

around the traps 🔧

Once again, the weather threw up some mixed conditions over the weekend with a miserable cold, wet and windy day on Saturday while Sunday was a cracker. The rainfall was perfect, 10-20mm fell over our district and those totals were widespread throughout the northwest of the state. Daylight savings is just around the corner and the day length is increasing every day, it really is a good time of year for those of us that like to get up early. The week ahead looks dry and fine with daytime temps hitting twenty degrees on the weekend, but not before a potential frost mid-week. I looked at the forecast over the weekend where the first and second week of October were looking wet, (having us in for 80mm), but that forecast has now gone, I think something is brewing so only time will tell.

The Albanese government has just announced that they are investing \$1.1 billion into producing low carbon fuels from canola oil as the newest investment into tackling climate change. The government is trying to become a major producer of low carbon liquid fuels for not only Australia but the world. The government has set a ten-year cleaner fuels program which aims at private investment in onshore Australian production of low carbon liquid fuels to create jobs and power Australians for decades. I think it's a great idea that we could produce our own fuel and lessen the reliance on oil from other countries, but there are so many issues with the use of these canola oils in our diesel vehicles, especially with the age of our vehicles. Let's hope it will create jobs as every time you read a paper or listen to the radio, another large company is laying off workers. Albanese is currently in the USA and hasn't been able to get a meeting with President Trump to date, relationships are important and let's hope he hasn't flown all the way over there on tax payers money without an organised sit down with Trump.

We always have a downside to a good season, first it was grass tetany, during the backend of winter, and now its bloat. Numerous producers around the district have notched up cattle deaths due to bloat, the extreme changes in the weather and subsequent disruption in grazing habits can be fatal. We have an abundance of clover, especially on super improved country and though we can't cure it, prevention is always best. Up to date 5-in-1 needles and your choice of bloat licks, oils or even loose licks will all help reduce the severity of bloat, it won't guarantee that it will stop it but it will help manage it. The upside is that the paddocks are so good at present the cattle are putting on a mile of weight.

Grain looks to be getting cheaper as we edge closer to harvest and for those who buy grain or pulses for supplementary feeding purposes it might be a good time to look at filling your silos. Cheaper grain is also a great thing for feedlots, both beef and sheep as the major cost to a ration is grain. Given the price of cattle and lambs at present, cheaper rations will help keep feedlot gross margins in the green as livestock prices edge higher. Let's hope we can get a reasonable hay season to replenish hay sheds, especially in the south of the country, we may see some grain crops get cut for hay instead of harvested for grain this

It's pretty rare when we see a Tamworth fat-sale yard more than Wagga Wagga. Tamworth yarded 2937 on Monday with Wagga yarding less than 2900. All, bar the restocking cattle, sold to cheaper trends in Tamworth with weaner steers topping at 576c/kg and heifers topped at 440c/kg. The strength continues to come from the south, and our southern markets are continuing to outperform our local markets with domestic kill cattle topping at 492c/kg in Tamworth, while in Wagga they made to 540c/kg. Tamworth feeder cattle slipped topping at 542c/kg while they topped at 560c/kg in Wagga. Heavy kill cows in Tamworth topped at 428c/kg while cows in Wagga made to 450c/ kg. Sheep and lambs are still running hot with new season lambs making close to \$12/kg and old season lambs still making near \$11/ kg. Mutton is still running hot with the best of the fat mutton making \$8/ kg in our saleyards. Please note TFI Tamworth will be closed for 3 weeks for scheduled maintenance from next week onwards.

Students take on Sydney Bridge Competition

14-15 August 2025, six Walcha Central School students from Years 8 to 10 went to Sydney to compete in the M7-M12 Integration Project Bridge Competition.

The two teams had built their bridges at school in the weeks preceding, from spaghetti and glue to comply with competition rules, as a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) enrichment activity. They attended the bridge testing day at the John Holland construction site for the M7-M12 freeway interchange.

Bridges were tested to their limit (and destroyed in the process) to see the weight capacity they could hold. Amongst the vast array of bridges and building styles, the Walcha teams' bridges performed admirably. Most of the schools that participated were Sydney-based, and Walcha students were given VIP treatment for having come the furthest distance for the competition.

In addition to the bridge testing, there were engineering focused displays about the bridges of the M7-M12 Motorway Integration Project and activities for the students to participate in. Students were also given a tour of the freeway interchange construction site by engineers from TransUrban and John Holland Construction.

The results of the competition have not yet been received, so we do not know our overall standings, but congratulations to Ethan, Jack, Liam, Lachlan and Zion, and to Mr Stanton and Mrs Bayley for accompanying the students.

This investment in the Walcha branch should bolster consumer confidence that NAB is here to stay.






GARDEN 5. 'ORANDUMBIE' - Daniel and Carnie Kermode






