

APEC Cross-Border Privacy Rules (CBPR) System

The APEC CBPR System is a voluntary, enforceable privacy certification that lets organizations transfer personal data across participating economies, now run by the Global CBPR Forum.

What it is

The APEC Cross-Border Privacy Rules (CBPR) System is a voluntary, accountability-based certification that lets organizations demonstrate that their privacy practices meet the APEC Privacy Framework so they can move personal information across participating economies. A certified organization commits to a published set of program requirements, is assessed by an independent Accountability Agent, and is subject to enforcement by a privacy regulator in its home jurisdiction.

APEC Leaders endorsed the CBPR System in 2011, and nine APEC economies participate: the United States, Mexico, Japan, Canada, Singapore, the Republic of Korea, Australia, Chinese Taipei, and the Philippines. In 2022 those economies established the Global CBPR Forum, which now administers the Global CBPR and Global Privacy Recognition for Processors (PRP) certifications as the successor to the APEC systems and has since admitted the Dubai International Financial Centre as a member and Bermuda, Mauritius, Nigeria, and the United Kingdom as associates. The certification binds personal information controllers (CBPR) and processors (PRP) that choose to be certified; it does not replace domestic privacy law.

Why it matters

- **Enable lawful cross-border data transfers** Certification is recognized by participating economies as a mechanism for transferring personal information, reducing reliance on bespoke contracts.
- **Demonstrate accountability to regulators and customers** Independent assessment and a published certification mark show that privacy commitments are verified rather than self-declared.
- **Harmonize privacy controls across jurisdictions** One set of program requirements aligned with the APEC Privacy Framework and the OECD Privacy Guidelines supports compliance in several markets at once.

How SmartSuite supports APEC CBPR System

CBPR Program Requirements Library

Report certification status, open findings, complaints, and transfer inventories to privacy leadership and regulators.

Frequently asked questions

What is the APEC CBPR System?

The APEC Cross-Border Privacy Rules (CBPR) System is a voluntary, accountability-based certification endorsed by APEC Leaders in 2011. A certified organization shows that its privacy practices meet the APEC Privacy Framework and can transfer personal data among participating economies. Since 2022 the Global CBPR Forum has run the global version of the certification.

Is APEC CBPR certification mandatory?

No. Certification is voluntary, but once an organization is certified its commitments become enforceable by the privacy enforcement authority in its jurisdiction. Some participating economies also recognize the certification as a lawful mechanism for cross-border transfers.

How does an organization get APEC CBPR certified?

An organization completes the intake questionnaire covering the 50 program requirements, submits its privacy statements, policies, and evidence to a Forum-recognized Accountability Agent, and closes any gaps the agent identifies. The agent then certifies the organization, monitors its compliance, and renews the certification annually.

What is the difference between CBPR and PRP?

CBPR certifies personal information controllers, the organizations that decide how personal data is used. Privacy Recognition for Processors (PRP) certifies processors that handle data on a controller's instructions and shows they can implement the controller's CBPR obligations.

Which jurisdictions take part in the APEC CBPR System?

Nine APEC economies participate: the United States, Mexico, Japan, Canada, Singapore, the Republic of Korea, Australia, Chinese Taipei, and the Philippines. The Global CBPR Forum adds the Dubai International Financial Centre as a member and Bermuda, Mauritius, Nigeria, and the United Kingdom as associates.

How does APEC CBPR relate to GDPR?

CBPR and GDPR are separate regimes, and CBPR certification is not recognized as a GDPR transfer mechanism. The two share principles such as notice, purpose limitation, security, and accountability, so organizations commonly map the 50 CBPR program requirements to their GDPR controls and run one privacy program for both.
