# EnergyCo continues to make it up as they go

Member for Northern Tablelands Brendan Moylan has again criticised EnergyCo for their lack of proper consultation following their plan to re-route the transmission corridor from Bayswater to Walcha.

At 6am last Thursday morning, EnergyCo announced a new three-kilometre-wide corridor in their latest study for their transmission line which will run between the Bayswater Power Station at Muswellbrook and the central south hub near Walcha.

The new "study area" will see the corridor stray from the previous path that was to run alongside the New England Highway and then east of Tamworth, now to a path further east which will impact landowners through the Hunter, Upper Hunter, and New England.

Mr Moylan said this new approach is clearly designed to save the NSW Government money at the expense of landowners and regional communities.

"Yet again EnergyCo have failed to properly engage with landowners, communities and local MPs, including myself, from the impacted areas," Mr Moylan said.

"EnergyCo have apparently been working on this for five years and then suddenly, they announce major changes on the eve of a long weekend to try and bury their policy on the run approach.

"There has been a complete lack of consultation, no planning and they

"EnergyCo and the NSW Government prefer liaising via press releases, as opposed to engaging meaningfully with our impacted landowners and communities, and this is why people are losing faith. Any good will that EnergyCo may have once had is starting to evaporate.

"EnergyCo have announced they will be holding a handful of 4-hour information sessions post their plans being released but that is just too little, too late.

"I encourage all landowners who are potentially impacted by this new transmission path to contact my electorate office."

## Deadly Day Out - Walcha Holiday Program

Walcha Council worked closely with a teen focus group this term to secure a Holiday Break Program grant from the NSW Government. The grant was used to create a memorable excursion to the coast, designed in response to goals highlighted during youth consultation: a day out, the chance to see the beach, swim, fish, enjoy some warmth, and — of course — do a little shopping.

The Youth Focus Group took the lead in setting priorities, exploring budgets, and planning activities, right down to meals and itineraries with the support of Council youth staff. With all roads leading to the coast, Port Macquarie was chosen as the perfect destination (despite a few tricky roadworks along the way).

With an early start, a group of 22 young people aged 12–17, accompanied by youth and library staff, headed down through Gloucester. After a quick rest stop and a visit to the town's famous bakery for a much-needed refuel, the group arrived at Flynns Beach. The water may have been freezing, but that didn't stop anyone from diving in. Fortunately, the sun came out just as the first brave swimmers hit the surf. Sand, waves, and a delicious café lunch rounded out the beach experience.

The afternoon saw the group at the movies, enjoying the brand-new Australian release Kangaroo (highly recommended), followed by a little time for shopping.

The bus rolled back into Walcha late in the evening with a crew of tired but very happy teenagers — with enough energy left for some loud and enthusiastic singing the whole way up the hill.

A huge thank you to everyone involved in making this trip possible. Programs like Deadly Day Out create memories, build connections, and give our young people opportunities to experience something new.

## Don't miss a beat: Defibrillator grants now open

Member for Northern Tablelands Brendan Moylan is encouraging sporting clubs, and recreation facilities from across the region to apply for the Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program.

The program is aimed at providing a grant of up to \$3000 for clubs and facilities across NSW to purchase Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs).

Mr Moylan said it is important sporting organisations are equipped to respond to life-threatening emergencies on and off-the-field.

"Whether you're playing footy at the park or cheering on the sidelines, cardiac arrest can affect anyone at any given time," Mr Moylan said.

"Having a defibrillator on-hand following cardiac arrest can be the difference between life and death.

"A person's chance of survival can double, or even triple, if a defibrillator is used in conjunction with CPR.

"I encourage clubs and organisations to apply for this funding because you never know when you made need a defibrillator."

The Local Sport Defibrillator Program 2025-26 is open to applicants within the bottom five socio-economic indexes for areas determined by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.

Eligible postcodes in the Northern Tablelands are: 2347, 2354, 2358, 2359, 2360, 2361, 2365, 2369, 2370, 2371, 2390, 2397, 2399, 2400, 2401, 2402, 2403, 2404, 2405, 2406, 2409, 2410, 2440, 2453, and 2833.
