around the traps

You can nearly bet your farm on it that when the Golden Gate Campdraft weekend runs in January that it will rain ... and rain it did. Falls of over 50mm were recorded around the district. It was patchy with some people north of Walcha missing out altogether, but most picked up a storm over the weekend.

The rain has brought the spray rigs back out and the talk about getting your annual crops in before the Walcha Races. The week ahead has us in for a chance of some storms and a hot weekend which will see the temperatures climb into the thirties. We are over halfway through summer now but our hottest month, February, is yet to come. Most of the district looks to be in pretty good shape considering a lot of people around the district have notched up more than 5 inches of rain thus far.

The biggest sale event on the horse racing calendar for the year was completed last week on the Gold Coast with Nutrien Boulton's very own employee Maddie Davidson bid spotting for the week. They promote responsible gambling but the prices those horses bring are phenomenal and the strength of the racing industry in Australia is truly remarkable. Top price this year was 2 million dollars for a colt and nearly 1000 horses sold for an average of \$228,407. Nutrien Classic Horse Sale is only a fortnight away with over 700 horses catalogued for the 2026 sale. The Classic Cattle Sale is also held during the week of the horse sale and if you would like to sell some cattle, please contact anyone at Nutrien Boulton's Walcha to get your cattle advertised before it is too late.

Last week I spoke about the extent of the floods up north and the impact on the northern cattle industry, but new reports this week is that cattle losses could now exceed 100,000 head. The figure will be unknown for some time due to the inability for owners to be able to muster their cattle or even check their cattle due to flood waters. The producers from those areas mentioned their cattle numbers had only just recovered from the 2019 floods which wiped out more than 100,000 cattle.

Talking to producers over the weekend and the topic of virtual fencing was floated for the beef industry. Personally, I think it's a great tool for the dairy industry, but I question its suitability for the beef industry. Initial thoughts would be a farm with virtual fencing would be worth less as fencing infrastructure adds value and equity to your land, while virtual fencing is collars and satellites. How would a valuer put a figure on virtual fencing compared to traditional fencing and would you buy a farm with limited fencing infrastructure for the same price as another with a completed set of actual fences?

Numbers have swelled leading into the Australia Day long weekend with major sale yards across the north west yarding in excess of 8000 cattle this week. Tamworth yarded 2758 head of cattle on Monday with the market firm to cheaper across most categories. Weaner steers topped at 532c/kg while the heifers made to 438c/kg, feeder steers struggled to make 500c/kg if they weighed north of 420kg, while feeder heifers topped at 450c/kg. Heavy export cattle made to 460c/kg while the best of the cows topped at 398c/kg.

6800 sheep and lambs sold in Tamworth on Monday, which was quoted as a cheaper market with the best of the store lambs nudging \$200, trade weights sold to \$287, while the heaviest of export lambs topped at \$345. XB ewes made to \$236 while wethers topped at \$238.

Reminder that there is no fat sale in Tamworth next week due to the Australia Day public holiday. Weaner sales in the south have been all but wrapped up with prices getting dearer as the sales went on. The strength by all reports was the local Victorians who really put a base in the sales and by the sounds of it, EU accredited weaners were highly sought after by restockers and feedlots. Season depending obviously, but it's a good indication where our weaner sale prices will head come Autumn and I would expect some decent weight in our Tableland calves this year.

chat with residents, answer questions, and share practical safety information. This will include advice on home fire safety, smoke alarm maintenance, lithium-ion battery safety, and what to do in the early moments of a car crash before emergency services arrive.

Firefighters will also be available to talk about Fire and Rescue NSW's free Home Fire Safety Visits, which include smoke alarm checks and installation for eligible households.

Free refreshments will be provided, and families are encouraged to drop in at any time from 9:30am onwards, whether to play, watch, or simply enjoy the atmosphere.

For those who are curious, there will also be informal opportunities to learn more about becoming an On-Call Firefighter with Station 481 Walcha and what that role looks like in a regional community.

Fire and Rescue NSW Station 481 Walcha encourages everyone to come along, get involved, and help celebrate the strong sense of community that makes Walcha a great place to live—especially as the town heads into the Australia Day long weekend.





A water wake-up call for Walcha

The EnergyCo-commissioned study into water and wastewater security for the New England Renewable Energy Zone (REZ) should be a wake-up call for the Walcha community.

According to EnergyCo's own figures, if the New England REZ proceeds as proposed, water demand across the region will increase by 50%, from 121.1ML/day to 182.2ML/day. In Walcha, the change is far more alarming. By 2032, our daily water requirement is projected to rise from less than 0.5 - 1ML/day to 11.9ML/day — an increase of more than 1,000%, driven almost entirely by renewable energy projects.

This is staggering for a town whose new off-creek storage holds just 300ML.

EnergyCo identifies regulated surface water sources such as Glenbawn, Glennies Creek, Chaffey, Keepit, Split Rock, Copeton and Pindari dams as potential supply options. That raises an obvious question: how would this water reach Walcha?

Trucking 11.9ML of water per day into the Walcha LGA would require around 400 B-double trucks on local roads every single day. I recently followed a truck from Walcha to Bendemeer without an opportunity to overtake. Imagining hundreds more heavy vehicles daily — just to transport water — highlights the inevitable damage to roads and the serious impacts on residents, tourism, grazing and existing transport industries.

EnergyCo's report itself identifies the risks:

- insufficient water to construct or operate REZ infrastructure
- potential water restrictions and localised shortages
- increased water costs
- conflicts between communities and industries
- reduced production in water-dependent industries (eg. agriculture and manufacturing)
- disruption caused by large-scale water tankering

Water is only one of many pressures created by the proposed 8GW New England REZ. When combined with workforce accommodation, waste disposal, strain on trades and services, environmental impacts and road degradation, the cumulative and irreversible effects on our community become clear.

Walcha does not have the capacity to be the epicentre of an 8GW REZ. I encourage residents to read EnergyCo's studies and respond to the consultation survey. Write to Minister for Energy, The Hon. Penny Sharpe, contact our state and federal representatives. Stand with Council and the community in calling for a reduced 3.5GW REZ that better reflects the realities of our region.

Award winning local embroiderer and teacher Yvette Stanton will offer two exciting embroidery classes in Walcha over the coming months, giving local stitchers the opportunity to learn from Australia's leading whitework expert.

On 21–22 February, Yvette will teach a beginners Hardanger embroidery class. Hardanger is a traditional Norwegian whitework technique that features white stitching on white fabric. Students will learn foundational Hardanger skills, including satin stitch, eyelets, cable stitch, four sided stitch, cutting threads, woven bars and dove's eye filling stitch. The project is worked in pearl cotton on 28 count linen. This class is designed for complete beginners, but returning Hardanger stitchers are warmly welcomed.

On 21–22 March, Yvette will teach a Frisian whitework sampler class. Frisian whitework originates from Friesland in the Netherlands and is known for its crisp, geometric beauty. Participants will learn key stitches such as regular and diagonal satin stitch, single and clustered eyelets, whipped backstitch, topwinder stitch and chain

stitch. This project is also worked in pearl cotton on 28 count linen. All skill levels are welcome, though familiarity with counted thread techniques will be helpful.

Classes run from 9:30am to 3:30pm each day, and a supplies kit, including prepared fabric, threads and needles, is included in the cost of the class. Full venue details and a list of what to bring will be provided upon booking.




