This weekend will see the town of Walcha come to life with the roar of New and Vintage Engines from all over the State for the Walcha Antique Machinery and Truck Show (WAMATS).

The committee have a jam-packed weekend planned with something for the whole family.

Friday will see the Tractor Run which will run from the showground leaving at 9am, travelling through Riverview and the hospital before embarking on Aberbaldie Road, Niangala Road and back into town via Scrubby Gully Road. Please take care

while travelling these roads on Friday as these vehicles will be moving slowly.

Saturday our Swap Meet will start with the gates opening at 6am which will be followed by the impressive street parade which will see the streets turn back time with vintage machinery rolling through the centre of town from 10.30am. "The parade will run straight through the centre of town on Fitzroy Street and go back up Middle Street to the showgrounds," Secretary, Megan Tisdell said.



around the traps

The Walcha Race weekend didn't disappoint on multiple fronts, with the Walcha Jockey Club once again holding a great two-day event for the family. Punters came from near and far to enjoy a couple of days at the racecourse before the weather brewed up a storm for the locals on Sunday evening. The past two weeks of dry weather has really set the district back and will take some time to turn around, but the forecast is building for the weekend. On Monday 15 – 20mm fell across the Tablelands, which was a welcomed start to some rain, with over 50mm predicted for the weekend ahead. Places through the centre of Australia experienced in excess of three inches, which gradually pushed east and dropped a couple of inches throughout the Central West. Forecasters are predicting big rain and flash flooding for isolated areas throughout south-east Queensland and areas along the north coast of NSW, with the potential of rainfall totals exceeding 300mm.

If the rain eventuates this weekend for our district, it will mean an early start to our autumn sowing, with plenty of our local graziers going round and round the paddock this week trying to beat the forecast rain. The rain we have already had will only damage the dry feed we had in our paddocks and wreck the protein status of that feed. The livestock still look exceptional and, even though it has been a hot and dry summer for most, sheep graziers have had a good run with worms, especially barber's pole, which is an issue that will arise once we see decent rain. Cattle throughout our district are coming forward quicker than usual, especially feeder cattle. I'd say nearly two months ahead in comparison to previous years, which is a good thing for pasture growth heading into autumn and storing feed for our winter months.

The Reserve Bank decided to lift interest rates last week on the back of inflation figures, which was a real kick in the belly to a lot of people. The major economists state that inflation is not caused by individual spending, but by major government spending. The government is spending at a rate of knots that we cannot pay for. Our country is living outside its means, and the old saying should be implemented, don't spend more than you earn – basic economics that even our government does not understand. The worrying part for rural people is that if the government is overspending, we certainly aren't seeing the results in the bush.

Wool growers are finally starting to see some light at the end of the tunnel, with wool prices looking good for the future, especially ultra-fine wool. The wool market is extremely volatile at present, one week it's up by 100c/kg, the next week it's down by 70c/kg, which, believe it or not, I'm told is a good thing for future prices. Clearly, like the protein market, there is a world shortage and that shortage is set to continue for some time, with flock numbers alone in our area dropping by two to three per cent year on year for the past 20 years.

Trump, just late last week, decided to lift tariff-free beef imports from Argentina to 100,000 tonne under a measure to fill their domestic supply shortfall. Argentina will now have an extra 80,000 tonne of tariff-free quota, which will be specific for ground beef, or lean beef trimmings, to produce burger patties. We all know how Americans enjoy their burgers. Mind you, I'm not partial to one either, but it may have a few ramifications for our 90CL price, affecting our boning cattle values in the short term, especially if it remains dry. Regardless, global supply is low, demand is high, and no matter how they shuffle the protein deck globally, someone will pay for the product.

2,680 cattle were yarded in Tamworth on Monday, with the feeder and cow market quoted firm to a shade dearer. Weaner steers sold to a top of 524c/kg, with heifers to 394c/kg. Feeder steers topped at 484c/kg, heifers at 430c/kg, while the best of the kill cows made to 370c/kg and bullocks topped at 450c/kg. A total of 7,009 sheep and lambs sold in Tamworth on Monday, with suckers selling to a top of \$270, while the heaviest export lambs topped at \$354. Heavy mutton held firm and topped at \$272 for XB ewes, while Dorpers topped at \$258.

Field work taking place for the New England REZ network infrastructure project

EnergyCo is leading the development of the New England Renewable Energy Zone (REZ), part of the NSW Government's plan to upgrade the electricity network to power our state now and for the next generation.
