet but those values are insane and maybe given the demand for Australian beef we might just see that \$7/kg for feeder steers that an industry expert was predicting.

A new TRLX lamb record was set by a local producer when extra heavy XB lambs off the Tia Diggings Road topped at \$435 on Monday. We are seeing extraordinary results for district lamb producers with a producer just last week killing lambs to a top of \$478.80, that's a 41.60kg dressed lamb and the dearest I've heard.

Finally, we have seen a widespread rain band over the last week drop rain in the south to much needed drought areas, no it's not enough to break the drought but it's a start which could be a turning point. Markets responded immediately with fat cows hitting 450c/ kg, heavy bullocks to 475c/kg and light restocking weaner steers yesterday making 600c/kg. A bull in western Victoria Livestock Exchange made \$5884 for a 1435kg cull bull which implies it would be an excellent time to trade in your old bulls for new genetics, this upcoming bull sale season.

Permanent variation to Bush **Fire Danger Period**

The NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS) New England Zone has announced a permanent variation to the starting date of the Bushfire Danger Period.

Acting District Manager, Inspector Matthew McKean has confirmed that the new Bushfire Danger Period will now commence from 1 September 2025.

Inspector McKean explained that this permanent variation for the Armidale, Walcha and Uralla Local Government Areas (LGAs) will see the Bushfire Danger Period run from 1 September through to 31 March moving forward. Fire Permits to burn and notifications to neighbours and RFS will remain the same as in previous years.

"Fire Permits to burn are a free service provided by the RFS and can be obtained by visiting the RFS website at www.rfs.nsw.gov.au and clicking on the Apply, Notify, Enquire link on the front page of the website.'

"Once the permit is issued, the permit holder will need to lodge their notification through the RFS website by again clicking on the Apply, Notify, Enquire link and selecting Notify of your planned burn.'

"Additionally, permit holders can contact their local Fire Permit Officer directly for a paper permit or by contacting the New England Fire Control Centre on 6771 7700 between 8.30am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday and we can put you in touch with your Brigade Fire Permit Officer", Inspector McKean said.





garden clippings



From Walcha Garden Club

Whoever declares there is no colour in a winter Walcha garden is in for a big surprise! Now that we are past the winter solstice and the days are getting longer there is some colour coming into our gardens. Our national emblem, the wattle, is certainly starting to show plenty of blooms. Along Oxley Drive there are Apsley and Cootamundra wattles either in bloom or just beginning to bloom. The Cootamundra wattle variety is Acacia baileyana purpurea (grey foliage with a new growth of purple leaves). They both add warmth to an otherwise wintry look. Grevilleas are also putting on a great display in late winter. Especially the ground cover varieties. Native birds really do enjoy their flowers as they are laden with nectar.

Bulbs are now starting to raise their pretty heads from the ground including jonquils and daffodils. Lots of annuals are also starting to put on a happy display too. Bulbs in pots are usually the first to flower followed annuals such as Iceland poppies, primulas, heart ease, violas, pansies, daphne and hellebores. We must not forget the camellias too. Sasanqua camellia hedges are nearing the end of their display. A great time to prune them back and give them their early spring dose of fertiliser before they start their growing season. Troforte M and Searles are certainly good quality fertilisers that are specifically made for your camellias.

An interesting addition to any garden is an evergreen shrub called Garrya or silk tassel bush. It requires water to establish then it can survive quite well with seasonal rain. Its standout appeal is its beautiful flowers(catkins) which drape down in late winter and early spring. Some catkins can drape 50cm.

Witch hazel is a wonderful deciduous shrub in a winter garden. It has yellow blooms along its bare branches in early spring. Winter flowering apricot trees are very pretty this time of year. The weeping form is probably the best variety for a feature tree.

For anyone who has a vegetable garden, a hot house or somewhere to create protection from frost, then you can start to sow seeds such as snow peas, broccoli, beetroot, broad beans and spinach. This will allow your seedlings to be mature enough by early spring so you can transplant into garden beds. Onions and garlic can be planted now and be ready for harvest by late in the year. Potatoes can also be planted in pots but must be kept in a well-protected area with lots of mulch to slow their growth until the weather warms up. Herbs could be sown into mini hothouses using plastic milk cartons. Cut the bottom of the milk bottle off to place them over your pots. Take the lid off the carton during the day to allow ventilation.





Local lamb record

With a new TRLX lamb record being set by a local producer on Monday when extra heavy XB lambs off the Tia Diggings Road topped at \$435, we thought we would take a look back at lamb marketing in days gone by around Walcha.

At these prices, it would be interesting if someone could calculate for *The Advocate* the price a train load of lambs would make!

The below excerpt is from Bob Walsh's book, More Walcha Stories:

A few more Yarns from the Early Days Tim Fenwicke's Recollections

Tim recalled that in 1961 Geoff Taylor invited John "Stainless" Steel to come to Walcha to purchase lambs for McPherson Bros at Homebush in Sydney. Over a period of seven days enough lambs were purchased locally to make up a trainload. These lambs were then delivered to Walcha Road railway station by both the Walcha Carrying Company and L.P. Cross & Co. Geoff and Tim then loaded the lambs into railway sheep vans. They also had to shunt each of the sheep vans into the loading position. Over a period several train loads of lambs were sent by train to McPherson Bros. at Homebush. "Stainless" Steel continued to purchase lambs from Walcha for many years.

Cattle were sold at the Walcha Showground until the Walcha Associated Agents built their cattle yards on the western side of town. The cattle were sold in a round yard at the Showground with buyers, agents and others standing around, sometimes with a spirited beast clearing the yard of interested spectators.

Some cattle would arrive at the yards and whichever was there would get the sale, a sort of Johnny on the spot system. Dan Hoad from Nash and Crossman almost always was the agent who arrived earliest at the yards.
