

Slowing Down

While on sabbatical, Rev. Kern at Immanuel Colorado Springs encouraged me to read a book by John Mark Comer called "The Ruthless Elimination of Hurry". As you can guess, the book was a great fit for my sabbatical. Ironically, it was a very quick read. I am not a fast reader, but even I was able to finish it in just two or three days. And yet although quick, the book was good enough that I've encouraged Tricia to read it; and I hope to get it on the BOOKClub's list next year.

The impetus for the book was that Rev. Comer was caught up in a fast-paced, high pressure mega-church situation; and yet he didn't like the direction his life, and especially his spiritual life, was headed. Talking over his concerns with a trusted mentor, his friend advised him, "Ruthlessly eliminate hurry from your life. Hurry is the great enemy of the spiritual life." The book goes on to explain why that's the case, especially in our current culture; and then gives some practical advice on what we can do about it.

As we begin the season of Advent, this time of year can be especially busy for many of us. There are extra parties, extra services, extra cooking, extra baking, extra shopping, extra letters, extra decorating... extra, extra, extra. Which is why I would encourage you to make an intentional, conscious effort to ruthlessly eliminate the



hurry from your life. The whole point of Advent is to prepare our hearts and spirits for the birth of our Savior; and when we repent and discover on Christmas morning that God has sent His only Son to be born as one of us, Immanuel, well that joy is unlike any other. You are not forgotten or forsaken. God has sent you hope in the form of this little baby boy; and yet all the extras and all the pressure can overshadow this incredibly joy. "Hurry is the great enemy of the spiritual life."

So, please, take some time this Advent season to prepare for the birth of our Savior. Read the Lutheran Hour Devotions. Come to the Wednesday evening soup suppers and advent services. Hear the Lord, "Be still and know that I am God" (Ps 46:10); and be refreshed and prepared for the joy of Christmas.




St. John To-Do List

Activities at St. John Lutheran Church

Acolyte - Altar candle duty for boys and girls at worship services. Adult Bible Class - Sunday mornings at 10:30am after our time of fellowship. Adult Choir - Join your voice with others on special festivals. Altar Guild - Prepare vestments, candles, banners, etc. for worship. Audio-Visual - Operate the slides and video production during worship service. **Book Club** - Discuss books about once a month in member homes or at church. **Bulletin Help** - Print worship bulletins a few times per year as needed. Car Show - Annual fundraiser on the church grounds that needs many helpers. Christmas Program - Help or take a part in the Sunday School program. **Church Council -** Serve on a church board, or as church president, etc. Communications - Publish events on the Website, newsletter, and Facebook. Confirmation Class - Teens meet with Pastor for Christian instruction. **Door Keeper -** Open the door and welcome people arriving at church. **Driver -** Provide transportation for those who cannot drive to church. **Elders** - Men who assist the Pastor with the spiritual life of the congregation. **Evangelism -** Carry out evangelism programs in the church and community. Fellowship - Serve refreshments after worship, and assist with special events. Garage Sale - Annual fundraiser at St. John that needs many helpers. Gardener - Keep the flower beds in neat and weed-free condition. **Greeter -** Welcome and offer Sunday bulletin and visitor packet to worshippers. **LWML -** Women's Auxiliary of the LCMS supports LCMS missions. Men's Breakfast - Men of St. John have breakfast about twice a month. **Missions -** Direct monetary resources for LCMS missionaries and missions. Morning Prayer - Almost every weekday at 7:30am in the sanctuary. Nursery - Volunteers assist parents who need help in the nursery. Prayer Chain - Receive notice of prayer requests and pray for those in need. Quilters - Construct quilts almost weekly for charities and individuals. **Readers -** Read assigned Scripture passages at the lectern during services. **Shut-In Visitation -** Spend time with members who cannot attend church. Sunday School - Classes for kids at 10:30am after worship and refreshments. Teach - Help children learn about their Savior, Preschool through High School. Trail Mix - Hike on local and other Colorado trails with members and friends. Trustees - Oversee maintenance, repair, cleaning of buildings and grounds. Ushers - Assist people with special needs, direct worshipers for Holy Communion. Vacation Bible School - A children's short-term summer educational activity. Wednesday Bible Class - Study at 10:00am Wednesdays with Pastor Dan. Youth Group - High schoolers discuss their faith as it applies to life's challenges.






Fall 2025

Our next book by Rev. Dr. Alvin Schmidt (a former Ft. Wayne professor) is entitled How Christianity Changed the World (ISBN 978-0310264491). The description reads:

Western civilization is becoming increasingly pluralistic, secularized, and biblically illiterate. Many people today have little sense of how their lives have benefited from Christianity's influence, often viewing the church with hostility or resentment. How Christianity Changed the World is a topically arranged Christian history for Christians and non-Christians. Grounded in solid research and written in a popular style, this book is both a helpful apologetic tool in talking with unbelievers and a source of evidence for why Christianity deserves credit for many of the humane, social, scientific, and cultural advances in the Western world in the last two thousand years. Photographs, timelines, and charts enhance each chapter. This edition features questions for reflection and discussion for each chapter.

