In The Boat

What is your favorite Bible story? I have an old college friend who loves the story of Noah so much that his whole house is decorated with arks and animals. It really is impressive to see. But there are so many to choose from: Creation, Job, Burning Bush, Exodus, Esther, Ruth, David & Goliath, Samson, Jonah, Christmas, Easter. There are just SO many!!

My favorite story has always been Jesus washing the disciples' feet on Maundy Thursday. The thought of the very creator of the universe stooping down to wash the dirty, smelly feet of the disciples – a chore only slaves could be commanded to do – has always inspired me. First, to think that this is the depth of the love of God for us (which only goes further the next day on the cross); and, then, second, as an inspiration to serve others.

When [Jesus] had washed their feet and put on his outer garments and resumed his place, he said to them, “Do you understand what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another’s feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you.” John 13:12–15



However, another story has recently come to the forefront. A few weeks ago, I was talking with a fellow pastor about everything I am facing medically. He had gone through something similar and was giving me tips on how to prepare and persevere; and throughout our conversation he continued to say, “Jesus is in the boat with you.” This is a reference to the story where Jesus and the Disciples are sailing across the Sea of Galilee. Jesus falls asleep just as a great storm arises; and as the disciples are in fear of their lives, Jesus awakes and rebukes the wind and waves.

Now I have always understood this story as Jesus proving His mastery over nature. I think that because at the end of the story the disciples are dumbfounded, fearful and awe struck saying, **“What sort of man is this, that even winds and sea obey Him?”**

But another way to approach this story is that I am in that boat with Jesus...or perhaps Jesus is now in my boat; and I know exactly what sort of man He is. He is none other than God Himself.

That highlights two very comforting thoughts for me. The first, like the feet washing story, is that God has descended into human flesh to walk with me. This is the Christmas story, the incarnation, Immanuel, God with Us; and not just as a general concept for all humanity, but for me in all my struggles. God is with ME – Pastor Dan.

The second is that if He is in the boat with me, then my fate is His fate. If the boat floats, then we sail on together to whatever the future holds. If the boat sinks, then He and I sink together. Either way, we are together. Christ is with me, and I am with Him; and that gives me the confidence that I will be delivered, one way or another. There is no fear, just a quiet calm, comfort and confidence that Jesus is in the boat with me.

Thank you again for all the prayers, offers of help and meals. Your support for me and my whole family helps strengthen us during this difficult time. THANK YOU!

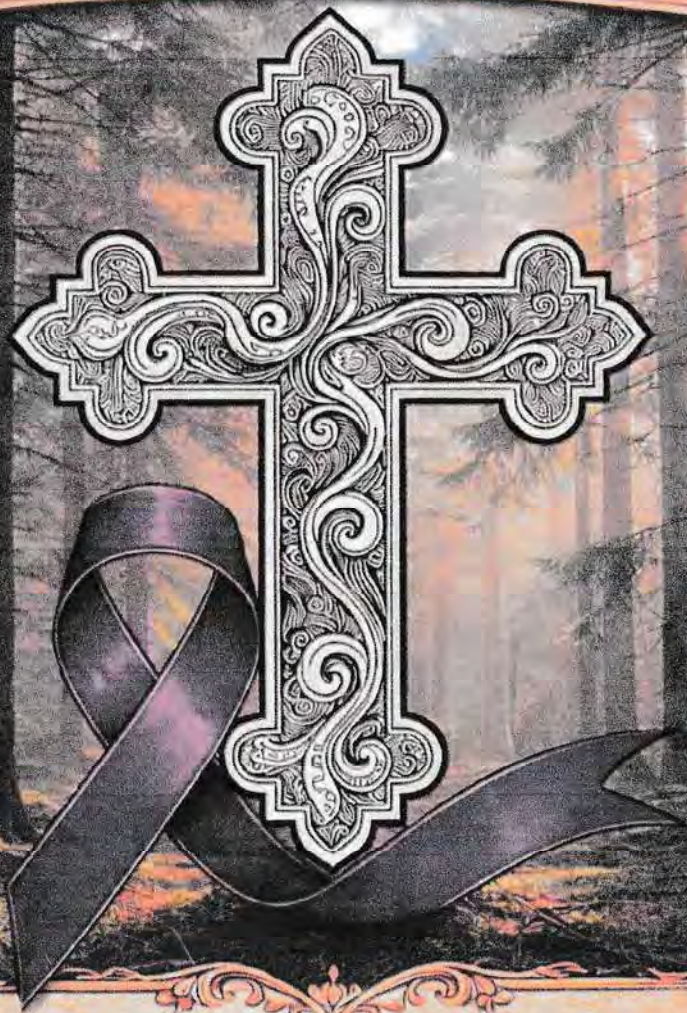

Christ had no epitaph. Buried in a borrowed tomb, no words were emblazoned across his grave. Instead, during the final hours of his life, Christ mapped out his way of suffering with seven famous last words—seven final phrases, remembered and recited throughout the ages—tiny touchstones along his way of sorrows. We may find that these last words have a lasting impact, even now, for us.

