Rogers wins Major Prize at 2025 Sculpture by the Sea

One of Walcha's own has triumphed at this years' prestigious Sculpture by the Sea exhibition.

October 17 saw James Rogers announced as the recipient of the exhibition's major prize, the Aqualand Australia Sculpture Award for his sculpture 'Siren's Song'.

James is recognised as one of Australia's pre-eminent sculptors and has a strong history with Sculpture by the Sea having exhibited there 20 times previously, including in its founding year.

Sculpture by the Sea began in 1997 as a one-day event in Bondi, Sydney. Now, in its 29th year, it runs over 21/2 weeks and has grown to be the world's largest free to the public sculpture exhibition. The event sees the 2km coastal walk from Bondi Beach to Tamarama Beach transform into a temporary sculpture park, this year featuring 100 sculptures by Australian and international artists.

Walcha has a long standing affiliation with Sculpture by the Sea and is able to boast that several local artists have exhibited there on numerous occasions; James Rogers, Stephen King and Ben Tooth. While Walcha's renowned Open Air Gallery also features many artists who have exhibited and won the major prize including; 2004-5 Václav Fiala (Czech Republic), 2012 & 2014 Peter Lundberg (USA), 2013 Stephen King (Walcha) and 2023 John Petrie NSW.

James' success at this years event and the number of artists who have permanent works in Walcha's Open Air Gallery who can also lay claim to exhibiting in Sculpture by the Sea is



around the traps

Driving around our district I can see the colour running out of our grass as we wait for a much needed fall of rain. Temperatures are set to hit high twenties this week which will only put our moisture reserves under more pressure. Don't get me wrong, I still think we are in pretty good shape but some decent rain would just keep us moving forward, rather than backwards, with pasture growth. November is forecasted to be a wet month and we are lucky that it is only a week away. Another scary thought is that Christmas is here in under 10 weeks.

At long last, Prime Minister Albanese has been able to sit down with President Trump and confirm the USA's support for AUKUS while also talking all things business between Australia and the USA. Labor clearly has appointed the wrong Australian Ambassador to the US after Trump singled out Rudd during the Albanese/Trump meeting and told him he didn't like him. If that is not a red flag for Albanese to change our Ambassador. I'm not sure what is. Tensions appear to be high between Rudd and Trump, I think the government needs to make changes to keep our relations with the USA amicable. They have also signed a rare earths mineral deal which might put China offside as the USA/China trade war continues. It is critical that we keep our relationship with the USA sound for Australian beef and lamb producers. As of 2024 the USA were the largest importers of Australian beef worldwide with Canada coming in a close second.

Finally, we have seen some sense from the Labor government who have now ditched the proposed tax on unrealised capital gains in relation to superannuation accounts. The government is now moving towards a realised earnings model with tax being applied to an asset's capital gains if they are being liquidated. The government is looking to implement a two-tiered taxation approach with superannuation balances between \$3million to \$10 million being subject to 30% tax rate, while balances exceeding \$10 million will be taxed at 40%.

National Party member for New England, Mr Barnaby Joyce, has announced he will not re-contest his seat at the next election. Mr Joyce said his relationship with the party's current leadership had irreparably broken down and it is time for him to step away. Whispers of Mr Joyce taking up arms with the One Nation Party are swirling but it will be a 'wait and see' approach as he has also spoken about retirement from politics. Regardless of the outcome, Mr Joyce has been a great advocate for the people living in rural areas and the New England region.

Speaking with southern agents, their season is once again getting away from them with the dry, hot and windy conditions taking its toll on crops and pasture. Thirty-degree days and westerly winds have dried out numerous crops beyond getting them to harvest so the hay balers have moved in before all is lost. These westerly winds and extreme heat will no doubt brew up some wild storms with the BOM predicting a wild summer of storms ahead for the east coast of Australia.

