So I just received a phone call from one of my medical providers. We received a denial of coverage from our health insurance because the doctor's office didn't get prior authorization before running the test or submitting the bill. So, we called the doctor's office...who said they don't submit for prior authorizations. That is done for them by the company that actually runs the tests. So, we'll need to call this other company, that I've never dealt with directly, and have them submit for authorization. Ughh. Here we go!

I've got to admit that so far we've been very blessed with good health insurance and have had very few problems. This is the first "hiccup" we've encountered so far. If you believe the news reports, dealing with health insurance is a nightmare; and I'm nervously waiting for the denial notices and bills to start piling up.

What a contrast to the promises we have in Scripture! Not once, but over and over again the Scriptures declare that there is no denial of service.

EVERYONE! WHOEVER! YOU! It doesn't matter who you are, where you are from, where you are, what you've done, what your genealogy is, ANYTHING! There is no denial of service, no

exclusions, and no exceptions. The Father's promise of salvation is for you! Period! And the difference is that the Lord's promise is based solely upon His love for you, not the profit He might gain from you. So, in this season of Lent, I would encourage you to look to the cross, see the sacrifice that secures the Lord's promise for you, and believe! It is just that simple!

Later today I'll make a call to the provider and ask that they request authorization from our insurance company. The denial notice says we have 180 days to secure the authorization...so

there is hope that we won't be stuck with this bill. But whether it comes through or not, the coverage that really matters is already secured through Christ's sacrifice. That is with me always with no doubts or exceptions whatsoever.

Christ had no epitaph. Buried in a borrowed tomb, no words were emblazoned across his grave. Instead, during the final hours of his life, Christ mapped out his way of suffering with seven famous last words—seven final phrases, remembered and recited throughout the ages—tiny touchstones along his way of sorrows. We may find that these last words have a lasting impact, even now, for us.

February 18th – Ash Wednesday **FORGIVE**

In this service for Ash Wednesday, we listen to Jesus say from the cross, “Father, forgive them, for they know not what they are do,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

February 25th – Lent 1 **PARADISE**

In this service for Week 2 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross to the repentant thief, “Today you will be with me in paradise,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

March 4th – Lent 2 **BEHOLD**

In this service for Week 3 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross to his mother standing by John, “Behold, your son,” and to John, “Behold, your mother,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

March 11th – Lent 3 **FORESAKEN**

In this service for Week 4 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross, “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

March 18th – Lent 4 **THIRST**

In this service for Week 5 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross, “I thirst,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

March 25th – Lent 5 **FINISHED**

In this service for Week 6 of Lent, we listen to Jesus say from the cross, “It is finished,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

April 2nd – Maundy Thursday **FOR YOU**


In this service for Maundy Thursday, we listen to Jesus say in the Upper Room, “Given and shed for you,” and we ponder the meaning of these words.

April 3rd – Good Friday **HANDS**

Ways to be involved at St. John Lutheran Church


- Acolyte** - Altar candle duty for boys and girls at worship services.
- Adult Bible Class** - Sunday mornings at 10:30am after our time of fellowship.
- Adult Choir** - Join your voice with others on special festivals.
- Altar Guild** - Prepare vestments, candles, banners, etc. for worship.
- Audio-Visual** - Operate the slides and video production during worship service.
- Book Club** - Discuss books about once a month in member homes or at church.
- Bulletin Help** - Print worship bulletins a few times per year as needed.
- Car Show** - Annual fundraiser on the church grounds that needs many helpers.
- Christmas Program** - Help or take a part in the Sunday School program.
- Church Council** - Serve on a church board, or as church president, etc.
- Communications** - Publish events on the Website, newsletter, and Facebook.
- Confirmation Class** - Teens meet with Pastor for Christian instruction.
- Door Keeper** - Open the door and welcome people arriving at church.
- Driver** - Provide transportation for those who cannot drive to church.
- Elders** - Men who assist the Pastor with the spiritual life of the congregation.
- Evangelism** - Carry out evangelism programs in the church and community.
- Fellowship** - Serve refreshments after worship, and assist with special events.
- Garage Sale** - Annual fundraiser at St. John that needs many helpers.
- Gardener** - Keep the flower beds in neat and weed-free condition.
- Greeter** - Welcome and offer Sunday bulletin and visitor packet to worshippers.
- LWML** - Women's Auxiliary of the LCMS supports LCMS missions.
- Men's Breakfast** - Men of St. John have breakfast about twice a month.
- Missions** - Direct monetary resources for LCMS missionaries and missions.
- Nursery** - Volunteers assist parents who need help in the nursery.
- Prayer Chain** - Receive notice of prayer requests and pray for those in need.
- Quilters** - Construct quilts almost weekly for charities and individuals.
- Readers** - Read assigned Scripture passages at the lectern during services.
- Shut-In Visitation** - Spend time with members who cannot attend church.
- Sunday School** - Classes for kids at 10:30am after worship and refreshments.
- Teach** - Help children learn about their Savior, Preschool through High School.

Goals Defined

Aimee traveled to a cold Seoul, South the Asia Leadership Team (ALT);

pic right). Building on the **good work done** during November's regional workgroup meeting in Taiwan to gather information for planning purposes, the ALT met in Seoul to discuss and formulate strategic priorities in the short-, mid-, and long-term. The resulting plan will govern activities, budgeting and resource allocation, and recruitment for all of Asia. While mission work encompasses a broad range of spiritual, physical, and emotional needs, the limits of time and resources (both human and financial) require mission organizations to define how they will focus their efforts. This provides an opportunity for organizations to consider a variety of important questions. What do we value? What are we good at, organizationally and individually? What needs should we prioritize? How can we work in partnership? That is, there is a dynamic interaction between the identity and capacity of the mission organization and the needs and goals of the mission field. Aimee LOVES these kinds of conversations because they foster the discovery of a "sweet spot" in which there is synergy between mission organization, missionary, and mission field. This leads to thriving missionaries and, most importantly, well-served communities of faith. Of course, this "sweet spot" is never finally achieved because we live in a sinful and constantly shifting world. Nonetheless, the call to be faithful and effective stewards of God's mission still stands, and so we are thankful for Aimee to have space to join such important meetings.



A few years back, J.P. worked with the Cambodia Lutheran Church (CLC) to **define its strategic priorities** for the next few years. One of these priorities was to **teach Martin Luther's Small Catechism** in five key locations, with a view towards 1) distributing and encouraging utilization of Luther's Small Catechism, 2) teaching the faith to church leaders and members, and 3) modeling effective Catechism teaching to pastors/teachers. J.P. has been intimately involved this initiative in **Kampot, Ratanakiri, Prey Veng, Sihanoukville, and Tbong Khmum** provinces. With the handing out of certificates at the **final session** in Tbong Khmum, this priority has now been completed! It has been a long process of thousands of kilometers traveled, hundreds of hours taught, countless Scriptures read, and, best of all, the overflowing encouragement of God's people engaging with His Word. This project would not have been possible without the leadership of the CLC to see this through, and also the partnership of **Lutheran Heritage Foundation**, who graciously provided copies of the Small Catechism for each participant, and whose local Director, Mr. Khorn Sophon, traveled and co-taught with J.P. on every trip. Most of all, J.P. is grateful to the many students who joined the sessions. Their enthusiasm in learning was shown in the sacrifice of their time, their excellent questions, and, most memorably, their smiles. It is J.P.'s prayer that these students will always remember that the Small Catechism was written not for pastors in the sanctity of a church or professor in the halls of seminaries, but for the **head of the family** in the hustle and bustle of the home.
