Well the weekend weather certainly caught us all by surprise. As we entered August most were hoping that spring is just around the corner, I myself thought it was too wet for the snow to settle but settle it did! Whilst the snow is a wonderful sight and our social media pages were filled with stunning images, the harsh reality hit quickly, with power still out in some areas and roads cut off. Saturday quickly went from stunning to chaos. The true cost of the snow event is yet to be determined with a monumental clean up effort ahead with vast amounts of trees and infrastructure crumbling under the surprising weight of the snow. I'm sure stock losses have occurred with producers lambing and calving.

A big thanks must go to all those that lent a helping hand with many travellers stuck, I have heard plenty of stories of people sleeping on pub floors and the like. Essential Energy have a big job ahead of them fixing damaged lines and restoring power in less than ideal conditions. Also the local council clean up crew have swiftly sprung into action removing debris and alike.

On the back of last week's announcement that Australia has "bowed down" to America's threats and opened up our doors to their beef, another blow to our biosecurity has occurred with the DPI announcing 165 job cuts. This includes at least 15 roles in the biosecurity team, and closure of the critical Wollongbar environmental lab. With testing now to be shifted to Wagga questions are being asked of the limited capacity there. If we are to see an outbreak we will be wishing we had those men and women back on the front line. I'm sure these decisions are well thought out by smarter people than myself but I struggle to see the benefits long term.

We have once again seen improvements in all livestock markets over the past week. With the cow market leading the charge, pushing past \$4.50 per kg live weight in Tamworth this week. Those cows returned a value of over \$3000. I feel we have misunderstood the actual cow herd in Australia and will see supply tighten in the grinding beef sector in coming months, particularly with the rise in restocker prices.

A largely reduced yarding at Tamworth saw a jump in all categories this week. No records were set in the lamb sale however last week's record setter had a good day by all accounts. Dubbo holds the trophy at least at the time of writing with the best of their lambs selling for \$477.20, these lambs sold to a bidding frenzy with two export buyers clashing. The story behind these producers is in my opinion the best part, where the previous generation of this family also once held the national lamb price record, sold through the same yards and by the same stock and station agency.

### 'Buster' – Heaviest Bull on Grounds at the Ekka!

A local bull has been sashed as the Heaviest Bull on Grounds at this years Royal Queensland Show.

The Station Angus King T106, affectionately known as 'Buster' was lucky to make it to The Ekka on Saturday before roads were closed due to snow and ice.

"If we had left an hour later we wouldn't have made it through before the New England Highway was closed," said Emily Scrivener. "It was a long trip, but we took our time and made it safely to Brisbane."

On Sunday 3 August 'Buster', the 35 month old Angus bull, joined the line to hop on the scales and when he did he weighed in at a whopping 1,356kg.

His new claim to fame has seen him photographed from top to toe, and Emily fielding interviews from the likes of Queensland Country Life, the ABC Country Hour and ABC Brisbane's Loretta and James.

This year has seen quite a few seconds for 'Buster'. This will be his second outing to the Ekka, his second Royal Show for 2025, and the second time this year he has been named the heaviest on grounds – Buster took out the title at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in April.

Buster, who is by Bowmont King K306 and out of the homebred Bonny Brooke Jean P75, has been a show bull since a calf, won ribbons at numerous local Ag Shows and took out the title of Reserve Champion Senior Angus Bull at the 2025 Sydney Royal.

Along with two other bulls entered by the AJ & M Scrivener, he will make his appearance in the ring for judging on Friday 8 August.



### A NIGHT TIME VIEW FROM DERBY STREET

After the severe snow storm on Saturday Riverview Aged Care Facility, like everywhere else, was left without power. At 5:00pm it became clear that it wouldn't be back on that night. Acting General Manager Christian Martin contacted me and asked if anyone in town had a generator that could be used to run the facility. ETE Services had supplied this in the past but Ian Notley took his with him when they

left. John Stuart made it known he had one that would power Riverview and a quick call to Lisa Wratten (who had phone service) saw John, Lisa and husband Martin preparing the brand new generator by the time I got to town. Two problems remained, we needed an electrician and diesel to run it. With no power or phone service this made it more difficult. A knock on Ian Cameron's door at 7:00pm and his first response was "I will be there in 20". A visit to Council Grader Operator Josh Eveleigh, and while he said he didn't have any diesel in his pod he would go to the depot and get some. Half an hour later he was on site with diesel. In the wet it was challenging to place the generator in position and then it was discovered that the power plug was different. Ian Cameron removed the plug and hardwired the generator and two hours later with a flick of the switch Riverview lit up.