Tamworth yarded 2202 head of cattle on Monday, 900 less than the week before. The market was quoted dearer for feeder and kill cattle while restocking light cattle back to the paddock were a shade cheaper. Weaner steers topped at 516c/kg, heifers to 439c/kg while feeders steers sold to 500c/kg and the heifer portion topped at 450c/kg. Grown heifer to process were 20c/kg dearer and topped at 384c/kg while heavy cows topped at 382c/kg. Wagga cows yesterday topped at 398c/kg which would be the closest value between the two locations for some time. 3800 sheep and lambs were yarded in Tamworth on Monday with trade lambs topping at \$278 while heavy export lambs topped at \$314. The mutton market was slightly dearer topping at \$238 for XB ewes and dorpers to \$230. The lamb hook market has declined over the last few weeks with prices sitting around \$10.50-\$11 per kilo carcase weight while mutton has followed the same trend, down from \$7.50 to \$6.80 per kilo carcase weight.

Walcha High Country Guardians mobilise



With very minimal respect for west of Walcha township. the landholders involved or the wider Walcha community, EnergyCo rapidly announced, just prior to the October long weekend, that there was to be a change to the placement of the Transmission lines from Muswellbrook to the Central South Hub on the western side of Walcha.

With extreme concern and bewilderment, the affected landholders held a meeting where it was unanimously

decided to seek Council support to oppose this route and to form a committee to ensure that this decision by EnergyCo be overturned.

On Wednesday 15 October Walcha Council passed a Mayoral minute by resolution to not support the study corridor for this transmission project, as well as not supporting the Central-South Hub, other proposed substations and the proposal for over 65kms of dual 500 KV transmission lines within the Walcha LGA.

As a result, we have established the Walcha High Country Guardians group to respond to this diabolical decision by EnergyCo to re-route the proposed dual 550 KV high voltage lines from their previously verified and preferred route south-west of Walcha, to now be coming in more directly from the south via Niangala, Ingelba and areas just

This betrayal of trust from a NSW Government Dept has wide ranging ramifications for the broader Walcha Community as well. The route that has now been selected was assessed by EnergyCo's own expert consultants only a few months ago for the second time and found to have "inferior outcomes" and "would affect a considerably greater number of dwellings".

Their conclusion was (quote): "In summary, with consideration to people and communities, environmental and land use, and efficiency and deliverability criteria, the assessment identified that the base case (i.e. preferred study corridor) would on balance, result in a better outcome compared to the TSR route options".

We urge all concerned local community members to help us in any way they can, to ensure that both of these parallel 550 KV Transmission lines which are 75 metre high obnoxious towers every 600 metres and closer in places, is never built.

There are a range of ways to help:

- EnergyCo are holding their first information session where project team representatives will be available "to chat with you about the new study area" on 28 October between 10am and 2pm upstairs at Walcha Vet Supplies. The affected landholders have been invited to attend at 12 midday and anyone can attend to seek more information on the project.
- EnergyCo are inviting feedback from the wider community, and this can be done by emailing nerez@energyco.nsw.gov.au
- We will provide further updates and suggestions regarding submissions for the project which are due by 28 November 2025
- We urge as many people as possible to do this and if they require further information, please visit the EnergyCo website and get in touch with any of the committee members whose contact details are listed below.
- There is also the option to write to Walcha Council, the ombudsman and local state and federal politicians.
- It is important that the NSW Government Minister responsible for this rollout be contacted with your thoughts and comments. She indicated on radio 2GB on Friday morning that she is willing to come to Walcha and we need that to happen so that she can see firsthand, that this absolutely absurd proposal is being considered in what is prime, productive agricultural land along with world recognised pristine State Forests and biodiversity areas with high conservation values spreading right from Walcha to Muswellbrook.
- We are considering a public meeting soon to brief the wider community, however in the meantime please reach out to our committee with any questions.
- There will also be an online petition circulating as well as paper versions which will require 10,000 signatures to stimulate more Parliamentary debate, and for those who are available, a visit to Macquarie Street in Sydney during the next sitting week to support Brendan Moylan's commitment to WALCHA.

Corridor update

We are updating part of the corridor that will connect the REZ to the existing grid at Muswellbrook.

We have identified a new study area between the Bayswater Power Station and the central south energy hub (substation) near Walcha which will allow for safer and more efficient construction with fewer environmental and road impacts. The move will also ensure the transmission lines do not affect aerial firefighting operations around Chaffey Dam and Lake Glenbawn.

We are inviting local feedback as we refine the study area in the coming months and complete further assessments.


