Spring has arrived, and our landscape is transforming by the day to a vivid green from new pasture growth. Looking at temperatures we could let the fire go out, but don't put the wood away as there is another cold front coming through early next week. Last week's rain was timely with falls of up to an inch falling around our district which has really made a difference to our grasses. The ground being so wet throughout winter has set it a bit hard which follow up rain will soften and help growth. Looking at pasture growth, many are still yellow in colour as they are in much need of nitrogen due to excessive leaching throughout our winter months.

Last week's rain band stretched far and wide with excellent falls of 20mm or greater recorded from Queensland to the south of NSW. Parts of the Central West recorded 100mm which will set those areas up for a big grain crop in the coming months, also helping hay growers and cereal croppers to maximise growth. Reports are it is a magical season for some, yet Victoria and South Australia are still hoping for their big rain event to come as they edge closer to warmer weather. The rain that has been in the south will be enough for croppers to get a light crop or even make hay to replenish diminished supplementary feed reserves.

The Albanese Government's world first social media ban for children under the age of 16 is set to come into place in early December. Children under 16 will not be able to use social media platforms like Facebook, TikTok, Instagram, YouTube, X and Reddit. I have no idea what the last two are, but this is to help protect the mental health and wellbeing of our children and teens. Cyberbullying and exposure to harmful content outweigh any positives of our children having these accounts and I would have to agree, let children be children and get them outside. No doubt the government will still have issues with age verification and teething problems as plenty of children will try to get around these bans with fake accounts, but I believe it's a step in the right direction and good on the Government.

Speaking of social media, maybe some people shouldn't be on it at all if you believe the news that feeds into your account. Fake news is always an issue but looks extremely real to some, especially when it's aimed at the older population. An example is the recent posts claiming 60+ year olds can't drive between 10.00pm until 5.00am. We had one very disgruntled worker who read this. I am happy to inform him that it was fabricated news, the laws aren't changing, and that Transport for NSW are sorry if it caused him any distress.

Last week's rain really helped the confidence of restockers with weaners once again stepping to another level on AuctionsPlus. Light restocking steers topping at a whopping \$7.18 per kilo for 250kg, but the general run of Angus weaner steers are now making \$6-6.5/kg, while the quality heifer portion to join have started to rally, making from \$5-6 per kilo.

2791 head of cattle were in Tamworth on Monday with a full field of buyers present in a firm to shade cheaper market. Weaner steers back to the paddock made 526c/kg for 300kg, feeder cattle are still in high demand with Angus steers topping at 538c/kg, XB feeders to 478c/kg while the feeder heifers topped at 508c/kg for 412kg. Heavy cows are still in hot demand with 780kg cows topping at 430c/kg, that 3350 per head. The sale of fat cows still makes breeding cows with calves at foot look good value, plenty of these units are still selling for less than \$3000 a unit which also shows us that the grinding beef market is the real driver behind our current beef prices.

7000 sheep and lambs were yarded in Tamworth on Monday with trends dearer through the suitable kill lambs. Store lambs bound for the south topped at \$195, trade lambs topped at \$289 while heavy lambs made to \$389. Mutton sold to dearer trends with the heavy mutton topping at \$322.