February 18th—Ash Wednesday FORGIVE

In this service for Ash Wednesday, we listen to Jesus say from the cross, “Father, forgive them, for they know not what they are do,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

February 25th—Lent 1 PARADISE

In this service for Week 2 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross to the repentant thief, “Today you will be with me in paradise,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

March 4th—Lent 2 BEHOLD

In this service for Week 3 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross to his mother standing by John, “Behold, your son,” and to John, “Behold, your mother,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

March 11th—Lent 3 FORESAKEN

In this service for Week 4 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross, “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

March 18th—Lent 4 THIRST

In this service for Week 5 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross, “I thirst,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

March 25th—Lent 5 FINISHED

In this service for Week 6 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross, “It is finished,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

April 2nd—Maundy Thursday FOR YOU

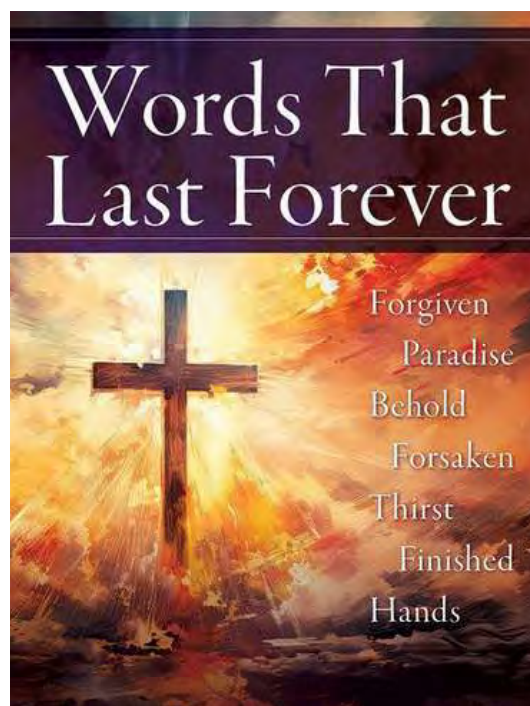
In this service for Maundy Thursday, we listen to Jesus say in the Upper Room, “Given and shed for you,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

April 3rd—Good Friday HANDS

April 5th—Easter ALLELUIA

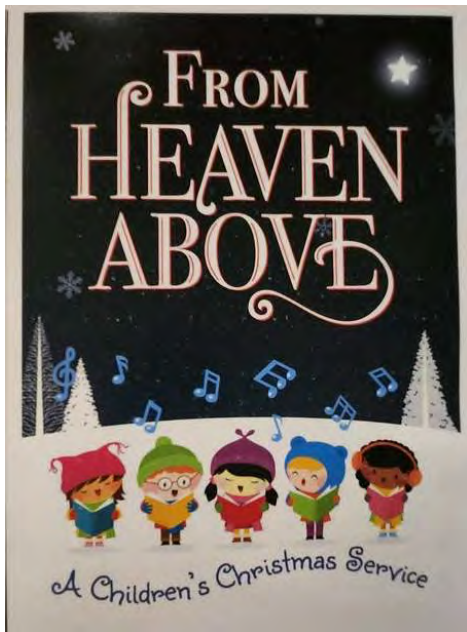
In this service for Easter Sunday, we sing, “Alleluia!” to Jesus who rose from the dead, and we ponder his words of life.

Activities at St. John Lutheran Church

Acolyte - Altar candle duty for boys and girls at worship services.
Adult Bible Class - Sunday mornings at 10:30am after our time of fellowship.
Adult Choir - Join your voice with others on special festivals.
Altar Guild - Prepare vestments, candles, banners, etc. for worship.
Audio-Visual - Operate the slides and video production during worship service.
Book Club - Discuss books about once a month in member homes or at church.
Bulletin Help - Print worship bulletins a few times per year as needed.
Car Show - Annual fundraiser on the church grounds that needs many helpers.
Christmas Program - Help or take a part in the Sunday School program.
Church Council - Serve on a church board, or as church president, etc.
Communications - Publish events on the Website, newsletter, and Facebook.
Confirmation Class - Teens meet with Pastor for Christian instruction.
Door Keeper - Open the door and welcome people arriving at church.
Driver - Provide transportation for those who cannot drive to church.
Elders - Men who assist the Pastor with the spiritual life of the congregation.
Evangelism - Carry out evangelism programs in the church and community.
Fellowship - Serve refreshments after worship, and assist with special events.
Garage Sale - Annual fundraiser at St. John that needs many helpers.
Gardener - Keep the flower beds in neat and weed-free condition.
Greeter - Welcome and offer Sunday bulletin and visitor packet to worshippers.
LWML - Women's Auxiliary of the LCMS supports LCMS missions.
Men's Breakfast - Men of St. John have breakfast about twice a month.
Missions - Direct monetary resources for LCMS missionaries and missions.
Morning Prayer - Almost every weekday at 7:30am in the sanctuary.
Nursery - Volunteers assist parents who need help in the nursery.
Prayer Chain - Receive notice of prayer requests and pray for those in need.
Quilters - Construct quilts almost weekly for charities and individuals.
Readers - Read assigned Scripture passages at the lectern during services.
Shut-In Visitation - Spend time with members who cannot attend church.

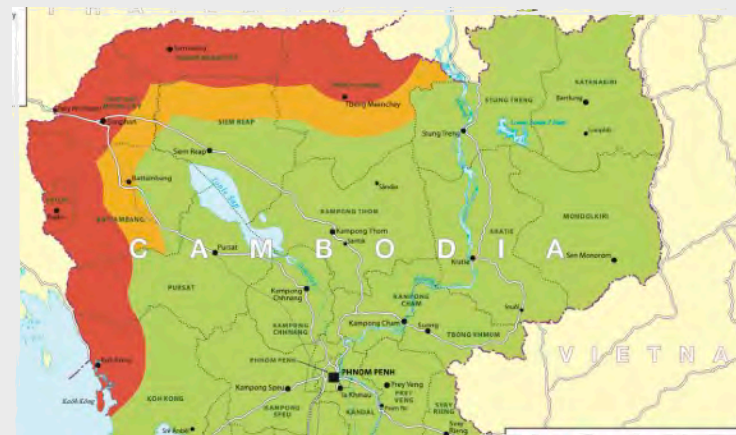