Topics include: Sanctification of Human Life, Women Receive Freedom and Dignity, Hospitals and Health Care, labor and Economic Freedom Dignified, Science: Its Christian Connections, Liberty and Justice for All, Slavery Abolished, and more.



Two copies have been ordered for the church. Used copies are available on Amazon for about \$13.50. There is an Audible version available for \$7 and a Kindle version for \$13.50.

This is a longer book than we typically tackle – almost 450 pages. Due to the length and Pastor Dan's sabbatical, we will meet in 5 months on January 13th to discuss the book.

Greetings in Jesus' name, friends at St. John in Cañon City, from Phnom Penh!

It is a joy to write this email in celebration of God's global mission and in gratitude for your partnership in it. Because of the prayers and generosity of so many, including you, our family is in our 19th year in Southeast Asia. Who ever thought that would happen!!?? God did, and He is using YOU to keep us going! THANK YOU for praying for our family and for sending your financial gifts. They are an incredible encouragement to us. Here's some snippets on what's been happening the last several months.

J.P. continues to focus much of his time on teaching and discipleship. The <u>youth group</u> of Christ Lutheran Church (Phnom Penh) is always a highlight of the week, and this past week we had our <u>largest group in some time!</u> Speaking of Christ Lutheran Church, J.P. also completed <u>three seminars</u> on the "solas" of the Reformation—grace alone, <u>faith alone</u>, and <u>Scripture alone</u>—for that community. J.P. also recently received an invitation to <u>teach for a Christian company</u> in Phnom Penh, one of whose staff is a dear friend and fellow church member.

Often, teaching takes J.P. out of Phnom Penh and into rural communities. J.P. is nearing completion of a <u>series of seminars</u>, in multiple locations, on Luther's Small Catechism. Most recently, he completed teaching the Catechism in <u>Kampong Seila</u>, and has now started in <u>Tbong Khmum</u> (your very own Pastor Dan <u>helped</u> to begin this training!). Tbong Khmum will be the final location in an effort that has taken 2 years! Other times, teaching takes J.P. to other countries. J.P. was excited to teach one course and co-teach another at <u>Lutheran Theological Seminary</u> in Baggio City, Philippines. He also recently did some teaching in Bangkok, Thailand.

Meanwhile, Aimee continues in her <u>new role</u> as Coordinator of Care and Development for Asia missionaries. The whole job is geared towards providing holistic care for missionaries and their families so that they can do what God has called them to do as well as possible for as long as possible. She loves it. She's been full on the past weeks solidifying plans for our regional workgroup meetings in Taiwan in early November, as well as a family retreat in Germany in June. But she still manages to stay active in Cambodia, too, most recently by coordinating a <u>retreat for</u> deaconesses.

Though it was <u>hard to say goodbye</u>, Celeste has adjusted well to life in Richmond, VA, living with J.P.'s mom while studying at Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU). We are thankful for strong community she has in Richmond—with family, with <u>Redeemer Lutheran Church</u>, and with VCU—that has made her transition so smooth.

You are a part of all this. THANK YOU for being our team that prays for, encourages, and sends us to do this critical work in such a remarkable part of the world. It is our joy and privilege, but we can't do it without you. Please reach out anytime and/or stay connected using the info below. We LOVE hearing from you.

During October, Christ Lutheran Church's youth group had the largest group we've had in some time, with 17 people joining for the usual Saturday night activities. What a blessing to have so many sacrifice time from their busy lives for fellowship and study of Scripture! While we rejoice when everyone can turn up at the same time, the week to week reality is different. Some weeks we are a smaller group, for a variety of reasons. People get called away to work. They have family obligations. They cram during exam season. Or, they just don't come. While that can be disappointing in the moment, we always try to take a long-term view. We do this in a couple ways. First, if at all possible, we will meet even with a small group. This builds consistency and routine. Second, when someone returns after an absence, we welcome them back enthusiastically. We want Saturday nights to be a blessing rather than a burden. We don't want people to avoid joining out of fear of judgment, but rather we want them to join out of freedom and acceptance. That doesn't mean that confrontations don't happen—difficult discussions are essential to discipleship—but Saturday nights are not for that. We want these young people to know that no matter how they feel, or how busy they are, or how long they've been away, or how disconnected from Christian community they've been, or what sin or problem they are struggling with, they

have a place at this table. They have a community that cares about them. And most of all, they have a God who loves them fiercely and still speaks to them through His Word. Indeed, that night we studied the Parable of the Persistent Widow (Luke 18:1-8), in which Jesus encourages us to pray and not lose heart as we live in a sinful world, knowing that God loves us and has brought justice in Jesus, even as we wait for the final justice he will bring at the end.
