Our season opens with five treasured musicians playing two of the most beloved works written for the clarinet: Brahms Clarinet Sonata in Eb and Mozart Clarinet Quintet. Legendary clarinetist, **David Shifrin**, will be joined by the celebrated **Miró Quartet** for this timeless opening concert. **Will Liverman**, a shining star in the opera world who sang the title roles in both Metropolitan Opera's productions of *Fire Shut Up My Bone* and *Malcolm X*, will share with us a soulful evening of songs.

The highly-anticipated return of the **Danish Quartet** will feature Schubert's grand string quartet in G major. Violin virtuoso **Benjamin Beilman** will present a program inspired by his "Ysaÿe" Guarneri del Gesù from 1740, and the pieces that were performed on this storied instrument. Two of my favorite musicians, cellist **Paul Watkins** and pianist **Alessio Bax** will join me in a program of solo, duo, and trio treasures for the cello and piano! Our season will end with a bang - literally and figuratively with three of the most striking percussionists, **Ji Hye Jung, Ayano Kataoka, and Ian Rosenbaum**. One of my all-time

#### TIMELESS CLARINET

Season sixteen opens with the highly anticipated return of legendary clarinetist **David Shifrin**, joined by the renowned **Miró Quartet** and our **Artistic Director Gloria Chien**. The program features two of the most beloved masterpieces for the clarinet. Brahms' Clarinet Sonata No.2 in E-flat opens with a glowing warmth, sweet tenderness, and rich harmonies ensue. Inspired by clarinetist Richard Mühlfeld, Brahms came out of retirement to compose four major works for the clarinet. The evening ends with Mozart's sublime Clarinet Quintet in A major. The first of its kind, the quintet is a groundbreaking work in its exquisite blend of the clarinet and the strings. Come hear the dialogue between Brahms and Mozart, the clarinet, strings, and piano as showcased by our celebrated artists!

## AN EVENING OF SONGS WITH WILL LIVERMAN

Called "a voice for this historic moment" (*Washington Post*), GRAM-MY Award-winning baritone **Will Liverman** is described as "nothing short of extraordinary" (*Opera News*) with a "beaming, high baritone that easily asserts" (*LA Times*).

Liverman is joined by pianist Gloria Chien in an unforgettable program that explores the lineage of art song from the classical period to today. Lyricism and introspection pervades the music of Finzi and Schubert, while the masterworks of Margaret Bonds and Harry T. Burleigh blend traditional spirituals with classical forms. Contemporary composer Libby Larsen continues this fusion, influenced by American popular music, jazz, and folk.

Known for her musical ingenuity, Caroline Shaw's "Entr'acte" showcases a distinctive style complete with intricate textures and inventive use of strings. In her own words, the piece is "structured like a minuet and trio, riffing on that classical form but taking it a little further." Musical innovation also prevails in Schubert's towering String Quartet no.15 in G Major. Written two years before his death, the work's emotional extremes and sublime beauty foreshadow the signature characteristics of the Romantic Era. ### THE VIRTUOSIC VIOLIN WITH BENJAMIN BEILMAN

Hailed as one of the leading violinists of his generation, **Benjamin Beilman** has won international praise for his passionate performances and a deep, rich tone which the *Washington Post* called "mightily impressive." With pianist Gloria Chien, Beilman presents a program inspired by his storied instrument, an "Ysaÿe" Guarneri del Gesù from 1740. Ysaÿe's Sonata No.3 was performed on this violin by the composer himself, and showcases technical prowess and deep musical expression. Composed as a wedding present for Ysaÿe, Franck's Violin Sonata displays an audacious, show-stopping virtuosity between the violin and piano. Rearranged as a wedding present for Beilman, contemporary composer Chris Rogerson's *Arietta* provided the sweet, intimate sound as Beilman's bride walked down the aisle. Come join us for an evening of tales as illustrated by Beilman's legendary instrument!

Our season goes out with a bang, literally, with the power-house trio of percussionists Ji Hye Jung, Ayano Kataoka, and lan Rosenbaum. You will be immersed in the musical spirit of Spain through Alejandro Viña's Book of Grooves, a dynamic work for two marimbas. Takemitsu's Rain Tree is an atmospheric meditation on natural phenomena depicted in the novels of Japanese novelist Kenzaburō Ōe. Weinberg's Table Talk uses inventive "prepared vibraphone," complete with stacks of paper and soda cans. The fusion of avant-garde techniques with non-Western musical traditions inspired Reich's Nagova Marimbas and Xenakis's astonishing Okho, scored for three djembes and a large-sized African membranophone. Finally, Mey's Table Music is a theatrical highlight that proved to be one of the most memorable performances in all of String Theory's fifteen-year history. We cannot wait for you to experience it!