Not sure of how much fuel was being consumed, Josh Eveleigh then checked it at 2:30am and with the assistance of John Donnelly 'milked' the truck at the depot to make sure it ran until the morning. At 9:30am I dropped into Riverview to check they were right and Josh was back there checking the generator.

The point of this article is to thank those who helped and to give credit to what people do in this community for absolutely no personal gain. Standing ankle deep in snow in misty rain while six people worked together to provide a warm and comfortable nights' sleep to some of our more vulnerable residents was amazing. They laughed and chatted and never complained once (Lisa did say her feet were cold).

To John Stuart for the loan of, and placement of the generator, Lisa and Martin for their skill and can do attitudes, Josh Eveleigh whose problem solving ability and willingness to help came naturally, while his partner Tayla waited in the car with their children to assist when the crane became bogged. Ian Cameron who at 9:00pm may have been wishing he hadn't answered that knock at his door, your ability to improvise and calm attitude saved the day.

One thing that struck me on the side of that hill was that this was the attitude and loyalty that made Walcha a united and great community it was. I hope it is contagious.

### **LAND USE STRATEGY**

Last week Councillors saw the first draft of the Cumulative Impact Assessment and Land Use Strategy. The purpose of these documents is to evaluate potential impacts from renewable energy development and to include recommendations for Council to maximise opportunities this development may present.



These documents will be workshopped by Council and placed on public display for 28 days in late August. This will be an opportune time for anyone to comment. In saying this, when finalised these documents will not override applicable State planning laws.

### **ROADS**

Not much I can say here but our roads have been trashed by our winter weather systems. Impassable sections need to still be reported to Council by email, visit or phone but I believe this is going to take a long time to fully repair.

On a brighter side Mid Coast Council have indicated that Thunderbolts Way south should be open on the 11 August.

This is probably a good time to acknowledge the people who were out over the weekend keeping our services operating. No one expected the devastation and impacts that the weather would bring. Many people got caught, whether sightseeing or going about their business. As I write this much of the lower New England is still without electricity but contact with Essential Energy assures us they are going as hard as they can. It is a pertinent time to recognise and appreciate Council staff, fire brigade, SES and Essential Energy often working in challenging conditions for our community.

### Showers, power and coffee for those in need

For those in Walcha and surrounds still without electricity and/or phone service, the Bowling Club has electricity and are happy to offer help in the way of use of their wifi and charging your devices.

"We have two showers available (please note one is in the men's bathroom) and a tea/coffee station is available for the community to utilise," Rebecca Taiki said.

The Bowling Club is open Wednesday and Thursday from 12.00pm onwards. The kitchen is also open for dinner both Wednesday and Thursday nights. Everyone is most welcome.

Walcha Coffee is also generously opening its doors today (Wednesday), and if you're still without power, "The coffee's on us," Cameron Hayton said.

"Free hot brews to warm you up, charge your phone, and have a yarn. Sometimes a cuppa and a bit of company makes all the difference," Cameron commented.

### **NSW Farmers' Annual Conference**

I attended the NSW Farmers' Annual Conference in Sydney two weeks ago which saw farmers, industry leaders and politicians come together to discuss issues facing the industry.

These included the future of farming, artificial intelligence, a first farm buyer's scheme, renewable energy concerns, animal activism, privacy, waste transfers, mobile coverage, funding for feral pig control, pest and weed control, insurance costs, and the next generation of agriculture.

### **REZ Inquiry**

Renewable Energy Zones (REZ) were in focus when the Upper House brought their Parliamentary Inquiry to Armidale two weeks ago. Local mayors, local planning officers, landholders, academics, and community members had the chance to raise their concerns about the New England Renewable Energy Zone.

Our community has clearly and methodically identified shortcomings with the roll out of the REZ and witnesses raised those during the inquiry. No one said they were against renewables, but it is clear the NSW Government has so far failed to properly address fundamental issues such as water security, housing availability, roads and infrastructure, waste and recycling management, current infrastructure, and workforce availability.

Since becoming the local member 12 months ago, I have constantly said that the current planning laws in NSW are outdated and do not achieve fairness for regional communities dealing with large scale renewable projects.

Witnesses also identified the flawed planning process and the failure of the NSW Government to take their feedback into consideration.

The NSW Government now needs to stop overlooking them and start addressing them

### Crackdown on Illegal Vapes and Tobacco

Our regional communities have been calling for change on the sale of illegal vapes and tobacco for months and now the Government is finally acting. They have decided to introduce tougher laws.

This comes after the NSW Opposition announced they would introduce a Bill in Parliament to make NSW the hardest place in Australia to sell the dangerous products. These illegal shops run by criminals have moved into empty shops in our towns and have made these addictive, destructive and harmful products readily available, particularly for young people.
