Subject: Reporting Requirement for Overdoses as a Notifiable Condition

Dear Healthcare Provider,

This letter is to remind you of your obligation to report all suspected or confirmed overdoses to the Chelan-Douglas Health District (CDHD), as required under local public health authority granted by WAC 246-101-505(3)(d). In 2019, overdoses were designated as a notifiable condition within our jurisdiction.

This reporting requirement applies to **all types of overdoses**, regardless of substance or intent, and includes both fatal and non-fatal cases.

Why Reporting Matters

Reporting overdose incidents serves two critical public health purposes:

- 1. **Data Monitoring**: It enables CDHD to accurately track trends in overdose activity and respond to emerging threats.
- 2. **Treatment Referral Pathways**: It creates an opportunity to connect individuals who have overdosed with lifesaving care, treatment, and recovery services.

How to Report

Reports should be submitted within **24 hours** of identification and include relevant information such as:

- Patient demographics (name, date of birth, contact information)
- Type of substance(s) involved
- Date and location of overdose
- Whether naloxone was administered

Reports can be submitted via:

- Online: Overdose Event Report Form for EMS and Hospitals
