

HOW DO YOU SAY 'THANK YOU'?

I remember when I was a kid, my mother made me write 'Thank You' notes for any and every gift I ever received: birthdays, confirmation, graduation, etc. It always seemed like such a chore that I'd procrastinate until mom had to sit over me and watch as I wrote them.

At the seminary we were instructed that we WOULD send 'Thank You' letters to all of our supporters. Any time a gift arrived we were expected to write a letter to the donor and inform the financial aid office when it had been sent. Gifts were and are the lifeblood of the seminary, and acknowledging the generosity of others was the least we could do. By now saying 'Thank You' was less of a chore and now done out of a thankful heart.

But there are some gifts that are so generous that a simple 'Thank You' note or letter seems inadequate; and that is the situation I am in today. On August 18th I will begin my 3-month sabbatical and I'm unsure how to say 'Thank You'. That you as a congregation would see the need for the time away, agree to give me the time off, support my travel and explorations, and then fully and generously fund my time away. Complicating matters is that all the gifts to the sabbatical fund were anonymous. So I'm not even sure who to say Thank You to, except to the whole congregation.


In Psalm 136, the psalmist is thankful to the Lord for everything He's done; from creation, to the Exodus, to the gift of the Promised Land, to rescue from their enemies, and finally for daily bread. Over and over again the psalmist declares what the Lord has done and then he gives thanks "for His steadfast love endures forever". I imagine that even with such a beautiful psalm, the psalmist felt that his 'Thank You' to the Lord was inadequate for all the generous blessings he had received. There is no way to repay the Lord, except to simply say 'Thank You'. I feel that I can relate.

So, although I know it is completely inadequate: **THANK YOU!** Thank you to the elders for proposing and following through on the idea of a sabbatical. Thank You to the members of the council who agreed that this would be a good thing. Thank you to the voters who approved such a generous gift. Thank You to everyone who cooked, served and donated at the Advent and Lenten soup suppers. Thank you to those who contributed to my Christmas gift that went towards the sabbatical. Thank You to everyone who donated directly to the sabbatical fund. Thank you to Pastor Lyle, Pastor Bolt and the elders who will cover my duties while I am away; and Thank You to all the members of St. John - as you have continually and faithfully supported and encouraged me in the ministry here at St. John. I am incredibly humbled and grateful. And ultimately, both first and last, "*Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever*" (Ps 136:1).



We have done crazy scavenger hunts throughout the church building, gone to the Cheyenne Mountain Zoo, and movie nights among other adventures.

My host family held a joint birthday dinner for Megan whose birthday was the 30th of May, mine on the 21st of June, and their daughter Abby whose birthday was the 23rd of June. And I've had the opportunity to explore some of Colorado Springs that I haven't experienced before such as Eleven Mile Reservoir, Gold Camp Road, the back way to Rampart Reservoir through Garden of the Gods, and the drive up Phantom Canyon Road to Victor.

I am looking forward to heading back to school at Concordia St. Paul at the end of August. I have one more year of schooling and then I will be placed on my year-long internship. Cañon City Police Chief praises kids who discovered, turned in cash found at Rouse Park

When two 11-year-old boys found a wad of cash at a local park, they could have used it to buy a ton of new Legos or some jazzy new kicks, or even to clean out an entire ice cream truck.

Instead, <u>Collin Leason</u> and Callum Sack turned the money into a parent, and then ultimately to the Cañon City Police Department.

"That could have been gas money, or it could have been money they just got from work," <u>Collin</u> said in response to why they felt it was important to do the right thing and turn it in.

"They could have really needed it, and we just wanted it, but they really needed it," Callum said.



<u>Collin</u> said he was hanging out at Callum's house July 5 when they got bored and decided to go to Rouse Park. They were playing on a tall climbing structure when they discovered a pile of cash totaling \$900. "We first thought it was a setup by a YouTuber or something," Callum said. "That's what I was thinking." The soon-to-be sixth graders examined the park, looking for cameras, but when none were found, they realized it was no setup.



"We took it to my mom, and then we took it to the police department," Callum said.

Cañon City Police Chief John Schick recognized the young men for their integrity and high character with a citizen commendation during Monday's city council meeting. They said they were surprised to have been honored. *Collin* shared a message to other kids or adults who may find themselves in the same situation one day.

