FY 23 Proposed State Plan Contracts Budget

Budget Cover Memo

February 2024 Special Council Meeting

Included in the packet is the proposed FY23 budget which includes the remaining balance of Grants/Contracts line item budget. A Council vote is required to approve this remaining item in our budget. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Brandi or Aziz.

Please Note:

- 1. This funding will expire on 9/30/24.
- 2. All of the work and products this funding pays for will need to be completed by 9/30/24.
- 3. It is currently taking approximately 2 months to complete a Request for Proposal (RFP) process at Commerce. This means that if the RFPs for these funds open at the beginning of March, we would expect the contracts to begin in June, giving the contractors approximately three months to complete their projects.

Proposed Projects:

- 1. Incarceration and I/DD Research: A paper focused on what is currently happening nationally and in Washington State around this topic, that provides suggestions on how to reduce the number of people with I/DD living in most restrictive settings such as jails, prisons and hospitals.
- 2. Behavioral Health and I/DD Paper and Event Plan: A paper focused on what is currently happening nationally and in Washington State around evidence-based practices that are culturally relevant and focused on helping individuals and families in this population. This project also includes a plan for an event in Washington State to focus on these topics.
- 3. Statewide Advocacy Leadership Development Cohort:
 - Core curriculum developed and delivered by a collaboration of two or three organizations. Curriculum provides key advocacy training and planning tools to make impacts on community barriers and/or solutions.
 - Nine or ten community cohorts participate in the project to learn about key advocacy elements and finish with a plan that outlines steps to impact their chosen barrier and/or solution.
