



## SAIL TOP BILLS

# AND OTHER ITEMS

### THE INSTITUTIONS BILLS

HB 1472 and

SB 5393 and

- The House Bill would close both Rainier School and Yakima Valley School for long-term residents by June 30, 2027, and would relocate current residents to other settings. The Yakima location would still be available for short-term respite or crisis stabilization services.
- The Senate Bill would close Rainier School by June 30, 2027 and would relocate residents to other settings.
- As of April 23<sup>rd,</sup> both bills are sitting in House Rules.

### THE COMMUNITY PROTECTION BILL

HB 1390

- This bill removes references to the Community Protection Program from statute effective January 1, 2026.
- It requires the Developmental Disability Administration to move program participants to other waivers and ensure that they can access the same programs and services by December 31st, 2025.
- Unfortunately, this bill didn't pass this year but we will be advocating for it again next year.

### WAIVER PRIORITIZATION

HB 1130

- This bill would prioritize specific populations when placing people on waivers. This would only happen if there were a shortage of waivers.
- It would also require the Developmental Disability Administration to collect data on the prioritized populations and post it on their website.
- This bill was passed and is headed to the Governor.

#### OTHER LEGISLATIVE ITEMS

- At the State Level
- We advocated for a few housing bills, including HB 1217, which improves housing rules for tenants.
- Advocated for people's right to use independent repair shops to repair wheelchairs. SB 5680.
- Advocated to get 50 million for DD Housing projects in the Capital Budget.
- Advocated to make sure we don't see cuts to critical direct services in the operating budget.

- At the Federal Level
- Members are participating in the Medicaid Matters campaign to help us stop Federal cuts to Medicaid.
- Advocating to keep other vital services the same for people with disabilities.
- Working with all of the Developmental Disability Network Partners to make sure they keep their funding.

#### LEGISLATIVE REVIEW

- SAIL staff spoke at 16 Legislative Public Hearings
- At least 8 SAIL members (non staff) spoke at I hearing or more.
- Many SAIL signed in to state their position for the record.
- Contacted each State Legislator several times throughout the session over email.
- Staff and SAIL met with Legislators in person or over Zoom throughout the session.

Interviewed by King 5 News, Cascade PBS and ended up with statements in at least three newspapers.

Wrote an editoral about deinstitutionalization that was published in the Tacoma News Tribune.

A member of SAIL and the Washington State Developmental Disabilities Council member participated in a Federal press conference on Medicaid.

Worked on 5 bills directly plus the budget bills

- Helped pass 2 bills with another 2 as possibilities.
- Co-hosted a Community Living Rally that had around 200 people.

#### WHAT POLICY ITEMS ARE NEXT

- Work to pass the Community Protection Bill
- Work with Legislators to make sure our equipment goes with us during times of emergencies.
- Improve and strengthen supported living and community residential placement.

- Follow the deinstitutionalized bills
- Follow the Nothing About Us Without Us Act
- Improve transportation
- Improve access to medical services
- Protect Federal services
- Possible other items

#### WORKING WITH OUR CONSULTANTS

- Starting In 2024 we met with several consultants Lisa Latchford, Anna Kashner, and Chuck Goodwin.
- Chuck helped Staff update their Job Descriptions
- Lisa and Anna helped the SAIL Leadership create three year goals and complete several trainings like conflict management.

- Lisa and Anna are back this year to help us
- Complete our long-term goals
- Help us figure out our structure
- Help us with Officer descriptions
- Help the Coalition work better together through various trainings.
- We are halfway through this year's work