"You should always give money back and not keep it for yourself," he said. "They could really need it or have worked really hard for it." Callum chimed in, too.

"Return money at all costs," he said.

Schick said the day after the money was turned in, a couple called the CCPD to ask if anyone had turned in the cash they had lost. The money belonged to a

family who was on vacation and had stopped for a break at the park when the cash was dropped. "This would not have been possible without the act of character and kindness that was illustrated by

these young men," Schick said. "In light of their impeccable character and an act of responsible citizenship, the rightful owners and our community at large are greatly appreciative."

Schick presented Callum and <u>**Collin**</u> each with a certificate of good citizenship recognition, a challenge coin and a thank you card.

"This really just makes your day, your week, your year to hear that, that's so wonderful," Mayor Preston Troutman said. "We look forward to openings on city council for you. The applications are in the mail."




July/August 2025

For July & August, our next book selection will follow on the heels of our recent readings from C.S. Lewis. Our new book is <u>A Severe Mercy</u> (ISBN 978-0060688240) by Sheldon Vanauken. The description reads:

The profoundly moving and heart-rendering classic for anyone who has experienced the depths of love and loss. Reflecting on faith, vitality, and grief, this "spiritual autobiography of a love rather than of the lovers" opens our hearts and eyes to the true meaning of life, and death. In *A Severe Mercy*, Sheldon Vanauken stunningly chronicles his marriage to his beloved wife, Davy, his faithforming friendship with C.S. Lewis and the tragedy that altered his soul and spirit completely.

With heavy passion, "Van" unravels a love story formed by intense romance and commitment, and a bond he refers to as "the Shining Barrier." A bond that is unaltered by the outside world and its influences until he meets C.S Lewis while studying at Oxford. Lewis introduces Davy and Van to Christianity, and their devotion to God quickly becomes as strong as their devotion to one another.

In rapid succession, Davy succumbs to a fatal illness and a grief-stricken Van is left to process this unspeakable loss, and subsequently discover the meaning of "a mercy as severe as death, a severity as merciful as love."



This impactful masterpiece allows readers of all beliefs to envision life after loss, and the spiritual strength that ultimately leads us forward after unspeakable tragedy. Weaving in 18 original letters from C.S. Lewis himself, *A Severe Mercy* poetically addresses some of the universal questions that surround faith, and its remarkable role during times of both radiant joy and immense suffering.



Greeter - Meet and offer Sunday bulletin and visitor packet to worshippers. LWML - Women's Auxiliary of the LCMS supports LCMS missions. Men's Breakfast - Men of St. John have breakfast about twice a month. **Missions** - Direct monetary resources for LCMS missionaries and missions. Morning Prayer - Almost every weekday at 7:30am in the sanctuary. Nursery - Volunteers assist parents who need help in the nursery. Prayer Chain - Receive notice of prayer requests and pray for those in need. Quilters - Construct guilts almost weekly for charities and individuals. **Readers** - Read assigned Scripture passages at the lectern during services. 

On May 14-16, 2025, 24 deaconesses (or those in training) from all over Cambodia gathered in Phnom Penh for the Cambodia Lutheran Church's (CLC) first deaconess conference. These women, supported by the Lutheran Church —Canada and trained through the Luther Institute of Southeast Asia, rarely have the opportunity to intentionally gather as a deaconess community. The LCMS was excited to facilitate this precious opportunity for fellowship, worship, sharing, and learning, fulfilling the longstanding desire of the leader of the Cambodia deaconesses, Dcs. Neak Mao (a).

> The conference began with opening worship, led by Pastor Bun Phanna (head of Garuna Foundation in Cambodia, who also helped translate), with Pastor Bun Sopheap (head of the CLC) preaching a sermon on Ruth and Naomi (b). Dcs. Jillene Houser, President of the <u>Concordia</u> <u>Deaconess Conference</u> (c), facilitated discussion around the high calling of deaconesses to serve, highlighting the robust theology of mercy found in Scripture. Those who have received mercy in

> > Christ demonstrate it to others. Lessons were planned to encourage participation and application so it would be practical and beneficial.

In addition, Aimee facilitated a <u>Community Health Evangelism (CHE)</u> lesson on identifying and addressing community needs. This information will help to inform further collaboration and identify opportunities for mercy

> work. Nurse-educator (and daughter of Dcs. Neak Mao), Davy also gave presentations on common women's health issues.
