around the traps

Feral pigs are exploding in numbers right across the New England and Northwest following recent rain, creating one of the most damaging pest seasons we've seen in years. With moisture returning to the landscape, pigs have spread rapidly through creek lines, cropping country and soft-footed pastures causing heavy losses in lambing paddocks and tearing up newly sown summer feed. Landholders from Niangala and Walcha through to Bundarra, Bingara and the Upper Horton are reporting mobs in the dozens. I know personally on our travels that pig sightings which traditionally have been rare are now a common occurrence. Late last week I spotted a mob leaving one producer's house yard. Local pest groups are preparing coordinated baiting programs, but producers are being urged to act early-grain-fed bait sites, professional shooting teams and neighbour collaboration are essential if we're going to get numbers back under control before autumn. There are always keen young lads with dogs looking to help out, but please if you are one of those lads, please respect boundary fences as trespassing is still illegal.

The Trump administration has launched a formal investigation into America's major meat-packing companies over allegations of price manipulation, market concentration and unfair pressure on U.S. cattle producers. With just four processors controlling the bulk of the American beef kill, concerns have grown that multinational packers have been widening the gap between cattle prices and high retail beef values. While this is a U.S. political story, it matters here in Australia too: any shake-up of the American processing sector could shift global beef pricing, influence export competitiveness, and potentially reset how multinational processors behave in other markets-including ours. This rings true for the Australian Processing sectors which are held by some if not all these four. I wonder if our government has the strength to act as such.

The decision by Elders to test the market for the Killara Feedlot business near Quirindi is one of the many significant assets moves in the Australian lot-feeding sector this year. According to recent reports, Elders has engaged a sell-side advisor and stated that the yard — with a working capacity of around 22,500 head and a history of both domestic and export finishing programs — could be divested if a suitable buyer aligns with the company's valuecreation strategy. Or to whoever has the most money at the time!

John Laws gave rural Australia a voice at a time when few others were listening. His golden microphone carried the stories of drought, hardship and bush resilience into the nation's living rooms — and straight to the desks of politicians who often preferred to look the other way. Laws stood up for fair treatment of farmers, called out banks and corporations when they hurt regional communities, and made sure country people were never ignored in national debates. His passing marks the end of an era, and a reminder of how much one strong voice can mean to the bush. I wonder what John would think of the proposed transmission lines, it certainly seems that Ben Fordham on 2GB is taking up the fight on the airways in his absence. If you would like to wage in on the debate the Walcha High Country Guardians have an e-Petition that needs 20,000 signatures if you can take a guick two minutes to fill out the online form, I'm sure it will be appreciated.

Livestock markets have responded to recent rain events regaining all the lost ground in a matter of days. The cow market coming back with a vengeance surpassing previous highs through the year with the best of the cows in southern markets making up to \$4.55 for high yielding types. Sheep and lamb markets have also seen similar gains. With larger yardings not seeming to have an effect.

Walcha's very own Marlee Wall has once again proven her skill and determination on the Polocrosse field, earning selection to represent New South Wales at the 2026 Darwin Polocrosse Nationals, to be held in June next year.

This will mark Marlee's third appearance at a Polocrosse Nationals, having previously worn the blue jersey for NSW at Ballarat VIC in 2022 and Chinchilla QLD in 2024. Her consistent performances and strong teamwork have made her a standout player. Known for her toughness, commitment and sportsmanship, Marlee has built a reputation as one of Walcha's most dedicated players. Her success is a testament not only to her talent but also to the strong support of her family and Polocrosse Club. Marlee and her family will make the over 3,500km journey north to Darwin for the week-long event, where the best players from across the country will compete. The competition in Darwin will be tough and some of the best Polocrosse to be played.

The Walcha Polocrosse Club has expressed enormous pride in Marlee's achievements,

describing her as an inspiration to younger members and a great ambassador for the sport. Marlee's hard work determination have really paid off. Marlee has shown what can be achieved through dedication and passion, and the club could not be prouder to see her representing New South Wales once again.

Marlee continues preparations for the Nationals. the Walcha Polocrosse Club will be cheering her on every step of the way and hoping she can bring home another win for the state.

Invitation for New Registrations: Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment New England Renewable Energy Zone (REZ) Network Infrastructure Project

Updated locations: Singleton Shire, Muswellbrook Shire, Upper Hunter Shire, Tamworth Regional, Walcha Shire, Uralla Shire, and Armidale Regional Local Government Areas

The Energy Corporation of NSW (EnergyCo) is developing the New England Renewable Energy Zone Network Infrastructure Project (the Project) which involves the construction and operation of new high voltage electricity transmission infrastructure that is required to connect renewable energy generation and storage projects within the New England REZ to the existing electricity network in the Upper Hunter region of NSW.

The Project is Critical State Significant Infrastructure (CSSI) under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act).

Changes have been made to the Project since 2023, including a new study area between Bayswater Power Station and the Central South Energy Hub (substation) near Walcha, released in October 2025

You can view the new study area in detail on our interactive map: https://caportal.com.au/energyco/rez. This map also includes the existing 3km-wide study corridor and the previous study corridor.

Registrations of interest are invited from Aboriginal individuals and organisations who hold cultural knowledge relevant to determining the significance of Aboriginal objects and/or places in the area of the Project, and who wish to be involved in the consultation process as part of the planned cultural heritage assessment for the Project.

Community consultation with Aboriginal people will:

 assist EnergyCo to assess the Aboriginal cultural heritage values of the Project study area;

- 2) assist other Government regulators in the assessment of Aboriginal cultural heritage reports prepared for this Project;
- assist in the preparation of any Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) applications that may be required in future (eg if required for ancillary activities); and
- 4) support any future applications or approvals for the Project sought under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 and/or National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974.

Registrations of interest must be in writing (email preferred) and include:

- · your name/organisation;
- current contact details (postal address, email, phone number/s) (email is our preferred method of consultation throughout the duration of the Project); and
- the area/s of the Project that you or your organisation has an interest in – noting that the Project traverses multiple Aboriginal traditional regions.

Secondary students participated in activities that included virtual cow


mustering, a chemistry escape room, formulating algorithms for tying and untying knots and studied the immune system.


